BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I MINA'TRENTAI SAIS NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, January 2022 marks the eighteenth (18th) annual observance of "National Stalking Awareness Month," which is a call to action to stand against the crime of stalking; and

WHEREAS, according to the Stalking, Prevention, Awareness, and Resource Center (SPARC), stalking is defined as a "course of conduct directed at a specific person that would cause a reasonable person to fear" and ultimately it is a pattern of behavior directed at a specific person resulting in fear and emotional distress; and stalking is a crime that renders psychological distress and loss of productivity; and

WHEREAS, SPARC asserts that more victims are stalked through technology, such as phone calls, text messages, social media platforms, internet posts, emails, and electronic tracking; and

WHEREAS, according to the Guam Police Department Family Violence Statistics, there were ten (10) victims of stalking in 2020 and thirteen (13) victims in 2019; and

WHEREAS, in the United States, 6 million to 7.5 million people are stalked in a one (1)-year period, and many victims are stalked by someone they know; and

WHEREAS, according to SPARC, three (3) in four (4) women are stalked by an intimate partner; and


WHEREAS, stalking is a dangerous crime as one (1) in five (5) stalkers use weapons to harm or threaten their victims; and

WHEREAS, most stalking victims are teenagers and young adults, who are often unaware of the signs of stalking and the resources available to them from our community; now therefore, be it
