AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 2(b) OF PUBLIC LAW 34-112, RELATIVE TO PROVIDING A FIVE (5) YEAR EXTENSION TO THE DEADLINE FOR THE GUAM CUSTOMS AND QUARANTINE AGENCY TO DEVELOP A FUNCTIONING CUSTOMS SATELLITE INSPECTION, HOLDING, AND SECURED STERILE FACILITY AREA.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- 2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds
- 3 that Public Law 34-112 granted administrative jurisdiction of a four (4) acre portion
- 4 of Parcel 1-3 in the municipality of Piti to the Guam Customs and Quarantine
- 5 Agency to develop a Customs Satellite Inspection, Holding, and Secured Sterile
- 6 Facility Area; provided, that the agency develops a functioning facility within three
- 7 (3) years, or the property would revert to the government of Guam.
- Public Law 34-112 was enacted into law on July 17, 2018, and since a facility
- 9 is not presently in place and not in the development process, the parcel of property

will revert to the government of Guam in July 2021. A functioning facility would provide many benefits for the island, to include addressing the devastating impacts of invasive species on Guam's economy and ecological system, as well as the drug epidemic adversely impacting many residents. A functioning inspection facility would also be able to house an X-ray Scanning Portal which would scan containers and large bulk cargo for illegal substances; and this process would efficiently reduce the importation of such substances through the seaport.

Therefore, it is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to provide an extension of an additional five (5) years for the agency to develop the facility; and this measure would provide the government of Guam with additional time and opportunities to seek various financing mechanisms to achieve the objectives which Public Law 34-112 set out to accomplish. Between discussions on financing options and attaining the support of a plan, which both *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and *I Maga'hågan Guåhan* would approve, it would take at least one (1) to two (2) years. It will further take another year to develop the facility, considering potential delays in this process. Accordingly, this Act provides a five (5)-year extension to what the law originally provided for under Public Law 34-112.

- **Section 2.** Section 2(b) of Public Law 34-112 is hereby *amended* to read as follows:
 - "(b) If the property is not developed into a functioning Customs Satellite Inspection, Holding, and Secured Sterile Facility Area within (8) eight years from the date of enactment, July 17, 2018, administrative jurisdiction of GCQA shall expire and the property shall revert to the general jurisdiction of the government of Guam."
- **Section 3. Severability.** If any provision of this Act or its application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Act that can be given effect without

- 1 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are
- 2 severable.
- 3 **Section 4. Effective Date.** This Act shall be effective upon enactment.
