- 3 WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs' benefits and
- 4 healthcare services include, but are not limited, treating illnesses and injuries, short-

1 term and long-term medical care, and dental and vision care; and Veterans Affairs

(VA) healthcare benefits and services help prevent future health problems, improve

their ability to function, and enhance their quality of life; and

WHEREAS, the eligibility to receive VA benefits and healthcare services are granted if you have served in the active military: Army, Air Force, Coast Guard, Marines, Navy, and Space Force, and to include the Korean War and Vietnam War veterans who have served in Vietnam or the Republic of Korea as a member of the Armed Forces at any time during the period beginning on January 9, 1962, and ending on May 7, 1975. Other eligibility includes those who have served after September 7, 1980, or entered active duty after October 16, 1981; or a current or

WHEREAS, on February 9, 2022, the *Independent VA Audit Act* was introduced in the 117th U.S. House of Representatives by Arizona Congressman Paul Gosar as H.R. 6675, which was referred to the Committee on Veterans' Affairs; and

WHEREAS, the *Independent VA Audit Act* directs the U.S. Secretary of Veterans Affairs to seek to enter into an agreement with a non-governmental entity to conduct an audit of the healthcare system of the Department of Veterans Affairs; and

WHEREAS, I Mina'trentai Sais Na Liheslaturan Guåhan (the 36th Guam Legislature) finds that the passage of H.R. 6675 would greatly benefit Guam veterans who seek healthcare services through the Guam Veterans Affairs Office, pursuant to CFR Title 38 of the United States Code for Veterans Benefits, which assists in the establishment of all claims and entitlements; and

WHEREAS, the Guam Veterans Affairs Office (GVAO) continues its efforts to increase veterans access to benefits and services, and they have addressed disabling healthcare issues with the backlog of their clinics. As an advocate, GVAO

1 has focused on striving to earn the trust and confidence of Guam's veterans and their

2 families in a continuing effort in the processing of their claims; and

WHEREAS, I Mina'trentai Sais Na Liheslaturan Guåhan (the 36th Guam Legislature) further finds that the passage of H.R. 6675, the *Independent VA Audit Act*, would alleviate long delays and backlogs to receive appointment availability for hospital care and medical services; and

WHEREAS, veterans using healthcare services at the Department of Veterans Affairs, in both local and state clinics, face potential barriers to their earned benefits and services, particularly healthcare. Several perceptions of healthcare service barriers hinder full access to necessary resources of the VA's benefits and services; and

WHEREAS, the geographical access in which traveling long distances for healthcare services can represent a significant barrier to obtaining needed services. Oftentimes, veterans live far from the nearest VA Medical Center, and the geographical distance between primary and specialty care services delivery also remains a continued concern over providing medical care to patients in sparsely populated areas; and

WHEREAS, the lack of necessary financial resources, such as health insurance, represents one of the many barriers to access much-needed patient care. The presence of copayments and decisions about inclusion or exclusion of priority services and benefits continue to be the issues burdening the patient in receiving the proper patient care and full access to the VA healthcare system; and

WHEREAS, the cultural differences and expectations may also hinder healthcare access. Ethnic or socioeconomic factors contribute to financial and geographical barriers that can arise on the basis of ethnicity, socioeconomic status, gender, and/or age. The delivery of communication styles between the veteran

patient and the healthcare provider can sometimes result in significant difficulties in obtaining the care they need or desire; and

WHEREAS, healthcare services should be geographically available, affordable, and culturally accessible; and the timeliness in receiving necessary healthcare services and other needed resources such as long appointment wait times and available treatment can lead to disruption in patient care, and is another notable barrier and a delay in receiving proper treatment; and therefore, *I Mina'trentai Sais Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* (the 36th Guam Legislature) supports the passage of H.R. 6675, the *Independent VA Audit Act*, which seeks a third-party private auditor to conduct an independent audit of the United States Department of Veterans Affairs, both state and local offices, healthcare system, which would increase transparency and provide the VA an unbiased, thorough plan to address and correct these unsatisfactory delays in obtaining proper and reasonable healthcare services granted to our nation's veterans; now therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that *I Mina'trentai Sais Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* (the 36th Guam Legislature) does hereby, on behalf of the people of Guam, express its utmost support for the passage of H.R. 6675, the "Independent VA Audit Act," which directs the U.S. Secretary of Veterans Affairs to enter into an agreement with a non-governmental entity to conduct an audit of the healthcare system of the Department of Veterans Affairs; and be it further
