BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I MINA TRENTAI SIETTE NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

**WHEREAS**, it is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to recognize the life and accomplishments of those distinguished citizens of this great island, and it is the custom of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to commend individuals who have devoted themselves faithfully serving in the best interests of this community and the needs of its residents; and

**WHEREAS**, Dr. Thomas W. Krise, the son and grandson of U.S. Army Medical Service Officers, was born in Fort Sam Houston, Texas, and raised in St. Thomas in the Virgin Islands, which sparked his lifelong interest in the cultures of the Caribbean islands; and

**WHEREAS**, Dr. Krise served for twenty-two (22) years on active duty in the United States Air Force as a Missileer and Public Affairs Officer, retiring at the rank of Lieutenant Colonel in 2005; and

**WHEREAS**, Dr. Krise held various academic positions to include President of Pacific Lutheran University in Tacoma, Washington from 2012 to 2017, where he continues to hold the title of President Emeritus since 2017; he was Dean of the College of the Pacific (Faculty of Arts and Sciences), University of the Pacific in Stockton, California from 2008 to 2012; Chair of the Department of English, University of Central Florida in Orlando Florida from 2005 to 2007; Director, Air Force Humanities Institute from 1997 to 2005; Deputy Head of the Department of English & Fine Arts, U.S. Air Force Academy in Colorado Springs, Colorado from 2002 to 2003; Vice Director of the National Defense University Press and Senior Military Fellow of the Institute for National Strategic Studies in Washington D.C. from 1995 to 1997; Professor of English at the University of Central Florida from 2005 to 2007; University of the Pacific from 2007 to 2012; Pacific Lutheran University from 2012 to 2018; and President of the University of Guam (UOG) from 2018 to 2023; and

**WHEREAS**, on August 6, 2018, Dr. Krise began his appointment as the eleventh (11<sup>th</sup>) UOG President, serving as the chief executive officer responsible for the administration of the academic, business, and services activities of the University; and

**WHEREAS**, in addition to his duties as UOG's eleventh (11<sup>th</sup>) President, Dr. Krise held positions to include Professor of English, Executive Secretary to the Board of Regents, Executive Secretary to the UOG Endowment Foundation Board of Directors, Chair of the Board of Directors for the Research Corporation of UOG, Vice Chair of the Guam Council on Climate Change Preparedness & Resiliency, Co-Chair (with the Governor) of the Guam Green Growth (G3) Initiative, Principal Investigator and Chair of the Pacific Island Council of the Islands of Opportunity Alliance - Louis Stokes Alliances for Minority Participation (AOI-LSAMP), Advisory Board Member of the UOG Press, Governing Board Member of the Pacific Post-Secondary Education Council, and Governing Board Member of the Regional Educational Laboratory (REL) - Pacific; and

**WHEREAS**, Dr. Krise orchestrated the transition of the Good-To-Great Strategic Plan to the *Para Hulo'* Strategic Plan, keeping the strengths of UOG's achievements and reshaping areas of improvements into six (6) strategic initiatives: (1) being recognized as a research university centered around island wisdom; (2) leading as a partner university; (3) enriching the student experience; (4) becoming a model for operations and customer service in Guam and all of Micronesia; (5) growing our financial resources; and (6) building and sustaining our infrastructure; and

**WHEREAS**, Dr. Krise worked diligently with UOG leadership and the Guam Legislature to pass the "21<sup>st</sup> Century Bill" in December 2020, which is now Public Law 35-114, allowing UOG to further define professional and technical personnel, classify student employees, establish the Center for Island Sustainability, repeal the old Guam National Energy Institute, establish the UOG Sea Grant Special Fund, establish representation at the Pacific Regional Environmental Programme, promulgate procurement regulations, and authorize short-term borrowing and long-term leasing and contracting; and

