Relative to expressing the utmost support of *I Mina'trentai* Sais Na Liheslaturan Guåhan (the 36th Guam Legislature) for the passage of S. 3284, the "Veterans Assistance Helpline Act of 2021," introduced by the Honorable Jaclyn Rosen in the United States on November 30, 2021, which seeks to permanently establish a toll-free telephone helpline for veterans to use in order to quickly obtain information and assistance with all services from the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs.

- 3 WHEREAS, S. 3284, known as the "Veterans Assistance Helpline Act of 2021,"
- 4 was introduced in the United States Senate on November 30, 2021 by Senator Jacklyn
- 5 Rosen of Nevada, and referred to the Committee on Veterans' Affairs; and

WHEREAS, the intent of the "Veterans Assistance Helpline Act of 2021" is to require the U.S. Secretary of Veterans Affairs to establish a toll-free telephone helpline for veterans and other eligible individuals to use to obtain information about the benefits and services provided by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA), and for other purposes; and

WHEREAS, the proposed legislation would also direct the U.S. Department of

WHEREAS, the proposed legislation would also direct the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs, in coordination with the Federal Communications Commission (FCC), to conduct a study to assess the feasibility and advisability of designating a dialing code for veterans to access the toll-free telephone helpline; and work towards deploying a simple, easy to remember dialing code to use to immediately connect to all of the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs resources; and

WHEREAS, S. 3284, the "Veterans Assistance Helpline Act of 2021," would also facilitate more user-friendly access to obtaining information and services over the phone, communicating with a "live individual" rather than an automated recording, and ensuring quality of service to efficiently expedite and streamline access to support resources; and

WHEREAS, the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) is overseen by Congress and regulates interstate and international communications by radio, television, wire, satellite, and cable in all fifty (50) states, the District of Columbia, and U.S. territories; and is the federal agency responsible for implementing and enforcing America's communications laws and regulations; and

WHEREAS, toll-free numbers are telephone numbers with distinct three (3)-digit codes that can be dialed from landlines with no charge to the individual placing the call; and such toll-free numbers allow callers to reach individuals out of the service area without being charged a long-distance fee for the call; and

WHEREAS, I Mina'trentai Sais Na Liheslaturan Guåhan (the 36th Guam Legislature) finds that the proposed legislation, S. 3284, the "Veterans Assistance

1 Helpline Act of 2021," would greatly benefit veterans seeing that many veterans do not

have access to wireless or internet capabilities to online services, which hinders their

opportunity to avail themselves to the assistance, accommodations, and the necessary

4 benefits and services; and

WHEREAS, Senator Rosen's proposed measure, the "Veterans Assistance Helpline Act of 2021," would allow veterans to easily seek help and access all the critical services that the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs provides; and through the toll-free telephone helpline, veterans can access important services and get connected to the proper entity within the VA, without having to call multiple phone numbers; and WHEREAS, I Mina'trentai Sais Na Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that many Guam veterans have served and protected our nation and our island, and the proposed legislation, S. 3284, the "Veterans Assistance Helpline Act of 2021," will provide veterans with a simple way to navigate the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs services and resources they deserve and have rightfully earned; and

WHEREAS, the "Veterans Assistance Helpline Act of 2021" ensures that all veterans across the nation will have access to an easy to remember, quick, three (3) digit code to dial in for assistance to resources and services provided by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs free of charge; and veteran callers can access the toll-free telephone number from across the country, internationally and locally; and

WHEREAS, long-distance calls have been a financial burden for many individuals, including international or stateside calls, and most individuals utilize long distance calling cards, and there are others who do not have long distance calling options with their landline phone service. Due to differences in time zones, individuals can accumulate fees or be charged excessively; and

WHEREAS, Guam veterans make calls to the Guam Veterans Affairs Office concerning their benefits and services, and sometimes their inquiries are redirected to the federal U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs. The majority of Guam veterans are

1 retired and on a fixed income, and they do not anticipate the charges of their long-

2 distance call; and with the "Veterans Assistance Helpline Act of 2021," the intent is to

3 avoid unnecessary charges and provide veteran callers with a free and convenient way

to stay connected to the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs global network of

resources and services; and

WHEREAS, the "Veterans Assistance Helpline Act of 2021," also extends to an individual acting on behalf of a veteran or an individual eligible to receive a benefit or service administered by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs; and

WHEREAS, I Mina'trentai Sais Na Liheslaturan Guåhan supports the passage of S. 3284, the "Veterans Assistance Helpline Act of 2021"; and where some veterans are experiencing homelessness and do not have access to telephone services, a toll-free telephone helpline can help them. With the assistance of the Guam Veterans Affairs Office, they can provide assistance to these veterans by allowing the veterans the use their office telephone lines; I Mina'trentai Sais Na Liheslaturan Guåhan further supports the proposed measure to ensure credibility, portability, and veterans care satisfaction of the services provided by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs; now therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that *I Mina'trentai Sais Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of the people of Guam, express the utmost support for the passage of S. 3284, the "Veterans Assistance Helpline Act of 2021," which seeks to permanently establish a toll-free telephone helpline for veterans to use in order to quickly obtain information and assistance with all services from the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs; and be it further
