Relative to recognizing the Judiciary of Guam, for the development of the treatment court to provide a comprehensive system of support; and commending them for their advocacy of justice and equality and outstanding service to our island community.

1 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF *I* 2 MINA'TRENTAI SIETTE NA LIHESLATURAN GUÂHAN:

- WHEREAS, Guam joins the Nation in recognizing the month of May 2023 as "National Treatment Court Month":
- WHEREAS, in an effort to address the underlying causes and reasons of criminal behavior and to reduce recidivism rates and improve public safety through the use of judicial oversight, the Judiciary of Guam has developed several therapeutic courts including Adult Drug Court, Juvenile Drug Court, Mental Health Court, Veterans
- 9 Treatment Court and the Guam Adult Re-entry Court; and

- WHEREAS, in its mission, the Judiciary of Guam Adult Drug Court's objective is to hold criminal offenders accountable for their behavior, to decrease criminal activity related to the abuse of alcohol and drugs, and to increase the likelihood of successful rehabilitation through immediate, continuous, and intensive supervision.
- **WHERAS**, through a committed collaborative team approach, they work diligently to aid the client's successful recovery and reintegration into the community as productive, law-abiding citizens; and

WHEREAS, in its mission, the Juvenile Drug Court (JDC) is to reduce substance abuse and criminal behavior among juveniles and empower juveniles and families to support a positive lifestyle by providing strength-based intensive intervention within the juvenile justice system and rehabilitation services tailored to the needs of families and each individual juvenile; and

WHEREAS, the Judiciary's mission for the Veterans Treatment Court (VTC) is to intersect justice-involved veterans and divert them into treatment, judicial monitoring, and supervision so they can once again become productive members of the community, oftentimes, their involvement in the justice system can be linked to their military service and diverting our veterans from prison and into appropriate treatment and services will minimize or prevent the unnecessary criminalization and extended incarceration of our veterans; and

WHEREAS, *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* passed Bill No. 161-32(LS) the "*Justice for Veterans Act of 2013*" known as Public Law No. 32-082 for the establishment of a veteran's treatment court program, and Bill No. 187-34(COR) now Public Law No. 34-81 for the establishment of the Guam Adult Reentry Program; and

WHEREAS, the 2023 *Hustisia* Award was awarded to Guam Behavioral Health and Wellness Center (GBHWC), the Mental Health Court's task of reintegrating these individuals back into society as stable, productive, and law-abiding citizens would not be possible without the work of GBHWC; and

WHEREAS, the objective in the Guam Adult Reentry Court Program is to provide a comprehensive system of support in Guam for prisoners reintegrating with their families and communities after incarceration; and

WHEREAS, Presiding Judge Alberto C. Lamorena III initiated the concept of therapeutic courts in Guam. He established the Adult Drug Court, Family Violence Court, Mental Health Court, and DWI Treatment Court; served as chairman of the task force to create the Veterans Treatment Court; and is developing the Adult Reentry

1 Program for high and medium-risk offenders who are likely to recidivate, the Family

Drug Court for families in need of services, and the Hope Project for defendants with

multiple criminal violations; and

WHEREAS, since 2007, the Judiciary of Guam implemented its Strategic Plan for long-range objectives and goals for our island court system that provides a comprehensive set of organizing concepts that describe what a high-performing court seeks to accomplish, demonstrates how a court's objectives are affected by its managerial culture, identifies measurable categories of performance and suggests approaches on how to assemble and use performance information to ensure its commitment to providing access to justice for all, the core of what the Superior and Supreme Courts of Guam does in service to our community; and

WHEREAS, through the development and implementation of its mission, objectives, and long-range goals in identifying strategic focus areas, reflects the work by the Judiciary of Guam to better understand the performance of Guam's trial and appellate courts and what things can be done to achieve high performance; now therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Committee on Rules of *I Mina'trentai Siette Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of the people of Guam, recognizes the Judiciary of Guam, for the development of the treatment court to provide a comprehensive system of support; and to commend them for their advocacy of justice and equality and outstanding service to our island community; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Speaker and the Chairperson of the Committee on Rules certify, and the Legislative Secretary attest to, the adoption hereof, and that copies of the same be thereafter transmitted to the Judiciary of Guam; and to the Honorable Lourdes A. Leon Guerrero, *I Maga'hågan Guåhan*.
