BE IT RESOLVED BY I MINA'TRENTAI SAIS NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, it is the sense of I Liheslaturan Guåhan to honor the life and service of those distinguished citizens of this great island, and is the custom of I Liheslaturan Guåhan to pay tribute to those individuals whose public service and civic contributions serve to improve the quality of life for Guam residents; and

WHEREAS, attendant to such concern, and in full accord with its long-standing traditions, it is further the intent of I Liheslaturan Guåhan to posthumously honor the late Honorable Doris Teresita Flores Lujan, former Mayor of Inaláhan; and

WHEREAS, the late Doris Teresita Flores Lujan was born October 1, 1946, and resided in the village of Inaláhan. She is the daughter of the late Ftan Maria Flores Lujan, also known as "Maripitan Ialaga," and she had a brother, the late Joseph Frederick Lujan, fondly known as "Tindig"; and

WHEREAS, the late Doris Teresita Flores Lujan attended Inaláhan Elementary School and Inaláhan Junior High School, and she graduated from George Washington High School in 1965; and

WHEREAS, after graduating from high school, the late Doris Teresita Flores Lujan began her public service career at Andersen Air Force Base, Guam where she served as the Base Wing and Communications Squadron Commander's Secretary for twenty (20) years, from 1965 through 1985; and she then served as the Base Records Manager, Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) Manager and Privacy Act (PA) Officer for twenty-two (22) years, from 1985 through 2007. She also served as the Deputy Officer of the Base Information Management which oversaw the overall operation of the Base Publications Distribution Office, the Base Reproduction Branch, the Base Records Management Branch, and the Military Postal Service Center; and

WHEREAS, during her outstanding civil service career, the late Doris Teresita Flores Lujan was the recipient of numerous awards, such as: the Headquarters Air Force "Outstanding Career Service" Award from the Headquarters Pacific Air Forces (PACAF); the "Communications and Information Management Professionalism" Award, which she received three (3) times throughout her career (in 1989, 1995, and 1999); the Team Andersen "Federal Woman of the Year" Award (Civilian Category IV) in 2002; and she was recognized as an "Outstanding Performer" of the Headquarters PACAF Inspector General Inspection in 2007; and after forty-two (42) years of dedicated service, which also included numerous educational and training courses, she retired from Andersen Air Force Base, Guam in 2007; and

WHEREAS, upon retiring from her civil service career, the late Doris Teresita Flores Lujan became a breast cancer survivor; and during her retirement, she supported various nonprofit and volunteer organizations, such as: the Guam-Micronesian Games, the Guam Special Olympics, the American Cancer Society's Relay for Life, the Guam Jungle Bell 4K Run/Walk, and World AIDS Day; and she had also served as an Extraordinary Minister; and

WHEREAS, prior to being an elected official, the late Doris Teresita Flores Lujan was instrumental in the restoration of the Malabj Multi-Purpose Court which allowed the youth within the community to have a recreational court to practice sports and utilize the facility to promote recreational activity; and

WHEREAS, in 2012, the late Honorable Doris Teresita Flores Lujan made history as the first woman elected to be the Mayor of Inaláhan, and the people of Inaláhan elected her twice to serve as their Mayor. During her first term, the late Honorable Doris Teresita Flores Lujan fought to keep the Malabj Transfer Station open for southern residents to use to prevent further illegal dumping and the undue burden of commuting to other transfer stations; and she attained the support of all the southern Mayors in her efforts to keep the Malabj Transfer Station open; and

WHEREAS, the late Honorable Doris Teresita Flores Lujan worked with former Senator Tom Ada to correct the record and placed Tract 3620 under the administrative jurisdiction of the Inaláhan Mayor's Office and the Inaláhan Municipal Planning Council (IMPC). Through achieving this important step, the late Honorable Doris Teresita Flores Lujan and her IMPC fought tirelessly for the construction and development of a multipurpose facility through a Community Block Development Grant from the Guam Housing and Urban Renewal Authority (GHURA); and

WHEREAS, the late Honorable Doris Teresita Flores Lujan championed the efforts to ensure that critical public health and senior services were provided to southern residents to relieve southern families from taking their loved ones to the island's central and northern centers; and she partnered with the Guam Department of Public Health and Social Services, Division of Senior Citizens to establish an Adult Day Care (ADC) South which was provided at the Inaláhan Senior Citizen Center; and

WHEREAS, the late Honorable Doris Teresita Flores Lujan ensured that the people of Inaláhan had access to various educational programs and opportunities; and Inaláhan piloted the Community Access Program, which provided residents with free online training via the KeyTrain component of WorkKeys that assisted in finding employment opportunities. She also partnered with the Guam Community College (GCC) to do a remote GED program at the Inaláhan Community Center, and also partnered with TJC Driving Center to conduct various remote courses to ensure southern residents had the opportunity to obtain their drivers' permit process; and

WHEREAS, the late Honorable Doris Teresita Flores Lujan ensured the Inaláhan Community Center became a place for the village's youth to have access to a computer room to do homework and school projects; and for the community center to include having gym equipment to promote a healthy lifestyle. She collaborated with her IMPC to have the Inaláhan and Malabj basketball courts, as well as the Malabj volleyball court, upgraded with non-skid surfaces to provide added safety, as well as bleachers for spectators and parents to watch sports events; and

WHEREAS, in 2016, the late Honorable Doris Teresita Flores Lujan successfully hosted over two hundred (200) delegates from the Republic of Palau during the 12th Festival of the Pacific Arts; and she had served as the representative of the Mayors Council of Guam on the Workers' Compensation Commission; and

WHEREAS, the late Honorable Doris Teresita Flores Lujan was reelected in 2016, and she served as the Secretary of the Mayors Council of Guam from 2017 through January 2021; and






