WHEREAS, the Honorable Roman Leon Guerrero Quinata, Sr. was born in the village of *Inaláhan* on August 9, 1929; and he is the son of †Cayetano Aguon Quinata and †Anna Leon Guerrero Quinata, and the fourth (4th) child of twelve (12) children; and

WHEREAS, the Honorable Roman Leon Guerrero Quinata, Sr. was married to †Maria "Mae" Cruz Quinata, and they had four (4) children: Roman L.G. Quinata Jr., Josephine "Terri" Q. Doyle, Francis "Frank" A. Quinata, and the Honorable John "JQ" M. Quinata, former Senator; and were also blessed with three (3) generations of grandchildren, great grandchildren and great-great grandchildren; and his grandchildren are: Roman F.P. Quinata, Vanessa M.Q. Quinata, Daniel P. Quinata, Andrew P. Quinata, Michael Doyle, Glenn Doyle, Nathan S.Q. Doyle, Juan-Carlo S. Pangelinan, Matthew Blas, Sophia-Mae S. WHEREAS, the Honorable Roman Leon Guerrero Quinata, Sr. dedicated many years to serving the people of Guam and the United States - as he had served in the United States Army during the Korean War; he served as a Power Plant Electrician with the U.S. Naval Public Works Center of Guam; and from 1969 to 1980, the Honorable Roman Leon Guerrero Quinata, Sr. was elected to serve as the Commissioner (now Mayor) of the village of *Talo'fo'fo'* where he served three (3) consecutive terms; and

WHEREAS, during his time in office serving as the Commissioner of *Talo'fo'fo'*, the Honorable Roman Leon Guerrero Quinata, Sr. was instrumental in implementing Guam's first postal mail delivery system; and he played a vital role in the capture and return of Sgt. Shoichi Yokoi, who was one of Guam's last Japanese stragglers who was discovered in the *Talo'fo'fo'* River Basin in 1972, to the Japanese government. Furthermore, he had organized many youth activities in *Talo'fo'fo'*, including sports events, getting the youth of his village involved in sports by coaching basketball, football, and little-league baseball; and

WHEREAS, with his experience working at the U.S. Naval Public Works Center of Guam, the Honorable Roman Leon Guerrero Quinata, Sr. served at the Public Utilities Agency of Guam (PUAG) as a Utilities Consultant; and

WHEREAS, the Honorable Roman Leon Guerrero Quinata, Sr. retired after thirty-three (33) years of service in the Government of Guam, but he continued to lend his insight in further developing the utilities infrastructure on Guam as a member of the Guam Waterworks Authority Board of Directors; and

WHEREAS, the Honorable Roman Leon Guerrero Quinata, Sr. was also instrumental in the construction and maintenance of the Annual Christmas Train Village at the Saint Fidelis Friary where thousands of island residents were able to experience the spirit of Christmas every year; and it was featured on CNN in the mid-1990s "Home for the Holidays"; and

WHEREAS, the Honorable Roman Leon Guerrero Quinata, Sr. was an important voice for the survivors of World War II on Guam, and he continued to tell the stories of the war throughout his lifetime; and the Honorable Roman Leon Guerrero Quinata, Sr. served as a Grand Marshal during the Seventy-fifth (75th) Annual Liberation Day Parade in 2019; and

WHEREAS, the Honorable Roman Leon Guerrero Quinata, Sr. passed away on September 25, 2021, at the age of ninety-two (92), and his service to the people of Guam and the community of *Talo'fo'fo'* is immeasurable; and he will be forever fondly remembered for his tireless dedication to service, his advocacy for the Guam World War II survivors, and his devotion to his faith; now therefore, be it
