Hafa Adai Madame Speaker,

There is nothing more important to my Administration than protecting our children. I prioritized operations for Child Protective Services early in my term. I also created a new Division of Children's Wellness to expand child care services, and signed a recent measure to license all child placement agencies in Guam. Collectively, these measures work toward a common goal: that every child in Guam may live in a loving, permanent household. Bill No. 239-36, however, does not aid in this effort.

The operative language of Bill No. 239-36 does not impose any requirement on a prospective adoption agency that does not already exist in Guam law. Under existing law, before the Department of Revenue and Taxation ("DRT") can issue a business license to a business subject to Department of Public Health and Social Services ("DPHSS") regulation, that business must provide proof to DRT that DPHSS has approved their license.

Despite the Sponsor touting the support of the DPHSS and the DRT during the bill's deliberation, neither agency has supported this amended version.

Bill No. 239-36 does not improve the adoption process or protect the children of Guam, and it is hereby vetoed.

AN ACT TO ADD A NEW § 76206 TO ARTICLE 2 OF CHAPTER 76, DIVISION 3, TITLE 11, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED; AND TO ADD A NEW § 13510 TO ARTICLE 5 OF CHAPTER 13, TITLE 19, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO BUSINESS LICENSE REQUIREMENTS FOR ENTITIES ENGAGING IN CHILD PLACEMENT SERVICES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that without licensure rules and regulations in place for the operation of independent adoption agencies it is conceivable that any business linked to local or international criminal enterprises, including human trafficking schemes, could position themselves to apply for and successfully obtain a child adoption service business license from the Department of Revenue and Taxation.

It is, therefore, the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to protect against such criminal activity by requiring the Department of Revenue and Taxation to require each applicant, prior to the issuance of a business license and/or establishment of a Gross Receipts Tax or Employer Identification Number, to obtain an endorsement from the Department of Public Health and Social Services to place or arrange for the placement of a child in a proposed adoptive home.

Section 2. A new § 76206 is *added* to Article 2 of Chapter 76, Division 3, Title 11, Guam Code Annotated, to read:

"§ 76206. Businesses Engaged in Child Placement Services.

- (a) An endorsement for operating an adoption service or adoption agency must be obtained by any person, corporation, partnership, voluntary association, or other identifiable group of entities, who engages in the business of placing a child in an adoptive home, to include planning for or assisting in the placement of any child in an adoptive home. Such required endorsement is an applicant's license issued by the Department of Public Health and Social Services under Public Law 36-68.
- (b) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, rule, or regulation, the Department of Revenue and Taxation shall not issue a business license and/or establish a Gross Receipts Tax or Employer Identification Number for an applicant to operate an adoption service or agency without an endorsement from the Department of Public Health and Social Services."
- **Section 3.** A new § 13510 is *added* to Article 5 of Chapter 13, Title 19, Guam Code Annotated, to read:
 - "§ 13510. Business License Endorsement.

A business license endorsement shall not be granted to any person, corporation, partnership, voluntary association, or other identifiable group of entities who engages in the business of placing a child in an adoptive home and who does not comply with applicable laws of this Chapter and duly adopted administrative rules and regulations."

Section 4. Effective Date. This Act shall be effective upon enactment.
