## Bureau of Budget & Management Research Comments on Bill No. 95-36 (LS)

Bill No. 95-36 proposes to amend § 77104.1 of Article 1, Chapter 77, Title 21, Guam Code Annotated to give jurisdiction to all peace officers, as defined in 17 GCA, § 51101(b), to issue citations to any person who possesses or consumes alcohol in an "Alcohol Free Zone" (AFZ) within the Guam Territorial Park system. Existing law authorizes only Territorial Park Patrol Officers and Guam Police Officers jurisdiction in these AFZs. The Bill expands this jurisdiction to all peace officers, to include officers from the Guam Police Department, Guam Airport Police, Guam Port Authority Police, Department of Corrections, Customs and Quarantine Agency, Department of Youth Affairs, Division of Aquatic and Wildlife Resources, Attorney General's Office, Unified Guam Judiciary, and the Guam Fire Department.

In accordance with § 77104.2 (d), all fines collected as a result of penalties imposed by § 77104.1 shall be deposited in the "Public Recreation Services Fund (PRSF)", which was created specifically for the Department of Parks and Recreation (DPR). Because the Bill proposes to increase the resources to issue citations, the fines associated with each additional violation would contribute to the overall deposits into the PRSF. However, absent additional information such as how many citations are issued in a given time period, how much of the fines are actually paid and what percentage of the fines contribute to the PRSF, a more accurate fiscal impact of this legislation cannot be determined at this time. Furthermore, the expansion of additional peace officers to issue citations in AFZs may affect each agencies' operational budgets should they assign officers to patrol and monitor these AFZs outside their regular areas of operation.