**WHEREAS**, during the public health emergency between March 2020 to January 2023, Dr. Krise ensured UOG's involvement to support the island's critical needs, which included sustained support of the UOG Calvo Field House and personnel support for the central Vaccination Clinic in partnership with the Department of Public Health and Social Services (DPHSS) and the Guam Army National Guard for the island's vaccination initiative; personnel support through the UOG AmeriCorps at the *Tijan* COVID-19 testing site; supported group mass testing for the Homeless Guard of one hundred eighty (180)-volunteer personnel and other groups affected by COVID-19; conducted N95 Fit Testing for the Homeless Coalition and Lighthouse Recovery Center Staff; provided online next step COVID-Ready Caregiver courses in partnership with sixteen (16) organizations impacting six (6) regional islands and over six hundred sixty-eight (668) trained individuals; offered tele-health counseling services for local hospitals and health care agencies; offered COVID-19 tele-education in partnership with three (3) primary care groups, ten (10) community-based organizations, and eight (8) academic institutions on Guam, in the Pacific region, and in California; supported a large *Hagåt* family affected by COVID-19 and in need of clothing, food, and testing; conducted a health clinic and outreach event for residents at the Gill-Baza and "Zero Down" subdivisions who were considered underserved and at-risk communities; accelerated senior class nurses in *Fanonnakan 2020* and created a new temporary Certified Nursing Assistant training program in partnership with DPHSS and the hospitals to boost the island's capacity of nurses; and hosted COVID-19 awareness presentations with the Guam/Micronesia Geriatrics Workforce Enhancement Program; and

**WHEREAS**, during the public health emergency, Dr. Krise also ensured the critical needs of UOG's operations and student/employee safety were met through the development and implementation of the University's Continuity of Operations Plan which provided the framework for continued services for students and other customers while maintaining DPHSS guidelines to include deliberate and careful planning of student support, classes, and community outreach programs; the process instituted at UOG kept internal transmission of the COVID-19 on campus to a minimum while holding mostly online instruction in Academic Year 2020-2021, and at the beginning of the transition back to face-to-face and hybrid instruction for Academic Year 2021-2022; and

**WHEREAS**, Dr. Krise led UOG in celebrating its Seventieth (70<sup>th</sup>) Anniversary Platinum Jubilee in 2022, with the theme of "*University of Guam: 70 Years of Transforming Lives and Advancing Communities*," hosting several key events to include, but not limited to, a virtual Platinum Jubilee Kickoff in October 2021; a Mural Ribbon Cutting Ceremony in November 2021; a Charter Day celebration in March 2022; a Liberation Day Float in partnership with the Guam Community College in July 2022; a Guam Museum Exhibit highlighting the history of UOG and other major milestones including the Fiftieth (50<sup>th</sup>) Year Anniversary as a Land Grant institution, the Fiftieth (50<sup>th</sup>) Year anniversary of the Marine Laboratory, and the Fortieth (40<sup>th</sup>) Year anniversary of the UOG Endowment Foundation; attaining Sea Grant status in July 2022; and culminating in a Platinum Jubilee Finale in December 2022; and

**WHEREAS**, Dr. Krise established two (2) medals: the President's Medal (*Milåyan Presidenten*) and the Distinguished Service Medal (*Milåyan Afamao Gi Setbiso*) during the UOG's Seventieth (70<sup>th</sup>) Year Anniversary in 2022 that recognizes individuals who demonstrate the spirit of the mission of UOG - *Ina, Deskubre, Setbe*, by way of significant service to the communities in which they live; and

**WHEREAS**, in February 2020, Dr. Krise and his wife, Patricia (Patty) Krise made a personal investment in helping UOG students pursue and complete their degrees by donating Eighty-five Thousand Dollars (\$85,000) to the UOG Endowment Foundation as three (3) endowed scholarships: (1) first-generation college students; (2) students who have demonstrated a need to complete their degree programs; and (3) students who will be participating in unpaid internships with nonprofit organizations; and

**WHEREAS**, Dr. Krise established the Advancement Initiative to assess and recommend ways to increase the fundraising capability within UOG; and

**WHEREAS**, Dr. Krise facilitated partnerships through sustainability initiatives under the Guam Green Growth with village Mayors' offices for community gardens and aquaponics systems and support to the Guam Department of Agriculture and the Guam Department of Education (GDOE); he facilitated UOG Press partnerships and contracts with GDOE for local history books, *CHamoru* children's literature series, and partnered with other university presses and regional partners such as the Northern Marianas College and Palau Community College; and he strengthened the Water and Environmental Research Institute (WERI) with the Guam Waterworks Authority (GWA) and other federal agencies to advance the OneGuam initiative to unify fresh water management on Guam; and

