AN ACT TO *AMEND* §§ 15201 AND 15206 OF ARTICLE 2, CHAPTER 15 AND § 6108 OF CHAPTER 6, AND *ADD* A NEW § 3102.1(g) OF CHAPTER 3, ALL OF TITLE 3, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED; AND TO *ADD* A NEW § 3101.3(h) OF ARTICLE 1, CHAPTER 3, TITLE 16, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO ADDRESSING ELECTION-RELATED TIMELINES ASSOCIATED WITH THE PRIMARY ELECTION, NOMINATION PETITIONS, AND VOTER REGISTRATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:
Section 1. § 15201 of Article 2, Chapter 15, Title 3, Guam Code Annotated,
is hereby *amended* to read as follows:
"§ 15201. Primary Date.
The primary shall be conducted at the polling place or places determined by the Election Commission in each district on the first Saturday

of August in every even-numbered year."

Section 2. § 15206 of Article 2, Chapter 15, Title 3, Guam Code Annotated,
 is hereby *amended* to read as follows:

"§ 15206. Time for Filing Nomination Papers; Fees.

Nomination papers shall be filed with the Commission at least ninety
(90) days but not earlier than one hundred sixty (160) days prior to the day for
holding the primary. There shall be deposited with each nomination a fee of
One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) on account of the expenses attending the
holding of the primary, which shall be paid into the Treasury of Guam. Upon
receipt at the office of the Commission of a nomination of a candidate, the
day, hour and minute when it was received shall be endorsed thereon."

Section 3. § 6108 of Chapter 6, Title 3, Guam Code Annotated, is hereby *amended* to read as follows:

"§ 6108. Filing of Nominating Petitions.

Notwithstanding any other provision of law, candidates for I 14 15 Liheslaturan Guåhan, offices of I Maga'låhen/Maga'hågan Guåhan [Governor] and I Sigundo Maga'låhen/Maga'hågan Guåhan [Lieutenant 16 Governor], Washington Representative, Mayor and Vice Mayor, the Public 17 18 Auditor and the Attorney General shall file their nomination petition papers 19 and all other required documents with the Commission no earlier than one 20 hundred sixty (160) days before the primary election, and no later than ninety 21 (90) days before the primary election.

Notwithstanding any other provision of law, candidates for the Guam
Education Board and the Consolidated Commission on Utilities shall file their
declarations of candidacy with the Commission no earlier than one hundred
sixty (160) days before the general election, and no later than ninety (90) days
before the general election.

4	Section 4. A new § 3102.1(g) is hereby <i>added</i> to Chapter 3 of Title 3, Guam				
5	5 Code Annotated, to read as follows:				
6	"(g) An applicant may be registered electronically in accordance with				
7	this Section from the time the registration is open until twenty-one (21) days				
8	prior to an election."				
9	Section 5. A new § 3101.3(h) is hereby <i>added</i> to Article 1 of Chapter 3,				
10	10 Title 16, Guam Code Annotated, to read as follows:				
11	"(h) An applicant may be registered in accordance with this Section				
12	from the time registration is open until twenty-one (21) days prior to an				
13	election."				
14	Section 6. Severability. If any provision of this Act or its application to any				
15	person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall				
16	6 not affect other provisions or applications of this Act that can be given effect without				
17	the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are				
18	severable.				
19	Section 7. Effective Date. This Act shall be effective on January 1, 2023.
