

Håfa Adai Majority Leader Nelson:

Thank you for this opportunity to provide testimony on Resolution No. 151-36 (LS)—Relative to expressing the utmost support of *I Mina'trentai Sais na Liheslaturan Guåhan* for H.R. 1652, the "VOCA Fix to Sustain the Crime Victims Fund Act of 2021" introduced by the Honorable Representative Jerrold Nadler; and through its passage, U.S. Public Law 117-27, which secures funding to the Crime Victims Fund, to waive matching requirements, and for other purposes of the Victims of Crime Act (VOCA).

The VOCA Fix to Sustain the Crime Victims Fund Act of 2021 (VOCA Fix) was passed by the U.S. Senate on July 20, 2021 and subsequently signed by the U.S. President becoming Public Law No: 117-27 on July 22, 2021.

This represents a monumental victory for the future of victim services both nationally and throughout Guam. Sustainable funding to the Crime Victims Fund (CVF) is critical to ensure that victims of crime are met with high-quality services that are trauma-informed, culturally responsive, and reflective of diverse communities.

Changes to the VOCA statute will provide for increased funding and flexibility in the management of VOCA awards, including:

- Directing federal criminal settlements from non-prosecution and deferred prosecution agreements currently deposited into the General Treasury, into the Crime Victims Fund;
- Increasing the percentage that state compensation programs may be reimbursed from 60 percent to 75 percent;
- Providing the U.S. Attorney General the ability to issue no-cost extensions on VOCA awards;
- Giving states the ability to waive the local match for VOCA assistance grants for the duration of the pandemic;
- Providing additional flexibility for compensation programs to provide support for victims even if they do not interact with law enforcement prior to requesting assistance; and
- Removing the restitution recovery penalty from annual state compensation certification forms.

In Fiscal Year 2020, the Office of the Attorney General (OAG) issued subawards to six local organizations, totaling \$2.9 Million under the FY17 and FY18 VOCA Victim Assistance Programs. The subawards support victims of crime through funding services such as information and referral services, personal advocacy and accompaniment, emotional support and safety services, temporary shelter/housing services, criminal/civil justice system assistance, child visitation, victim notification services, and victim compensation, to name a few.


The OAG also received \$115,000 in FY18 and FY19 VOCA Victim Compensation funding which reimburses Guam's Criminal Injuries Compensation Fund \$0.60 for every \$1.00 in compensation awards issued to eligible victims and/or survivors of qualifying crimes under the Criminal Injuries Compensation Program (CICP). A total of \$605,962 was paid to victims under the CICP since the start of the program in 2015.

Based on the data submitted by VOCA victim assistance service providers on Guam, 4,286 individuals sought victim assistance services in FY2020 and 38,958 direct service hours were supported by the VOCA program.

The total amount of funds that the Office for Victims of Crime (OVC) distributes each year for VOCA programs depends upon the amounts deposited into the Crime Victims Fund (CVF) during the preceding years and limits set by Congress. Over the past few years, VOCA funding, particularly for Guam, has decreased significantly from \$1.8 Million in FY18 to \$739,406 in FY21. The passage of the VOCA Fix Act provides for increased funding for victim services in the future and

the flexibility to allow no-cost extensions for current and future VOCA grant awards. Additionally, the VOCA Fix Act increases the percentage of reimbursements for Guam's Criminal Injuries Compensation Program from 60%-75% or \$0.75 for every \$1.00.

I'd like to thank Director Brennan (Melanie) from Department of Youth Affairs for joining us today. Mr. Fred Nishihara, the Deputy Attorney General and Mrs. Leinani Nahalowa from the Alee Shelter. Thank you for being here with us.

I've called for this Virtual Public Hearing today to provide the listening audience discussions on Resolution No. 151-36 (LS), "Relative to expressing the utmost support of I Mina'trentai Sais na Liheslaturan Guåhan for H.R. 1652, the "VOCA Fix to Sustain the Crime Victims Fund Act of 2021" introduced by the Honorable Representative Jerrold Nadler; and through its passage, U.S. Public Law 117-27, which secures funding to the Crime Victims Fund, to waive matching requirements, and for other purposes of the Victims of Crime Act (VOCA)."

Introduced as H.R. 1652, the Bill adds a new source of funding for the Crime Victims Fund and makes changes to formula grants supported by the fund. Specifically, the Bill would direct revenues collected from deferred prosecution and non-prosecution agreements to be deposited into the Crime Victims Fund, which would have originally been deposited into the General Fund of the Treasury. The Bill was introduced in the House on March 3, 2021 and was passed on March 17, 2021. The Bill was received in the Senate on March 18, 2021, amended "to ensure adequate funding in the Crime Victims Fund is disbursed to victims, their families, and their advocates each year", and passed the Senate on July 20, 2021. The Bill was presented to the President and was signed into law on July 22, 2021.

The Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) is important because it's funding will help many victims of crime, most especially women and children. It can help with getting assault victims proper treatment and guidance, which are often overlooked. It can help abused children receive reassuring care.

In Guam, the Office of the Attorney General administers the Guam Victim Assistance Grant Program, whose rules and regulations are consistent with federal and local guidelines. Through this Public Law, Guam may also see the changes brought forth in the Crime Victims Fund be applied to our island, and will help many whom cannot afford to pay for needs because of the PTSD that accompanies the trauma of being a victim.

So, I'd like to now invite Director Brennan (Melanie) of DYA, if she can just extend some remark and comments on this passage.

**Director Melanie Brennan, Department of Youth Affairs:** Thank you, Senator Nelson. I'm in full support of Resolution No. 151-36, recognizing the substantial contributions of the Crime Victims Fund. Always been an advocate in my capacity as the Director of the Department of Youth Affairs and my former capacity as a Chief Probation Officer and in my current capacity in assisting Child Protective Services.

I can see that the Victim's Assistance and Compensation programs that VOCA funds is essential to supporting our victims of crime particularly, violent crimes on Guam and so, I'm in full support and I thank you, it is an honor to be here.

**Senator Telena Cruz Nelson, Author**: Thank you, Director Brennan. Fred, is there any comments or testimony you would like to give?

Deputy Attorney General Fred Nishihira, Consumer Protection Division: Yes, thank you.

**Senator Telena Cruz Nelson, Author**: Thank you very much, Fred. I'd also like to call Leinani Nahalowa.

**Director Leinani Nahalowa, Catholic Social Services Alee Shelter:** Thank you, Senator Nelson for inviting today to be here to be a part of this wonderful Resolution No. 151-36 (LS). And Catholic Social Services Alee Shelter is in full support of the resolution and the eventual adoption. We are recipients and sub-recipients of monies that came out of VOCA, which assists tremendously.

The women, men and children who are fleeing domestic violence and other form of abuse and without this funding source we would not be able to provide the services that we do as the only emergency protective shelter on our island for the past forty (40) years. So, thank you again, Senator Nelson.

WHEREAS, the mission of the Office for Victims of Crime (OVC) is to enhance the capacity to assist and guide crime victims and to provide leadership in changing attitudes, policies, and practices in ways that will promote justice and healing for all crime victims; and

WHEREAS, the Crime Victims Fund, a major funding source for victim services throughout the nation, and established by the Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) of 1984, supports thousands of programs annually invested in victim compensation and assistance in all fifty (50) states and U.S. territory including Guam, American Samoa, the Commonwealth of the Mariana Islands (CNMI), the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, and the United States Virgin Islands (USVI); and

WHEREAS, VOCA also provides training and technical assistance, publications and products, and other capacity-building programs designed to enhance the skills of those who provide services to victims and their families in the immediate aftermath of crime and supporting them as they rebuild their lives; and raise awareness about victims' issues, promotes compliance with victims' rights and law; and

WHEREAS, to its uniqueness, the Crime Victims Fund, is primarily composed of criminal fines and penalties, special assessments, and bond forfeitures from

of criminal fines and penalties, special assessments, and bond forfeitures from convicted federal offenders and not from tax-payers dollars; and federal revenue from gifts, donations, and bequests by private parties; and

WHEREAS, authorized in 1984, the first eight (8) years of the Crime Victims Fund, placed an annual cap that could be deposited into the fund which varied from \$100 million to \$150 million; and in 1993, the cap was lifted; and

WHEREAS, due to large fluctuations in deposits, Congress placed a cap on funds available for distribution also known obligations in Fiscal Year 2000, intended to maintain the fund as a stable source of support for future victim services; and Fiscal Years 2000 – 2018, the annual cap varied from \$500 million to more than \$4 billion; and

WHEREAS, as of 2020, the U.S. Attorneys' Offices, federal courts, and the Federal Bureau of Prisons collected for the fund balance of over \$6 billion dollars which included deposits also known as receipts from federal criminal fines and penalties, forfeited bail bonds, and special assessment; and in Fiscal year 2020, the cap was set at \$2.641 billion dollars; and

WHEREAS, the Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) Victim Compensation Formula grant award, which provides funds from the Crime Victims Fund to enhance state victim compensation payments and provide financial assistance to eligible crime victims. Guam and in conjunction with the Office of Attorney General Guam, was awarded

