Relative to posthumously recognizing and commending the Late Sainan Herreru Francisco Cruz Lizama, also known as "Corned Beef", of Guam's Greatest Generation, for his immeasurable contributions to our island community; promoting, preserving and perpetuating the cultural practice of blacksmithing through apprenticeship programs; and extending our sincere condolences to his family on his passing.

1 BE IT RESOLVED BY I MINA'TRENTAI SAIS NA LIHESLATURAN 2 GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, Francisco "Corned Beef" Cruz Lizama was born on October 12,
1941 to Dolores Cruz and Jose Flores Lizama, just a couple of months before the start

of WWII, during which time his family experienced and overcame the hardships and
 destruction of the invasion and occupation of Guam, while Francisco was just an infant;
 and

WHEREAS, Mr. Lizama grew up in Barrigada with his parents and five (5) siblings. As a teenager, he was very interested in the disciplines of self-defense and the martial arts which led him to train in and earn his black belt in the Korean Martial Art of Tang Soo Do; and

8 WHEREAS, during Guam's time of transitioning from a mainly agricultural 9 economy to a wage-based economy, Francisco found himself working various jobs to 10 earn a living and he would always bring corned beef for lunch earning the nickname 11 "Corned Beef"; and

WHEREAS, during the Vietnam War, Mr. Lizama was one of many *CHamoru* men who was drafted into the United States Army, serving alongside many of his *CHamoru* brothers in the Armed Forces. While in Vietnam he was wounded by grenade shrapnel and eventually returned home. The Army awarded Mr. Lizama with the Purple Heart Medal. After recovering he married Rosalia Aguon. They moved to the Continental United States of America, and had two (2) sons, Troy and Chris. They would serve out the remainder of his Army Career in the U.S.; and

WHEREAS, upon returning home to Guam, Mr. Lizama found work first as a Corrections Officer and then later as a Fire Fighter. Mr. and Mrs. Lizama had (2) more sons, Sean and Dion. During his career in the fire department, he helped build the fire academy and facilitated the purchase of modern equipment and the building of several fire stations. He eventually retired as the Fire Chief of Guam; and

WHEREAS, his journey into the cultural practice of blacksmithing began in the
late 1980s. Mr. Lizama participated in a four (4) year, six hundred (600) hour Folk Arts
Blacksmithing Apprenticeship Program through the Guam Council on the Arts and
Humanities Agency (CAHA) from 1981-1985. He, along with two (2) of his fellow

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firefighters, were the original apprentices under the tutelage of the Late Sainan Herreru
Joaquin "Tun Jack" Lujan, Guam's first Master Blacksmith to be acknowledged and
recognized by the Council on the Arts and Humanities Agency and the only person from
Guam who has received a National Fellowship Award from the National Endowment
for the Arts; and

WHEREAS, in 1999, Mr. Lizama established the "Chamorro Crafters" 6 organization along with fellow artisans and crafters, Greg Pangelinan and Joseph San 7 Nicolas. Together they demonstrated their craft and showcased their carvings and 8 metalwork at Annual Mes CHamoru Celebrations in public and private schools and 9 various events around the island. On May 8, 2003, the group was recognized for overall 10 excellence in the folk and traditional arts for 2002 and was presented the Maga'Låhi 11 Art Awards by CAHA Executive Director Johnny Sablan, an award that recognizes 12 individuals, groups, or corporations for their significant influence and contribution to 13 the arts, natural environment, or cultural life in Guam through distinguished services or 14 15 creative accomplishments; and

WHEREAS, under the CAHA grant program, Mr. Lizama received the Fellowship Award to enhance and advance his skills in blacksmithing and carving bone and giant clam shell or *hima* and he received a grant to conduct a blacksmith apprenticeship program to teach apprentices the principles and techniques of blacksmithing to include forging the traditional Chamorro survival tools including the *machete, the fosino, the sohsoh, the fisga, the si'i, the kåmyo* and the *tierras pugua,* as well as various custom made blades; and

WHEREAS, in December 2012, CAHA bestowed upon Mr. Lizama the title of Sainan Herreru; and in 2016, Mr. Lizama was appointed by Governor Edward Calvo to serve as the Folks Arts Representative for a term of four years on the CAHA Board; and

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WHEREAS, Mr. Lizama participated in various cultural events such as the 1 Guam CAHA Annual Arts & Humanities Month Celebration and the Guam Micronesia 2 Island Fair. He also served as a Guam Delegate and Goodwill Ambassador for the Arts 3 at several regional and international events to include the 18th to the 38th Annual Flame 4 Tree Arts Festivals, the Annual Olechotel Belau Fair in 2006 and the 5th to the 12th 5 Festival of Pacific Arts and Culture (FestPac), also known as the "Olympics of the 6 Arts,". During this time he traveled to Australia, the Cook Islands, Samoa, New 7 Caledonia, Palau, America Samoa and the Solomon Islands to share Guam's history 8 9 and culture; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Francisco "Corned Beef" Cruz Lizama was a Saina from the Greatest Generation on Guam. His years of service, dedication, sacrifice, stewardship, benevolence, and drive to perpetuate and preserve the cultural values of the CHamoru people are immeasurable and his legacy will live through his children and the people of Guam; now therefore, be it
