4	disabilities throughout the nation and ensures special education and related services to

6	WHEREAS. Special Needs takes a variety of forms and can range from

WHEREAS, Special Needs takes a variety of forms and can range from developmental disabilities, learning disabilities, health conditions, or even giftedness; and a disability is a natural part of the human experience and does not diminish the right of individuals to participate in or contribute to society; and

WHEREAS, the observance of National Special Education Day is recognized for the efforts to improve positive outcomes for special needs students and children with disabilities by ensuring access to unlimited opportunities to learn and to lead purposeful and fulfilling lives; and

WHEREAS, National Special Education Day also celebrates advancements made in educating children with disabilities, and it also reminds us of the importance of accommodating special needs children in ways that allow them to thrive in the classroom as well as beyond the classroom setting; and

WHEREAS, through available trainings, services and programs offered, the progress of special education have had significant benefits for children with disabilities; and to date, more than seven million children receive special education services, where many of these students spend most of the school day in general education classrooms; and

WHEREAS, the Guam Department of Education (GDOE) Special Education Division is committed to the development of the mind, body and spirit of every student through the unified efforts of the school, family and community; supported and nurtured by appropriate funding and training, accountability, teamwork and advocacy; and GDOE-SPED currently services 1754 students identified with special needs to include but not limited to intellectual disability, speech/language impairment, hearing impairment, visual impairment, and emotionally detached; and

2	Division offers several parent support groups to assist and guide families with children			
3	identified with special needs; and in collaborations with the Department of Integrated

6	Technology; Hunter Speaks Guam; Parents Empowering Parents; and the Guam			
7	Developmental Disabilities Council; and			
8	WHEREAS, GDOE-SPED recently partnered with Autism Community			
9	Together (ACT) and the National Association of State Directors of Special Education.			
10	The University of Guam for Excellence in Developmental Disabilities Education,			
11	Research, and Service on a five-year professional development project, Project Hita			
12	Para Mo'na (Moving Forward Together), which offers information and suggestions for			
13	families and school professionals, working together, to ensure that the delivery of			
14	special education instruction, services and supports continues to be designed to meet			
15	the individual needs of students with disabilities in Guam, even during these			
16	challenging times; and			
17	WHEREAS, Project Hita Para Mo'na (Moving Forward Together) also assist			
18	parents with understanding how special education services will be determined and			
19	provided to their child(ren) during the extended closure of school campuses caused by			
20	the global COVID-19 health pandemic; and the program offers information and			
21	suggestions for families and school professionals; and			
22	WHEREAS, due to the global COVID-19 pandemic, the Guam Department of			
23	Education - Special Education Division maintains federal guidance to ensure special			
24	needs student's progress in the curriculum are accommodated with the remote/online			
25	learning, face-to-face learning and/or hybrid learning; and as of August 24, 2020 there			
26	are no changes to the special needs students rights under IDEA; and where			
27	Individualized Education Plan (IEP) should be fully implemented; and			
28	WHEREAS, in light of recent limitations due to the global pandemic of COVID-			
29	19, special needs students continue to adjust to the different modes of learning which			

hinders their full access to their unique learning programs tailored to their specific need(s); and with the significant impact on their quality education, special needs students experience increased distress due to the changes in instructional practices and the disruption in their learning environment and routine; and

WHEREAS, GDOE-SPED continue to work collaboratively with students with special needs and their families to reflect the importance of their involvement and critical role in the child's educational decisions and their successful partnerships, working together in new and different ways; and guiding the appropriate expectations now more than ever, rely upon open and positive communication, flexibility and creativity as students with special needs navigate through the challenging circumstances caused by COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, the National Special Education Day acknowledges special needs children or children with disabilities and their families that overcome the stigma and discrimination in their everyday lives, and continue to advocate for equal opportunities for high-quality education; and observing December 2nd as the National Special Education Day, now therefore, be it
