WHEREAS, Master Sergeant (MSG) Rosemarie Elliot is a daughter of *Guåhan* who resides in the village of *Toto* with her loving husband of thirty-seven (37) years, retired Command Sergeant Major Daniel Elliot; and together, they have happily raised six (6) children, and are also blessed with twelve (12) grandchildren; and

WHEREAS, after graduating from high school in 1976, MSG Rosemarie Elliot was accepted to the Guam Police Academy, and after three (3) months of rigorous training with the Police Recruit Training Cycle, she graduated in the Nineteenth (19<sup>th</sup>) Police Cycle where she received Salutatorian recognition; and she went on to become a Police Officer with the Guam Police Department; and

WHEREAS, in 1980, MSG Rosemarie Elliot continued serving as a Guam Police Officer and eventually enlisted in the Guam Army Reserve where she excelled and captured the "Most Distinguished Honor Graduate" award after completing the required basic training; and

WHEREAS, serving in both capacities, in her civilian job as a Guam Police Officer and with the Guam Army Reserves – 368<sup>th</sup> Military Police Company, MSG Rosemarie Elliot never expected her career to become one of the most notable milestones of her life; and

WHEREAS, on December 24, 1980, pursuant to U.S. Public Law 96-600, President James "Jimmy" Carter established the Guam National Guard on July 1, 1981, with only thirty-two (32) official charter members; and at that time, the Guam National Guard was a fledgling military unit with fewer than one hundred (100) members housed in a few buildings on what would later be known as *Fort Juan Muna*; and

WHEREAS, Master Sergeant Rosemarie Elliot transferred to the Guam Army National Guard the following year on January 5, 1982, and served as a Recruiter, making her one of the historical enlistees known as the Guam National Guard Charter Members; and

WHEREAS, from 1982 to 1986, under the leadership of Master Sergeant John Lough, MSG Rosemarie Elliot was assigned to serve in the Recruit and Retention Battalion as a female Recruiter overseeing her team of six (6) individuals, and where she earned the "Chief's Recruiting Award" in 1984; and

WHEREAS, after serving for twelve (12) years with the Guam Army National Guard, MSG Rosemarie Elliot took a break in service; and following the aftermath of Hurricane Katrina in New Orleans, Louisiana, she returned in 2005 to serve as the J3 Operations Noncommissioned Officer; and after the completion of the mission, Master Sergeant Rosemarie Elliot accepted the role of Production Recruiter with the Guam Army National Guard – Recruit and Retention Battalion; and

WHEREAS, from August 2005 to June 2021, Master Sergeant Rosemarie Elliot held many prestigious career titles within the Guam Army National Guard – Recruit and Retention Battalion, to include: Military Entrance Processing Station Guidance Counselor, Waivers Noncommissioned Officer, Recruit Sustainment Program First Sergeant, Operations Noncommissioned Officer; and Acting Recruit and Retention Battalion Command Sergeant Major; and




