**BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I MINA TRENTAI SAIS NA LIHESLATURAN GUÁHAN:**

**WHEREAS**, Consul General Victoriano "Vic" April was born on November 2, 1954, and grew up in Ngarchelong on Babeldaob, Palau. Mr. April is married to Loretta Rdialul April and has three (3) children: Melanie Ongerool April, Stefan Ngirakebou April, and Moriah Umali April; and currently resides in the village of Mangilao; and

**WHEREAS**, Mr. April is an alumnus of the University of Guam, where he received a Bachelor of Arts degree in Anthropology in 1980 and a Master of Arts in Micronesian Studies also from the University of Guam in 2001 with his thesis topic entitled: *Comparative Study of Latte Quarries in the Marianas*; and

**WHEREAS**, Mr. April began his dedicated service to the people of Guam at the Historic Preservation Section of the Department of Parks and Recreation where he worked as an Archaeological Technician I from 1978 to 1980 and participated in archaeological surveys and excavations, in addition to clearing, sorting, cataloging, and performing analysis of archaeological dating; and

**WHEREAS**, from August 1980 to 1990, Mr. April became an Archaeological Technician II where he reviewed and provided written comments on project applications, which evaluated a project's potential to impact significant cultural resources, and provided technical advice to local, federal, and private developers who had mandated historic preservation responsibilities; and

**WHEREAS**, from 1990 to 2009, Mr. April became the State Archaeologist of the Historic Resources Division of the Department of Parks and Recreation, where he was responsible for reviewing environmental impact statements, archaeologist reports, scope of work and research designs for archaeological investigations on both private and government-owned lands; nominating sites to the National Register of Historic Places; identifying historic preservation projects for the purpose of grant-in-aid assistance; conducting archaeological surveys and excavations for properties to be nominated to the National Register and publications; as well as reviewing and approving plans for recovery of submerged resources. Mr. April also served as the Department's liaison with other entities having interests and or impacts on historic properties. He participated in the preparation of statewide historic preservation plans and supervised the permitting process for all aspects of development. Furthermore, Mr. April supervised the review of projects that are subject to Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966, as amended; and

**WHEREAS**, Mr. April was dedicated to preserving and unearthing the history of Micronesia. In 1980, he assisted his colleague Laurie Lucking on her PhD dissertation project on the study of Prehistoric Palauan Terraces doing oral history collection; and he served as an interpreter during the field survey and excavations in the many historical sites, and he was instrumental in the archaeological investigation and documentation of numerous historical sites on Guam, including the Talagi Pictograph Cave in Tarague, Guam, as well as overseeing the data recovery of three (3) World War II tunnels in Malakal, Koror in the Republic of Palau; and

**WHEREAS**, Mr. April became a leading expert in the field of anthropology on Guam and within the region and was often called upon to speak and give lectures at professional conferences and events. Mr. April was a Special Guest Speaker at the First Historic Preservation/Environmental Quality Protection Board Conference on the topic of the 106 Process (National Historic Preservation Act of 1966) held in Bai ra Metal, Koror, Palau in 1993. Additionally, in 1994, he presented his research on the Origin of the Early Palauans at the International Conference in Palau: 50 years of Change, Bai ra Metal, Koror. Furthermore, he was a distinguished Speaker at the 1998 Micronesian Studies Seminar Series at the University of Guam discussing Latte Quarries in the Marianas. Throughout his time serving in the Department of Parks and Recreation, he maintained professional membership with the Society for American Archaeology since 1990 and the National Association of State Archaeologists since 1996; and

**WHEREAS**, Mr. April's work and accomplishments were recognized by the Government of Guam having been nominated for the "Top Ten Employees of the Year" award in the Professional, Biological, Physical Science and Related Fields in 1990 and 1997 for the Government of Guam Magnificent Seven Program of the Office of the Governor. He was "Employee of the Month" for the Department of Parks and Recreation for the months of January 1993 and August 1995; and he was also a nominee for "Supervisor of the Quarter" for the months of January-March and April-June in 1996 at the Historic Resources Division of the Department of Parks and Recreation. In 2009, Mr. April retired from the Department of Parks and Recreation after more than thirty (30) years of dedicated service to our island; and

**WHEREAS**, Mr. April was deeply respected on Guam and Palau, and his love of Guam made him a great candidate to lead the Palau Consulate Office in Guam, in which he served on a part-time basis from 2002 to 2004; and from 2014 to 2021, Mr. April served as a full-time Consul General representing Palau in Guam; and

He worked with the Palauan community of Guam to finalize a lease agreement with the Government of Guam giving the Palauan community space to construct an Abai, or community center, to serve as a meeting place as well as a place to teach the Palauan culture to Palauan youth on Guam. Furthermore, in order to create a better understanding of the Palauan community, Mr. April gave a lecture on "Migration, Assimilation, and Adaptation of the People of Palau on Guam" at the University of Guam in 2019, where he spoke about the challenges and accomplishments of many Palauans who have made Guam their home; and

WHEREAS, Mr. April is an avid sportsman with a sports career spanning nearly four (4) decades. He competed and coached in various sports, including tennis, baseball, softball, table tennis, and volleyball; and he has represented the Palauan community and Guam at the regional and international levels; and

WHEREAS, in tennis, Mr. April was a finalist at the 1986 Michelob Open Classic "A" division singles; the 1986 and 1987 Dueling doubles "A" division Champion; the 1987 Hilton-USO Open "A" division singles finalist; the 1989 Michelob Open "A" division Mixed Doubles finalist; the 1989 Chamorro Open "A" division Mixed Doubles finalist; the 1991 Governor's Cup Classic "A" division Singles Champion; the 1987 Guam Representative to the 6<sup>th</sup> Annual Western Invitational Tennis Tournament; the 1987 Guam Representative to the 8<sup>th</sup> South Pacific Games in Noumea, New Caledonia; the 1990 Guam Representative to the 2<sup>nd</sup> Micro-Games in the CNMI, Gold Medalist in doubles; the 1991 Guam Representative to the 9<sup>th</sup> South Pacific Games, Papua New Guinea, Semi-finalist in Mixed Doubles; and as an assistant coach for the Guam Tennis Team at the 3<sup>rd</sup> Micro Games held in Guam, he helped lead his team to win the most medals; and
