BUREAU OF BUDGET AND MANAGEMENT RESEARCH COMMENTS ON BILL NO. 99-36 (LS)

The proposed legislation intends to establish a new Inafa'maolek for Inmates Fund (IIF) to provide no-cost telephonic services for inmates or detainees to contact their legal counsel. The IIF shall be funded by revenues collected by the Government of Guam for telephone services within the Department of Corrections (DOC). The preamble of the proposed legislation states the purpose of creating such fund is to provide inmates who are indigent access to contacting their legal representation through the use of DOC's Paytel system. However, the language in the IIF's establishment contained in the proposed legislation does not incorporate language relative to the inmate being indigent.

Per correspondence with DOC, the fund should be utilized for those inmates identified as indigent. Further, DOC recommends that funding be made available to the Public Defender Services Corporation (PDSC) to pay for phone services through DOC's Paytel system. Additionally, DOC conducted a recent phone service for the PDSC, in which the average cost for phone service per indigent inmate amounted to \$400 a month.

The Bureau is unable to identify a revenue account specific to telephone services within the General Fund on the AS400 financial system. Absent information from the Department of Administration, the Bureau is unable to determine an approximate estimate of revenues currently received, and proposed to be deposited into the IIF, from telephone services. However, the Bureau notes that the total cost of the program can be estimated by applying DOC's average of \$400 of services per inmate a month and multiplied by the total amount of inmates identified as indigent.
