

AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE THREE MILLION FIVE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$3,500,000) FROM 2021 EARNED INCOME TAX CREDIT REIMBURSEMENT AND/OR THE 2021 GENERAL FUND UNAPPROPRIATED REVENUES TO THE GUAM HISTORIC PRESERVATION TRUST FOR THE PURPOSE OF THE REVITALIZATION AND RENOVATION OF THE HISTORIC FRANCISCO Q. SANCHEZ ELEMENTARY SCHOOL UNDER THE JURISDICTION OF THE *HUMÅTAK* MAYOR'S OFFICE.

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2 **Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent.** *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds
3 that in 1953, the people of Guam opened the doors of a new school building for the
4 children of the southern, quaint village of *Humåtak*; and it was designed by world-
5 renowned architect, Richard Neutra of Vienna, Austria-Hungary, who was later
6 naturalized as a U.S. citizen and who, along with his partner Robert E. Alexander,

1 designed the school as a simple two (2)-winged building that flanked an
2 administration section.

3 First named the Magellan School, the school’s name was later changed to
4 *Umatac* School and ultimately, named after its first principal, Francisco Q. Sanchez,
5 who gained great importance on Guam as an educator and political leader.

6 *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* further finds that the F.Q. Sanchez Elementary School
7 in *Humåtak* is listed on the Guam Register of Historic Places; and, in 1998, it was
8 placed on the National Register of Historic Places. Deemed to be of “exceptional
9 importance” as justification for its placement on the National Register despite the
10 fact that it was less than fifty (50) years of age, the justification was focused on the
11 building as the work of Richard Neutra, a giant of mid-century modern architecture.

12 *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* further finds that in June 2011, the Guam Education
13 School Board voted to close F.Q. Sanchez Elementary School, causing its students
14 to move to neighboring schools in *Hågat* or *Malesso'*, and the school was placed
15 under the jurisdiction of the Guam Department of Parks and Recreation.

16 In April 2013, *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* passed Bill No. 5-32 (LS), which was
17 signed into law as Public Law 32-011, placing the former F.Q. Sanchez Elementary
18 School facility under the jurisdiction of the *Humåtak* Mayor’s Office.

19 *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* further finds that the people of *Humåtak* are gravely
20 concerned with the deterioration and neglect of the facility, and the need to revitalize
21 the property as it represents part of their history having served as a common
22 gathering point for many of *Humåtak*’s events.

23 *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* further finds that the people of Guam are slated to
24 receive reimbursements from the U.S. Treasury for the cost of earned income tax
25 credits in 2021.

26 Therefore, it is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to appropriate Three
27 Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$3,500,000) from the 2021 Earned Income

1 Tax Credit program reimbursement and/or the 2021 General Fund unappropriated
2 revenues to the Guam Historic Preservation Trust for the purpose of renovating and
3 revitalizing the historic former F.Q. Sanchez Elementary School in *Humåtak*
4 consistent with Public Law 32-011.

5 **Section 2. Appropriation to the Guam Historic Preservation Trust.** The
6 sum of Three Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$3,500,000) from the
7 revenues received from the earned income tax credit reimbursement for calendar
8 year 2021 pursuant to Section 7530(b) of Chapter 77, Internal Revenue Code of
9 1986, and Section 9625(a) of U.S. Public Law 117-2, the American Rescue Plan Act
10 and/or the 2021 General Fund unappropriated revenues is hereby appropriated to the
11 Guam Historic Preservation Trust for the purpose of renovating and revitalizing the
12 former Francisco Q. Sanchez Elementary School in *Humåtak* consistent with 5
13 GCA, Chapter 40, § 40143, to include using the school facility for a Mayor’s office,
14 a Municipal Planning Council office, a youth center or for recreational youth
15 activities, a senior citizens center, a healthcare facility, and an educational facility.
16 The appropriation in this Section shall not lapse and shall continue to be available
17 until fully expended.

18 **Section 3. Severability.** If any provision of this Act or its application to any
19 person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall
20 not affect other provisions or applications of this Act that can be given effect without
21 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are
22 severable.

23 **Section 4. Effective Date.** This Act shall be effective upon enactment.