11           **WHEREAS**, Dr. Krise promoted the construction of four (4) new critical UOG  
12 facilities, to include the Student Success Center, the School of Engineering, the School  
13 of Health Annex, and the WERI, all of which are expected to start construction in 2023;  
14 and

15           **WHEREAS**, Dr. Krise fostered the expansion and increase of federal research  
16 grants and contracts supporting the growth into the top thirty-two percent (32%) of  
17 public universities in NSF research grant expenditures in 2022; and

18           **WHEREAS**, Dr. Krise supported the improvement of UOG operations through  
19 initiatives such as moving the UOG catalog and graduate bulletin online; he supported  
20 the speed of the webpage allowing for faster access for students and employees; he  
21 implemented the new Customer Relationship Management (CRM) improving UOG’s  
22 ability to track engagement of prospective and current students towards enrollment and  
23 registration; he instituted electronic signatures, which significantly reduced staffing  
24 time for documents to be processed; he initiated the revamp of the University Policy  
25 Manual to be fully online; and he reorganized the Facilities Management & Services  
26 organization to align services for current and future needs; and

1           **WHEREAS**, Dr. Krise supported strengthening military relations, resulting in  
2 UOG being identified as a Military Friendly® School with Bronze and Silver Awards  
3 from 2021 to 2023; he published the first issue of the Leadership Journal of Micronesia  
4 from the UOG ROTC Program and the UOG Press; and he partnered with the Navy’s  
5 Seabees Detachment to renovate the open-air lab facility roof at the Marine Lab; and

6           **WHEREAS**, Dr. Krise supported the articulation of courses for degree programs  
7 with the Guam Community College, the Northern Marianas College, and the Palau  
8 Community College; special accreditations for the SENG, School of Business and  
9 Public Administration, and School of Education; the establishment of Minor and  
10 Certificate programs in Cybersecurity; the establishment of the Peace Corps Program,  
11 an undergraduate certificate program designed to target coursework with hands-on  
12 experience, building the competencies needed for students to become Peace Corps  
13 volunteers or other intercultural fieldworkers; and the establishment of the Certificate  
14 in Island Wisdom: Foundations in Micronesian Seafaring; and

15           **WHEREAS**, Dr. Krise supported the work of the Marketing and  
16 Communications Office resulting in the achievements of several national and  
17 international awards, including the Council for the Advancement of Secondary  
18 Education (CASE) Circle of Excellence Awards, the National Association of  
19 Government Communicators (NAGC) Blue Pencil & Gold Screen Awards, the  
20 Collegiate Advertising Awards, and the Internet Advertising Awards; and

21           **WHEREAS**, as the eleventh (11<sup>th</sup>) UOG President, Dr. Krise made great strides  
22 in reshaping and implementing many facets of the UOG *Para Hulo*’ Strategic Plan in  
23 research, partnership, student experience, customer service, financial resources, and  
24 infrastructure; managing critical support to the community while maintaining safe  
25 operations for students and employees during an unprecedented public health  
26 emergency that spanned over two (2) years and nine (9) months; successfully  
27 celebrating UOG’s Seventieth (70<sup>th</sup>) Year Anniversary through showcasing its history

1 and achievements, and highlighting the University's critical role in the development of  
2 the professional workforce on Guam and the region over the past seventy (70) years,  
3 and the continuity of its mission for the next seventy (70) years; and giving back to the  
4 UOG students through a major endowment scholarship donation of Eighty-five  
5 Thousand Dollars (\$85,000); now therefore, be it

6 **RESOLVED**, that the Committee on Rules of *I Mina'trentai Siette Na*  
7 *Lihselaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of *I Lihselaturan Guåhan* and the people  
8 of Guam, recognize Dr. Thomas W. Krise for his commitment to the island of Guam,  
9 its community, and the Pacific region; and commend him for his service as the Eleventh  
10 (11th) President of the University of Guam; and be it further

11 **RESOLVED**, that the Speaker and the Chairperson of the Committee on Rules  
12 certify, and the Legislative Secretary attest to, the adoption hereof, and that copies of  
13 the same be thereafter transmitted to Dr. Thomas W. Krise; and to the Honorable  
14 Lourdes Leon Guerrero, *I Maga'hågan Guåhan*.
