SUCCESSES

In September 2021, Guam Community College was awarded first runner-up in the USDOE Rethink Adult Education Challenge for its Marine Transportation Ship Repair Boot Camp program. GCC was selected from 203 entries representing 31 states, the District of Columbia and Guam. GCC's work-ready boot camps have become a model for successful job training, for engaging its private sector partners throughout the process, from designing the curriculum, to selecting participants, ensuring that completers are hired into their apprenticeship program. This continuum has proven highly successful, as the GCC Boot Camp model has an overall success rate of 87% since the program started in 2018.



INNOVATION

Turning Concepts Into Careers. Guam Community College took the needs identified during our Workforce Opportunities Reimagined Conference (WORC) and WORC2 conferences and turned them into the most prolific job training program in the region. In response to the high unemployment brought about by the near shutdown of the economy, GCC stood up 17 work-ready boot camps in 12 months, at an 83% completion rate. As a result, a majority of boot camp completers were offered employment as apprentices in new careers in high demand occupations.

CAMPUS FACILITIES

Building 300 renovation experienced major challenges as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic including shortages of materials, shipping delays, and shortages of workers. The project continues to move forward; however, due to challenges, the expected completion date was pushed backed dramatically. The anticipated completion date is set for 2022.

At the end of fiscal year 2021, the Gregorio D. Perez Crime Lab Annex was approximately 79.19% completed. The main contractor experienced challenges as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. The project is scheduled to be completed by the end of 2022.

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HIGHLIGHTS

In Fall 2020, GCC welcomed Dr. Virginia Tudela, PhD, as the new Vice President for Academic Affairs, and Rodalyn Gerardo, CPA, CGFM, CIA, as the new Vice President for Finance and Administration.

GCC's President, Dr. Mary Okada was chosen as the US Small Business Association's Women in Business Champion of the Year.

In March 2021, the College was recognized for its 20th consecutive clean audit. GCC is the only Government of Guam agency to have achieved this milestone.

GCC ProStart student, Alexandria Valencia De Chavez, from Tiyan High School, placed First Runner-Up in the National Restaurant Association's nation-wide "Give Us Your Best Pitch" Contest, for her sustainable restaurant concept, Boka Ni Mangi, that gives patrons the opportunity to earn their meal by helping the restaurant harvest its farm grown vegetables that are used in the meals they prepare.

CHALLENGES

Declining enrollment continued in 2021, as the COVID-19 threat level remained high and restrictions limited in-person attendance. Fall 2021 enrollment was at 1,690, a 6% decline from Fall 2020. While remote learning accommodations were made, a significant section of our population opted out of distance learning methods.

OUR OUTLOOK

Focusing On Success. Responding to the needs of our island during the COVID-19 pandemic has created opportunities for Guam Community College to advance the delivery of effective education and job training. Our academic programs continue to evolve and expand in response to the needs and demands of our island and region. Our new Bachelors of Science in Career and Technical Education (BS CTE) program will meet the teacher shortage head-on. Our Associate of Science in Practical Nursing (AS PN) program graduated its first class since expanding from a certificate to degree program. As these programs continue, we will realize significant progress in these areas of critical shortage.

On the workforce development front, GCC's rapidly expanding work-ready Boot Camps are proving highly effective at taking participants from training to employment in rapid succession, while providing the opportunity for them to enter into apprenticeship. We will continue to expand our offerings to meet the demands of our island and region.
