WHEREAS, Daniel Quinata Sanchez and his common-law wife, Arlene Rose Gofigan, have four (4) children: Arlena Danielle, Chelsie Rose, Daniel Jr., and Lawrence Thomas, and four (4) grandchildren: Marleigh Jude, Aaleighya Seige, Audrina Shayee, and Daniel George; and

WHEREAS, Daniel Quinata Sanchez attended F.Q. Sanchez Elementary School in *Umatac*, *Inarajan* Middle School, and George Washington High School; and he graduated from Carson High School in Carson City, California, and continued his education at the Guam Community College where he studied in the criminal justice field; and

WHEREAS, Daniel Quinata Sanchez had held various positions with the U.S. Navy Exchange, GORCO, and the Department of Public Safety-Guam Police Crime Prosecution Unit; and he was recruited in the 20th Guam Police Cycle in 1980, starting his public service career as a Guam Police Officer; and

WHEREAS, Daniel Quinata Sanchez devoted much of his life to protecting our island community, and during his time serving at the Guam Police Department, he was assigned to Patrol Operations for five (5) years, the Juvenile Investigation Division for five (5) years, and the Special Enforcement Amphibious Section (SEAS)/Special Weapons and Tactics (SWAT)/Executive Security for eight (8) years; and he retired from the Guam Police Department in December 1999; and


