WHEREAS, Darlene R. Moore moved to Guam with her family in 1976; and she earned both her Bachelor of Arts Degree in Anthropology and her Master's Degree in Behavioral Science at the University of Guam; and

WHEREAS, Darlene has worked as an archaeologist in Guam for more than forty (40) years, and her work has contributed to the body of knowledge about the *CHamoru* people, with a specific focus on pre-contact pottery in the Mariana Islands; and

WHEREAS, in the late 1970s and early 1980s, Darlene worked for the Territorial Archaeology Lab and participated in the excavation at *Ypao Beach*. In the mid-1980s, she worked for the Micronesian Area Research Center (MARC) at the University of Guam and was a co-author of the *Tumon Bay Area Overview*; and

WHEREAS, in the summer of 1988, Darlene formed a sole proprietorship, known as the Micronesian Archaeological Research Services (MARS); and in early 1992, the sole proprietorship became a scientific and educational non-profit corporation; and Darlene Moore and Judy Amesbury have now served as Directors of the non-profit corporation for the past thirty (30) years; and

WHEREAS, Darlene has become the world's foremost expert on pre-contact pottery in the Mariana Islands. She has documented changes in the Marianas pottery from the early pre-contact period through the late pre-contact period (around 1500 BC to 1500 AD or later), and she has also documented the differences between the pottery from Guam and the pottery from Saipan; and

WHEREAS, Darlene made the important discovery that the ancient *CHamorus* grew rice prior to Western contact. She recognized small imprints of rice grains in pre-contact pottery sherds. The rice grains had been accidentally pressed onto the pots when the clay was still wet, thereby leaving evidence of the perishable rice; and

WHEREAS, Darlene has authored more than one hundred (100) technical reports on archaeological projects in Guam, Saipan, Tinian, and Rota; and she has also published articles in academic journals and given presentations at local and international meetings in Thailand, Philippines and Cambodia; and

WHEREAS, for many years, Darlene had served on the Board of the Guam Preservation Trust, which also serves as the Historic Preservation Review Board, and she was also on the Board of the Audubon Society; and



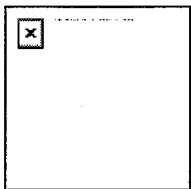
