AN ACT TO AMEND §§ 53101(d) AND 53102, AND TO ADD A NEW § 53109, ALL OF CHAPTER 53, TITLE 11, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO TRANSFERRING THE AUTHORITY TO IMPLEMENT THE GUAM ABLE SAVINGS PROGRAM FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE AND TAXATION TO THE DEPARTMENT **ADMINISTRATION**, OF AND AUTHORIZING THE GOVERNOR TO IDENTIFY AND **TRANSFER UP TO TWO HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$250,000) FROM THE GENERAL FUND TO IMPLEMENT THE PROGRAM.**

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds that Public Law 34-144, which was enacted on December 12, 2018, established the Guam ABLE Savings Program. The statute, which was authored by former Senator Dennis Rodriguez, Jr. and Senator Joe S. San Agustin, was intended to assist individuals with a disability and their families through a tax-exempt savings 1 program. Unfortunately, due to several hurdles, the Guam "Achieving a Better Life 2 Experience" (ABLE) Act, has yet to be implemented.

3 One of the concerns raised was the appropriate entity to manage this program. Public Law 34-144 identified the Department of Revenue and Taxation (DRT) as 4 the lead agency. However, because one of DRT's objectives is to regulate banking, 5 6 it would be conflicting for the agency to seek proposals for banking services, as 7 required pursuant to Public Law 34-144. Other U.S. states utilize their treasury 8 entities for their ABLE Savings Program; hence, it would only be appropriate to 9 transfer the authority of the Guam program to the Department of Administration.

10 Further, to implement the program, the entity would need some funding for 11 various purposes, inclusive of hiring a Program Manager, and seeking consultants. 12 This Act authorizes I Maga'hågan Guåhan (the Governor of Guam) to identify and 13 transfer up to Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000) from the General 14 Fund to the Department of Administration, which would be a transfer authority 15 above what was afforded in Public Law 36-54 (FY 2022 Budget Act), and this would provide I Maga'hågan Guåhan with some flexibility in identifying the needed 16 monies to get the program initiated. 17

- Section 2. § 53101(d) of Chapter 53, Title 11, Guam Code Annotated, is 18 19 hereby *amended* to read as follows:
- 20 "(d) Director means the Director of the Guam Department of 21 Administration."

Section 3. § 53102 of Chapter 53, Title 11, Guam Code Annotated, is 22 23 hereby *amended* to read as follows:

"§ 53102. Guam ABLE Savings Program; Establishment.

25 The Director shall establish the Guam ABLE Savings Program to 26 provide for or facilitate individual savings accounts that empower individuals 27 with a disability and their families to save private funds to support an

1	individual with a disability. The Program shall be able to accept contributions
2	to ABLE savings accounts opened pursuant to this Chapter, no later than
3	October 1, 2022."
4	Section 4. A new § 53109 is hereby <i>added</i> to Chapter 53, Title 11, Guam
5	Code Annotated, to read as follows:
6	"§ 53109. Authorization to Identify and Transfer Funds for the
7	Implementation of the Guam ABLE Savings Program.
8	Notwithstanding any other provision of law, rule, or regulation to the
9	contrary, I Maga'hågan Guåhan is hereby authorized to identify and transfer
10	up to Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000) from the General Fund
11	to the Department of Administration to assist in the implementation of the
12	Guam ABLE Savings Program pursuant to this Chapter. The funds shall be
13	used for, but are not limited to, the following purposes:
14	(a) engaging the services of consultants to assist in launching
15	the program;
16	(b) engaging and hiring a Program Manager for the purposes
17	of managing the Guam ABLE Savings Program; and
18	(c) to assist with associated start-up fees and overhead.
19	Notwithstanding any other provision of law, rule, or regulation to the
20	contrary, the transfer authority authorized by this Section is in addition to the
21	transfer authority provided under Public Law 36-54."
22	Section 5. Severability. If any provision of this Act or its application to any
23	person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall
24	not affect other provisions or applications of this Act that can be given effect without
25	the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are
26	severable.
27	Section 6. Effective Date. This Act shall be effective upon enactment.
