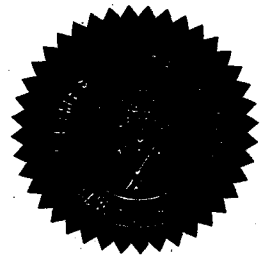
WHEREAS, it is the custom and intent of I Liheslaturan Guahan to honor the life and accomplishments of those distinguished citizens of this great island; and
