2 ***GUAHAN*:**

3 **WHEREAS**, Janet Maanao Quenga-Chargulaf was born to †Jesus and
4 †Agueda Maanao on November 8, 1949, and is from the village of Tumon, Guam.
5 She was married to †Joaquin Santiago Quenga, Sr. on November 23, 1968 and have
6 five children: MAJ Janice Louise Quenga Hance (retired), Joaquin Santiago Quenga
7 Jr., Jessica Agueda Quenga Nangauta, John Frank Maanao Quenga, Jeffrey Anthony
8 Maanao Quenga. On August 6, 2016, Janet was married once again to Frank
9 Chargulaf in Las Vegas, Nevada; and

10 **WHEREAS**, after attending John F. Kennedy High School in Tamuning,
11 Guam, Janet began a career in the Department of Defense working in the U.S. Naval
12 Station, Guam, Supply Department, as a Supply Secretary in 1978; and

13 **WHEREAS**, Janet was assigned as the Personnel Support Director at the
14 Housing Division of the Navy Public Works Center at Naval Station Subic Bay
15 during and after the Philippines' Mount Pinatubo volcanic eruption and base closure;
16 and

1 **WHEREAS**, from November 10, 1992 to February 15, 1994, Janet worked
2 as a Housing Management Assistant in the Housing Division of Directorate of Public
3 Works in Fort Ord, California, where she was responsible for family housing
4 operations; and

5 **WHEREAS**, from February 15 to September 30, 1994, Janet became the
6 Housing Management Specialist at Fort Ord. Among her responsibilities were
7 managing the operations and utilization of the Unaccompanied Personnel Housing.
8 She was also the Billeting Manager and responsible for the Non-Appropriated Fund
9 and Appropriated Fund Programs; and

10 **WHEREAS**, from October 1, 1994 to July 15, 1997, Janet was the Housing
11 Management Specialist at the Presidio of Monterey in California, where her main
12 responsibilities were managing and planning policies and procedures of the Billeting
13 operations; and

14 **WHEREAS**, from July 16, 1997 to August 10, 1998, Janet moved from the
15 Housing Division to the Scheduling Division, Operations Plans and Programs where
16 she was the Scheduling Assistant for the Defense Language Institute Foreign
17 Language Center and Presidio of Monterey; and

18 **WHEREAS**, from August 10, 1998 to October 23, 1999, Janet was the
19 Scheduling Administrator for DLIFLC & Presidio of Monterey. She reviewed
20 planned, managed, and scheduled Video tele-training and mobile tele-training
21 programs; and

22 **WHEREAS**, Janet then became Housing Manager under the Housing
23 Division of the Directorate of Public Works of the Armed Forces of the Pacific.
24 From October 23, 1999 to October 21, 2000, she was assigned as Chief for
25 Unaccompanied Personnel Housing. From October 22, 2000 to June 28, 2001, Janet
26 was promoted to Chief of Family Housing Management Branch and Furnishings

1 Management Branch. From June 29, 2001 to October 23, 2005, she became Chief of
2 the Housing Management Division; and

3 **WHEREAS**, On October 23, 2005, Janet moved to the Directorate of Chief
4 of Staff for Operations and became the Scheduling Administration at the Presidio of
5 Monterey in California; and

6 **WHEREAS**, on August 6, 2007, at the Office of the Provost, Janet became
7 the Staff Action Control Officer at the Defense Language Institute Foreign Language
8 Center, Presidio of Monterey, in Monterey, California; and

9 **WHEREAS**, Janet received numerous awards throughout her career
10 including the Commander Award for Civilian Service on September 22, 2005;
11 Outstanding PHMA Chapter Member, Excellence in Service, Western Region on
12 March 1, 1997; DLIFLC Command's Coin of Excellence Award on April 1, 1995;
13 Department of the Army Achievement Medal for Civilian Services in September 1,
14 1994; and

15 **WHEREAS**, Janet's hospitality was well-known at every duty station she was
16 assigned to, Janet was always happy and eager to share the Chamorro culture and
17 traditions and island hospitality with everyone she met. Moreover, Janet volunteered
18 her time to bringing the Chamorro Community closer together through organizing
19 community events and festivals; and

20 **WHEREAS**, Janet's hospitality extended to her Chamorro community. Janet
21 and her family often would take the time to welcome any person from Guam and the
22 Marianas moving to California. Her generosity has helped many fellow islanders
23 adjust to their new home in California; now therefore, be it

24 **RESOLVED**, that *I Mina'trentai Sais Na Liheslaturan Guahan* does hereby,
25 on behalf of *I Liheslaturan Guahan* and the people of Guam, recognize Janet
26 Maanao Quenga-Chargulaf on her retirement from the Department of Defense; and

1 commend her for her forty-three (43) years of outstanding service to our island and
2 Nation; and be it further
