

said Jay Antonio, coach for the John F. Kennedy High School Islanders and founder of the API, now in its 17th year. Locally, the Islanders took the boys and girls cross-country titles at the All-Island meet held Monday at JFK.

Each participating school can have up to seven runners each for the boys and girls races. 5K course with hundreds of coconuts.

Runners from Guam, Korea and Palau will have to contend with runners from The American School in Japan Mustangs, which have won every team trophy since the first race almost two decades ago.

The race is held over two days with the first being the 5K, scheduled for 4:30 p.m. Friday. The second race is a coed relay held 6 a.m. Saturday at Ypao Beach, A champion is determined by a school's placing in the boys and girls 5K plus Sat-

The event also recognizes and awards the top 15 overall runners in each gender division.

urday's relay.

The API XC has become so popular over the years, that one off-island league has used it as their season finale. While there are 16 schools entered for 2022.

Antonio said there were as many as 31 schools competing in the past. This year's race will be the first one since late 2019 prior to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Besides the local public school entries and Guam Adventist Academy, the Academy of Our Lady of Guam, the Guam High Panthers and the St. John's Knights will also compete. The Independent Interscholastic Athletic Association of Guam's schools moved cross-country to the second quarter on the sports schedule, so the API XC will be a warmup for their season, said Antonio.

And while the Saturday relay is critical to a team's overall ranking in the event, the fact that it's held at the beach brings out more than just the competitive runner in each athlete.

"Everybody becomes a kid again at the relay," said

Yordan Alvarez and Alex Bregman delivered big hits and Houston advanced to the World Series again, finishing a four-game sweep in the AL Championship Series with a 6-5 victory Sunday night aided by another defensive gaffe from New York.

Taking advantage of a costly error by second baseman Gleyber Torres to produce the go-ahead rally in the seventh inning, the Astros won their second consecutive pennant and fourth in six years.

Rookie shortstop Jeremy

Peña hit a three-run homer off ailing Yankees starter Nestor Cortes to help the AL West champions overcome an early 3-0 deficit. Peña was picked as the ALCS MVP.

"It's surreal. You dream about this stuff when you're a kid," he said. "We're a step away from the ultimate goal."

Perfect in the playoffs, Houston opens the World Series at home Friday night against Bryce Harper and the wild-card Philadelphia Phillies, who beat San Diego to close out the best-of-seven NLCS in five

It was the first time both pennants were decided on the same day since 1992.

After losing to Atlanta in last year's World Series, Houston is 7-0 this postseason, earning the fifth pennant in franchise history and another chance at its second championship.

The team's 2017 title was tainted by a cheating scan-

"A lot has been said but there's not a lot to say anymore, man. We keep coming here. We keep facing the best of the best and we keep winning," pitcher Lance McCullers Jr. said.

"When everything happened a few years ago, we knew the one thing that we could do is we could win and we could win and win a lot. I understand people are still not going to like us. They're going to boo us, but at some point you have to respect what we're doing."

Dr. Ross indicated that the current draft will be updated depending on the EMSC's decision today on the recommendation to approve GMRC as the Primary Stroke Center on Guam under a separate agenda item. a. In reference to the medical transport for stroke victims: Dr. von Trampe relayed Dr, S. Shay's concern about transport times for possible stroke victims/patients once a diagnosis is determined due to the time sensitivity to prevent further brain damage; therefore, he wanted to ensure that these transports are not delayed by waiting in the queue. C. Muna stated transport for these patients are treated the same for E911 transports without delay; delays are primarily caused by the lack of emergency transport at the time of the requirement. In addition, emergency dispatchers are trained to ask the right questions. If the patient must be accompanied by a nurse and respiratory therapist, then this would also be considered an emergency transport. It is important to ensure EMS personnel are trained. iii. Dr. von Trampe also stated that Dr. Shay is offering refresher training on stroke recognition for emergency personnel. D. Burrier welcomed the offer and suggested that this training count for CEUs for recertification. In addition, the Chair suggested that training could also be open to all paramedics and included in GCCs curriculum. The Chair expressed his appreciation to GMRC. 2. Working with emergency dispatch centers on staging and queue based on saturation levels 3.
