Relative to posthumously commending Manuel Olive Lujan, who served in the First Congress of Guam in 1917, and the Commissioner of Yoña in 1916 and 1920, and acknowledging his influence on his family with the contributions of his six children to the people of Guam and through their military service to the United States as well as recognizing his three living grandchildren as WWII survivors, namely Virginia Lujan Taitano Unpingco, Frances Lujan Cruz Babauta, and Vincent "Sonny" L.G. Lujan; this month also marks the 80th year since the bombardment of Guam on December 08, 1941.

1 **BE IT RESOLVED BY / MINA'TRENTAI SAIS NA LIHESLATURAN**

2 **GUÁHAN:**

3 **WHEREAS**, †Manuel Olive Lujan (Familián Pale) was born in the Spanish
4 colonized island of Guam in 1888, and died in 1932. He is the son of †Dolores
5 T. Lujan and †Francisco Olive. Manuel married †Carmen Ulloa (Familián
6 Chana) and his sister was †Francisca Lujan Tydingco ; and

7 **WHEREAS**, Manuel Olive Lujan was an appointed member of the First
8 Congress of Guam in 1917. As a Chamorro, he and others in this Congress
9 were allowed a platform from which to address the Naval Government. This
10 appointed Congress was advisory in nature and had asked that people of Guam
11 be granted citizenship or at least the right to petition for United States
12 citizenship; and

13 **WHEREAS**, he served as the Yoña Commissioner in 1920 where he
14 previously served as the Deputy Commissioner of Yoña in 1916 and later as
15 the Commissioner in that same year. In 1917, he was said to have been “an
16 intelligent man and is active in the performance of his duties” (The Guam
17 Newsletter, VII; 10-16 p.6-8, School Notes); and

18 **WHEREAS**, Manuel and Carmen raised their 6(six) children in Yoña and
19 Agaña; these children were †William Ulloa Lujan, †Manuel Ulloa Lujan,
20 †Francisco Ulloa Lujan, †Antonio Ulloa Lujan, †Henry Ulloa Lujan, and †Maria
21 Ulloa Lujan. They would then grow up to serve the people of Guam, serve the
22 U.S. Navy or work for the federal government; and

23 **WHEREAS**, William Ulloa Lujan was married to †Cleotilde L. Lujan.
24 Together with their children; †William “Buddy” Lujan, †Gladys Mae Lujan and
25 Virginia Juanita Lujan, alongside William's cousins, †Joaquin Lujan Palomo and
26 Rita Lujan Palomo, they survived the atrocities of WWII. †Maria Lujan Palomo
27 and †Jose Lujan Palomo also survived the atrocities of WWII. William was a

1 pre-war schoolteacher at Inajaran Elementary School and George Washington
2 High School. During the War, he secretly served as a courier to the Chamorro
3 people and remained loyal to the Americans. He loved playing baseball and
4 was a sports enthusiast with special interest in baseball and boxing history. He
5 is credited for bringing professional boxers, Joe Louis and Rocky Marciano to
6 Guam in 1949 to promote their sport. He also worked for the Department of
7 Public Works and retired as Maintenance Supervisor. He is most remembered
8 by his family for his hospitality, for being a jolly man, a baseball and boxing
9 historian, and a great father; and

10 **WHEREAS**, Manuel Ulloa Lujan was married to †Mariana L.G. Lujan.
11 They were both worked as pre-war schoolteachers. Together with their son,
12 Vincent "Sonny" Lujan who was born during the War, they survived the atrocities
13 of WWII. After the War ended, †Manuel and Mariana had three more sons:
14 †Rudy, Ronald, and †Ray. They would also rear a nephew, †Leonard, and two
15 nieces, †Maria and Ana. Manuel would later serve as a Senator in the First(1st)
16 through the Tenth(10th) Guam Legislature. He held the position of Vice Speaker
17 from Fourth (4th) through the Seventh(7th) Legislature. In 1975, Yoña
18 Elementary School was renamed Manuel U. Lujan Elementary School to honor
19 his contributions as a longtime educator and public servant. He is most
20 remembered by his family for being a devoted husband, a very good father, and
21 a man very good character who was kind to all; and

22 **WHEREAS**, Francisco Ulloa Lujan was married to †Gloria Mesa Lujan.
23 He served and retired from the U.S. Navy and would later work and retire from
24 the U.S. Postal Service. He and Gloria had nine (9) children. Together with two
25 of their children, Frances Lujan and †Melva Lujan, they survived the atrocities
26 of WWII. Their only son, Francisco Jr., died of influenza and pneumonia shortly
27 after the War ended. Francisco and Gloria had six more children: Carmen,

1 Mary, Catherine, Claire, Linda, and †Therese. Francisco is most remembered
2 by his family for being a devoted husband, a great father, a role model through
3 managing young boys on Sinajana's softball team and a contributor to the
4 building of Saint Jude's Church. He was also an active parent in the PTA at
5 Sinajana Elementary School; and

6 **WHEREAS**, Antonio Ulloa Lujan had three children. He relocated to the
7 U.S. before WWII and served in the U.S. Navy. He later worked in Guam in the
8 construction business. He loved his family, especially all his brothers and sister.;
9 and

10 **WHEREAS**, Henry Ulloa Lujan relocated to the U.S. before WWII and
11 served in the U.S. Navy. He also worked for the U.S. Postal Service. He married
12 †Louella and they had three children: Rick, Carmen, and †Doug. He is most
13 remembered by his family for being a kind, gentle man, and a loving father. He
14 was very kind and generous to his nieces and nephews; and

15 **WHEREAS**, Maria Ulloa Lujan was the youngest child. She followed her
16 two older brothers' footsteps and became a schoolteacher. She survived the
17 atrocities of WWII. After the War ended, she and her first cousin, †Lucy Ulloa,
18 completed their college education in the States and returned to work as
19 teachers in Guam. They were devoted members of the Guam Seventh Day
20 Adventist Church; and

21 **WHEREAS**, Manuel Olive Lujan had served the people of Guam in the
22 First Congress and as a Commissioner, and he and his wife had influenced their
23 children to serve as educators, as servicemen in the U.S. Navy, as federal
24 government personnel, and above all to serve God; now therefore, be it

25 **RESOLVED**, that *I Mina'trentai Sais Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does
26 hereby, on behalf of the people of Guam, posthumously commends Manuel
27 Olive Lujan for his contribution and service to the government of Guam and to

1 acknowledge his influence on his children to serve the United States and the
2 community of Guam and recognize that three of his living grandchildren are
3 survivors of WWII; and be it further

4 **RESOLVED**, that the Speaker certify, and the Legislative Secretary attest
5 to, the adoption hereof, and that copies of the same be thereafter transmitted
6 to the Lujan Family, to the Yoña Mayor's office, to Mayor Bill Aguon Quenga of
7 Yoña, to the Manuel U. Lujan Elementary School; and to the Honorable Lourdes
8 A. Leon Guerrero, *I Maga'hågan Guåhan*.
