BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I MINA'TRENTAI SAIS NA LIHESLATURAN GUAHAN:

WHEREAS, Mr. Joseph W. Strantz is a Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) Supervisory Senior Resident Agent (SSRA) who has served the people of the island of Guam for the past eight (8) years. He moved to Guam in May of 2013 with his wife, Danielle (Danni), and his three (3) children, Cali, Sheamus, and Zayne, and they had resided in the villages of Santa Rita-Sumai and Yigo; and

WHEREAS, since moving to the island, the Strantz family have called Guam their home and have considered themselves as Guamanians; and they have embraced Guam's culture and people and have been active in many of Guam's cultural activities, as well as Guam's community service programs. The Strantz family have embraced Guam's culture so much that their local friends refer to them as honorary CHamorus; and they were also given the honor of carrying on the family name of "Unsiog," which they carry with pride; and

WHEREAS, Joseph W. Strantz has served as Guam's FBI Supervisory Senior Resident Agent for the past eight (8) years, leading and directing complex criminal investigations involving complex financial crimes, drug trafficking, violent crimes against children, and other major crimes. In 2017, he became the FBI supervisor for the region; and for the last four (4) years, he has overseen and directed all FBI criminal investigations on Guam and Saipan with additional management responsibilities and assistance provided to law enforcement authorities in the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands (CNMI), the Federated States of Micronesia (FSM), the Republic of the Marshall Islands (RMI), and the Republic of Palau (ROP); and

WHEREAS, SSRA Joseph Strantz created the "Marianas Child Exploitation and Human Trafficking Task Force," an FBI funded task force involving local and federal law enforcement officers and prosecutors, to help combat violent crimes against children. His creation and operational success of the Marianas Child Exploitation and Human Trafficking Task Force has resulted in numerous local and federal criminal prosecutions of child pornography and sex offenders, whose victims were children, and the removal of dangerous child predators from the Guam community, and the protection of Guam youth; and it has been hailed as a major triumph among law enforcement's efforts to protect Guam's youth; and


WHEREAS, SSRA Joseph Strantz has volunteered and led the U.S. Naval Sea Cadet Corps (USNSCC) youth organization on Guam, where he served as Regional Director and held the rank of Lieutenant Commander. The Sea Cadets are a chartered, non-profit youth organization that seeks to build self-confidence, teamwork, leadership skills, and provide hands-on training and experience in career fields for middle and high school youth. Under SSRA Strantz's leadership, the Sea Cadets conducted extensive volunteer community service at numerous local, veteran, and civic organizations throughout Guam; and he has assisted many cadets to gain acceptance to the U.S. Service Academies, including the U.S. Naval Academy at Annapolis and West Point, as well as college and university ROTC scholarship programs, trade schools, enlistments and employment in the civil service and private sectors; and

WHEREAS, after eight (8) years of outstanding service on Guam, SSRA Strantz has received official permanent change of station transfer orders and will move from the FBI Guam Resident Agency to the FBI Office in Anchorage, Alaska; now therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Committee on Rules of I Mina'trentai Sais Na Liheslaturan Guahan does hereby, on behalf of I Liheslaturan Guahan and the people of Guam, recognize Joseph W. Strantz, FBI Supervisory Senior Resident Agent, for leading the investigations of financial crimes, drug trafficking, crimes against children, and human trafficking on Guam and the Pacific region; and commend him for his eight (8) years of outstanding service and dedication to mentoring Guam's youth community and protecting the island of Guam; and be it further



24 and human trafficking on Guam and the Pacific region; and commend him for his eight