WHEREAS, the Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) Victim Assistance Formula grant award, which provides funds from the Crime Victims Fund to enhance crime victim services and the VOCA assistance funds are awarded by the state to local community-based and non-profit organizations that provide direct services to crime victims and their families. Guam and in conjunction with the Office of the Attorney General Guam, was awarded nearly four million two hundred thirty-seven thousand and three hundred seventy dollars (\$4,237,370.00) in Fiscal Years 2018, 2019 and 2020; and

WHEREAS, U.S. Public Law 117-27, which adds a new source of revenue for the Crime Victims Fund, makes changes to the formula grants, increases compensation payments percentage from sixty percent (60%) to seventy-five percent (75%) to crime victims in the prior fiscal year; and it waives matching requirements in which state's victim assistance formula grants during and for one (1) year after a pandemic related national emergency and pursuant to the policy established by the reporting state; and

To deposit certain funds into the Crime Victims Fund, to waive matching requirements, and for other purposes.

July 22, 2021 [H.R. 1652]

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

#### SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

This Act may be cited as the "VOCA Fix to Sustain the Crime Victims Fund Act of 2021".

VOCA Fix to Sustain the Crime Victims Fund Act of 2021. 34 USC 10101

#### SEC. 2. COMPREHENSIVE FIX OF CRIME VICTIMS FUND AND COM-PENSATION.

- (a) CRIME VICTIMS FUND.—Section 1402 of the Victims of Crime Act of 1984 (34 U.S.C. 20101) is amended—
  - (1) in subsection (b)-
  - (A) in paragraph (4), by striking "; and" and inserting a semicolon;
  - (B) in paragraph (5)(B), by striking the period at the
  - end and inserting "; and"; and
    (C) by adding at the end the following new paragraph: "(6) any funds that would otherwise be deposited in the
  - general fund of the Treasury collected pursuant to— (A) a deferred prosecution agreement; or
  - "(B) a non-prosecution agreement."; and
    (2) in subsection (e), by striking "Director" and inserting "Director, except that renewals and extensions beyond that period may be granted at the discretion of the Attorney Gen-
- (b) Crime Victim Compensation.—Section 1403 of the Victims of Crime Act of 1984 (34 U.S.C. 20102) is amended—
  - (1) in subsection (a)—
  - (A) in paragraph (1), by striking "40 percent in fiscal year 2002 and of 60 percent in subsequent fiscal years"
  - and inserting "75 percent";
    (B) in paragraph (2), by striking "of 40 percent in fiscal year 2002 and of 60 percent in subsequent fiscal years"
  - (C) by redesignating paragraph (3) as paragraph (4);
  - (D) by inserting after paragraph (2) the following new
  - paragraph:
    "(3) For the purposes of calculating amounts awarded in the previous fiscal year under this subsection, the Director shall not require eligible crime victim compensation programs

to deduct recovery costs or collections from restitution or from

subrogation for payment under a civil lawsuit.";

"(5) the term 'recovery costs' means expenses for personnel directly involved in the recovery efforts to obtain collections from restitution or from subrogation for payment under a civil law suit.".

### SEC. 3. WAIVER OF MATCHING REQUIREMENT.

(a) IN GENERAL.—Section 1404(a) of the Victims of Crime Act of 1984 (34 U.S.C. 20103(a)) is amended by inserting at the end

"(7)(A) Each chief executive may waive a matching requirement imposed by the Director, in accordance with subparagraph (B), as a condition for the receipt of funds under any program to provide assistance to victims of crimes authorized under this chapter. The chief executive shall report to the Director the approval of any waiver of the matching requirement.

(B) Each chief executive shall establish and make public,

a policy including-

"(i) the manner in which an eligible crime victim assistance program can request a match waiver;

(ii) the criteria used to determine eligibility of the

match waiver: and

'(iii) the process for decision making and notifying the eligible crime victim assistance program of the decision.".

(b) NATIONAL EMERGENCY WAIVER.—Section 1404(a) of the Victims of Crime Act of 1984 (34 U.S.C. 20103(a)), as amended by subsection (a), is further amended by inserting at the end the

following new paragraph:

Time period.

(8) Beginning on the date a national emergency is declared under the National Emergencies Act (50 U.S.C. 1601 et seq.) with respect to a pandemic and ending on the date that is one year after the date of the end of such national emergency, each chief executive shall issue waivers for any matching requirement, in its entirety, for all eligible crime victim assistance programs contracted to provide services at that time.".

#### SEC. 4. DETERMINATION OF BUDGETARY EFFECTS.

The budgetary effects of this Act, for the purpose of complying with the Statutory Pay-As-You-Go Act of 2010, shall be determined by reference to the latest statement titled "Budgetary Effects of PAYGO Legislation" for this Act, submitted for printing in the

Congressional Record by the Chairman of the House Budget Committee, provided that such statement has been submitted prior to the vote on passage.
