Relative to expressing the support of I Mina'trentai Sais na Liheslaturan Guahan for the passage of H.R. 4406, the "Supporting Medicaid in the U.S. Territories Act of 2021" introduced by the Honorable Representative Darren Soto Sablan and the Honorable Representative Gus Bilirakis, which seeks to amend titles XI and XIX of the Social Security Act to provide increased financial support to the territories under the Medicaid program, provide five years of Medicaid funding for Puerto Rico and eight years of funding for other U.S. territories; and for other purposes;

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I MINA'TRENTAL SAIS NA LEHISLATURA GUÂHAN:

WHEREAS, the Medicaid program was established in 1965 pursuant to U.S. Public Law 89-97 and is authorized under Title XIX of the Social Security Act (SSA). The program serves as the largest source of public health insurance in the nation. Mandatory benefits include but are not limited to lab and X-ray services,

inpatient hospital services, home health services, and freestanding birth centers, along with other optional benefits for states and certain territories; and

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WHEREAS, from its establishment, Medicaid worked in service of the elderly and disabled individuals. Since then, it has welcomed steady population growth and now covers a wider demographic. Under the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (ACA, P.L. 111-148, as amended), Medicaid expanded its reach to include a new adult group consisting of low-income adults 65 years and younger, including parents and adults without dependent children; and

WHEREAS, Medicaid expansion programs, such as the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP), provide health coverage for enrolled children through both Medicaid and separate CHIP programs; and

WHEREAS, Medicaid is offered in all U.S. territories, including Guam, American Samoa, the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands (CNMI), the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, and the United States Virgin Islands (USVI). Medicaid was established on Guam in 1975 and is overseen by the Department of Public Health and Social Services (DPHSS). The program operates on a fee-for-service (FFS) basis.

WHEREAS, nearly 21 percent of Guam residents are enrolled in Medicaid, allowing one-fifth of the island's population to stay afloat during the unprecedented effects of the COVID-19 pandemic. While Guam, Puerto Rico, and the U.S. Virgin Islands are required to provide mandatory Medicaid benefits, Guam is the only territory to do so. The optional Medicaid benefits provided by Guam include dental and prescription services; and

WHEREAS, Guam's primary public hospital, Guam Memorial Hospital (GMH), reported that its Medicaid collections for Fiscal Year (FY) 2020 increased to 26,999,457, which is 9.4 million more than the FY 2019 collections set at 17,579,613. The recent FY 2020 appropriations package (P.L. 116-94) and the Families First Coronavirus Response Act (FFCRA, P.L. 116-127) increased Guam's federal Medicaid allotment from \$18.4 million to \$130.9 million. The FY 2021 allotment raised from approximately \$18.8 million to \$129.7 million; and

WHEREAS, an omnibus COVID relief bill signed into law on December, 28, 2020 extended Medicaid services to Compact of Free Association (COFA) citizens. The law serves an estimated 100,000 COFA migrants who live in the 50 U.S. states and District of Columbia, and who meet all Medicaid eligibility rules; and

WHEREAS, the Federal Medical Assistance Percentage (FMAP) for Guam and the territories is statutorily set at 55 percent (§ 1905(b) of the Act), unlike that of the states, where the FMAP is set using a formula based on state per capita income. After the passage of P.L. 116-94, the Further Consolidated Appropriations Act 2020, Guam had a temporary FMAP increase to 83 percent that was available from December 21, 2019 and is set to expire on September 30, 2021. In the fiscal

years succeeding FY 2021, the FMAP will revert back to the federal matching rate of 55 percent and this will impact the people of Guam negatively due to the reduction of federal monies; and

WHEREAS, despite the persisting challenges to our island's medical community, the joint efforts of local and federal entities have done much service to the people of Guam. The continued efforts and support of local and state representatives is crucial to protecting the public's access to Medicaid and healthcare; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Committee on Rules of *I Mina'trentai Sais Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of the people of Guam, stand in support of H.R. Bill 4406, cited as the "Supporting Medicaid in the U.S. Territories Act of 2021," and protecting access to healthcare and federal assistance that ensures the necessary resources for Medicaid programs benefiting the People of Guam and all U.S. Territories for an additional eight years; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Speaker and the Chairperson of the Committee on Rules certify, and the Legislative Secretary attest to, the adoption hereof, and that copies of the same be thereafter transmitted to the U.S. Senate Majority Leader Senator Chuck Schumer, U.S. Senate Minority Leader Senator Mitch McConnell, Speaker of the House Nancy Pelosi, Committee on Energy and Commerce Chairman Congressman Frank Pallone, Jr. Health Subcommittee Chairwoman Congresswoman Anna G. Eshoo, the Honorable Representative Darren Soto Sablan, the Honorable Representative Gus Bilirakis, the Honorable Delegate from Guam Michael F.Q. San Nicolas, the Honorable Delegate from the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands Gregorio Kilili Camacho Sablan; and to the Honorable Lourdes A. Leon Guerrero, I Maga'hågan Guåhan.
