WHEREAS, having heard that the Nazi SS Guards were looking for an accordion player to join the camp's orchestra, Esther volunteered despite not knowing how to play the instrument, playing the accordion at the concentration camps whenever prisoners were marched off to work or when new trains with Jews from across Europe

WHEREAS, because her grandmother had been a Christian, Esther was later transferred to the Ravensbrück concentration camp for women and survived a death march at the end of the war; and

WHEREAS, in the last days of the war, Esther escaped with six (6) other women to a forest in Lübz, where she was liberated by the Red Army and the U.S. Army on May 3, 1945; and

WHEREAS, Esther recalled her rescue by the U.S. troops who gave her an accordion, which she played the day American soldiers and concentration camp survivors danced and celebrated the Allied victory over the Nazis; and
