Relative to commending Irene Perez Ploke Sgambelluri for her tireless work as an advocate for Guåhan's war claims and recognizing her life as a CHamoru survivor of World War II.

BE IT RESOLVED BY I MINA'TRENTAL SAIS NA LIHESLATURAN 1 GUÅHAN:

- 3 WHEREAS, at the beginning of World War II, over 79 years ago, Irene
- Perez Ploke Sgambelluri, was 10 years old, living in Agat with her father †John 4
- Francis Ploke, a U.S. Navy Pharmacist, mother †Beatrice Taitano Perez Ploke, 5

and her four siblings; †Daniel Ploke, †Pauline Ploke Peterson, †Genevieve Ploke Snow, †John Francis Ploke Jr.; and

WHEREAS, in a time when Irene should have been enjoying her childhood, instead, she was experiencing the horrors of war. At the start of the war, she and her family came close to losing their lives, had her father not surrendered. Her father, however, selflessly surrendered sparing the family (while attempting to comfort a sobbing Irene by clenching her hand). Her father was then sent to Zentsuji Prisoner of War Camp in Osaka, where he spent the duration of the war providing medical care to fellow prisoners, and journaling when prisoners entered the camp and when they perished. Irene did not think she would see her father again. Left behind, she spent the war foraging for food and enduring hard labor and beatings at the hands of the Japanese; and

WHEREAS, Irene fought tirelessly to keep the island's painful past alive through public speaking engagements and attending World War II remembrance ceremonies. She served as a guest speaker at the *Manenngon* Memorial Ceremony marking Guam's 68th Liberation Day, Guam's 71st Liberation Day Grand Ceremony, laying a wreath at Arlington Cemetery's Tomb of the Unknown Soldier in Commemoration of the 74th Anniversary of the Liberation of Guam and the Marianas, marking the first time in history that a civilian participated in the ceremony. Irene also served as guest speaker at the Guam Museum's 75th Liberation Lecture Series and at the 76th Liberation Ceremony. In addition to this, she has given dozens of media interviews and talks at schools; and

WHEREAS, Irene has fought tirelessly to make war reparations not just a local issue but a national one. She has often stated that war reparations are not simply about monetary gain, but rather, a vital step to ensuring the suffering of the Guamanian people will not be buried with the past. Over the years, she has

engaged in a multitude of conversations with local legislators to share these sentiments; and

WHEREAS, Irene's advocacy brought her to Washington, D.C. in 2018 where she had the ear of one of President Donald J. Trump's top cabinet members, Mr. Douglas Hoelscher, Deputy Assistant to the President and White House Director of Intergovernmental Affairs, developing a friendship with Mr. Hoelscher, whom she exchanged many correspondences and engaged in many phone conversations. She then educated members of the White House about Guam's unique past and the vital importance of war reparations; and

WHEREAS, Irene received the validation she had been praying for when she received a letter from President Trump, recognizing the bravery of her military father, John Francis Ploke, and the Guamanian people. This would lead to President Trump signing H.R. 1365, which enabled the Treasury to correct prior technical errors and release funding. Mr. Hoelscher has publicly stated that Irene was the first person the White House contacted after the bill was signed into law. President Trump then gifted Irene the pen he used to sign that legislation; and

WHEREAS, in addition to her political activism on both national and local fronts, Irene has also been known to assist survivors in applying for war reparations. Her home phone served as a survivors' "hotline". Local radio shows regularly give out Irene's number, as they are aware she is always willing to help her fellow war survivors; and

WHEREAS, Irene has often said that she has found peace and forgiveness through advocacy and testimony. She has also found comfort in her supportive husband the late +Senator Rafael Sgambelluri, children; Darleen, +Jennifer, Pamela and Ralph, and +John, grandchildren and great grandchildren. Today, at 90 years old, Irene's sole wish is that her story and the

1	story of all those Guamanians who suffered and died during World War II will
2	not be buried with the past; and
3	WHEREAS, I Liheslaturan Guåhan acknowledges and celebrates, Irene
4	Perez Ploke Sgambelluri for her tireless work in advocating for war claims owed
5	to Guam, and ensuring that those who suffered as a result of the war are
6	remembered; and
7	WHEREAS, it is a long-standing tradition of I Liheslaturan Guåhan to
8	commend and honor members of our community, such as Irene Perez Ploke
9	Sgambelluri, whose diligent service has greatly contributed to the well-being of
10	our community; now, therefore, be it
11	RESOLVED, that I Mina'trentai Sais Na Liheslaturan Guåhan does
12	hereby, on behalf of the people of Guam, commend and recognize Irene Perez
13	Ploke Sgambelluri for her tireless work as an advocate for Guåhan's war claims
