AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE TWENTY-FIVE MILLION DOLLARS (\$25,000,000) FROM THE GENERAL FUND TO THE DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATION FOR THE LOCAL EMPLOYERS' ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (LEAP), AS ESTABLISHED BY EXECUTIVE ORDER 2021-25; AND TO CITE THIS ACT AS THE "LOCAL EMPLOYERS' ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (LEAP) ACT OF 2021."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- 2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds
- 3 that businesses on Guam were adversely impacted by the novel coronavirus disease

1 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic. A study on the impact of COVID-19 on Guam

2 residents and businesses conducted by the University of Guam (UOG) Regional

3 Center for Public Policy cites that private businesses and their contribution to our

4 island economy fell, with revenue performance and business expenses dropping by

sixty-six percent (66%) and eighty-one percent (81%), respectively, between 2017

and 2020. In addition, twenty-five percent (25%) of businesses surveyed in 2020

were temporarily or permanently closed.

I Liheslatura further finds that these adverse impacts were felt more by some economic sectors than others. The same UOG study found that Guam's tourism sector experienced the most difficulty, with businesses in this sector underperforming by thirty-two percent (32%). Within the tourism sector, seven percent (7%) of businesses permanently closed and some businesses resorted to employee furloughs or permanent layoffs.

I Liheslatura further finds that the COVID-19 public health crisis and resulting economic crisis have created a variety of challenges for small businesses on Guam. The island's economic recovery relies upon the capacity of businesses to bounce back, and it is incumbent upon the government to provide critical assistance to businesses adversely impacted by the pandemic, facilitating the urgent deployment of capital and support to help these organizations not just to persevere, but to recover on solid footing.

I Liheslatura further finds that the federal Pandemic Unemployment Assistance (PUA) program ended on September 4, 2021, leaving many of Guam's workers without an employment safety net. In considering an assistance program for businesses on Guam, *I Liheslatura* notes that such a program should ultimately help businesses to re-hire previously furloughed employees or hire new workers from the current unemployment pool.

- Therefore, it is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to appropriate Twenty-
- 2 five Million Dollars (\$25,000,000) to the Department of Administration for the
- 3 Local Employers' Assistance Program (LEAP), as established by Executive Order
- 4 2021-25.
- 5 Section 2. Appropriation. The sum of Twenty-five Million Dollars
- 6 (\$25,000,000) from the General Fund is hereby appropriated to the Department of
- 7 Administration for the Local Employers' Assistance Program (LEAP), as
- 8 established by Executive Order 2021-25, or as amended thereafter.
- 9 Section 3. Reporting.
- 10 (a) The Department of Administration and the Guam Economic
- 11 Development Authority shall submit a report to the Speaker of *I Liheslaturan*
- 12 Guåhan, which shall include the cumulative amount of payments made under the
- 13 Local Employers' Assistance Program (LEAP) and the total administrative costs to
- 14 facilitate the Program.
- 15 (b) Upon ninety (90) days after forgivable loans or grants are allocated
- 16 through the Local Employers' Assistance Program (LEAP), the Guam Economic
- 17 Development Authority shall submit a report to the Speaker of *I Liheslaturan*
- 18 Guåhan, which shall include a listing of organizations or businesses who received a
- 19 forgivable loan or grant, the amount of the loan or grant, the number of jobs retained
- 20 as a result of the loan or grant, and the type of industry of the organization or
- 21 business.
- 22 **Section 4. Effective Date.** This Act shall be effective upon enactment.
