- 3 WHEREAS, I Liheslaturan Guåhan recognizes that I Maga'hågan Guåhan
- 4 under Public Law 110-229, the Consolidated Natural Resources Act of 2008, has the
- 5 authority to petition the US Department of Homeland Security to expand the Guam-
- 6 CNMI Visa Waiver Program to include the country of the Philippines; and

WHEREAS, I Liheslaturan Guåhan further recognizes that the Philippines was 1 2 not initially included in the original approved countries due to various factors in the 3 Department of Homeland Security's analysis at that time; and WHEREAS, in the approximately fifteen (15) years since, many changes have 4 occurred within the Philippines that warrant reconsideration. The Philippines is now the 5 39th largest economy in the world, with a burgeoning middle class, and with a gross 6 domestic product of \$314 Billion according to recent figures from the World Bank; and 7 WHEREAS, the Philippines, over time has seen significant decreases in the visa 8 9 rejection rates, with the adjusted refusal rate for B-visas being 32.49% in 2020; and WHEREAS, the World Bank also noted that in 2018, the middle class in the 10 Philippines had expanded to nearly 12 million people and the economically secure 11 population had risen to 44 million. Studies also show that 60% of Filipinos aged 15 12 and over have vacationed, with a growing demand for international vacations; and 13 WHEREAS, the Guam economy has been trying to recover from the loss of 14 tourism experienced in the COVID-19 Pandemic which had the island's tourism market 15 go from 1.6 million a year to nearly zero (0) during the start of the pandemic, with the 16 Guam Visitors Bureau recording 216,916 tourists in 2022; now therefore be it 17 RESOLVED, that I Mina'trentai Siette Na Liheslaturan Guåhan does hereby, 18 on behalf of the people of Guam, recognize and support the need for a Guam-CNMI 19 visa waiver for the Philippines to grow our base of tourism, help boost our economic 20 recovery and capture more of the growing tourism market from the Philippines and 21 support the Governor in petitioning the Department of Homeland Security to include 22 them in the Guam visa waiver program; and be it further 23 RESOLVED, that the Speaker certify, and the Legislative Secretary attest to, the 24 adoption hereof, and that copies of the same be thereafter transmitted to the Honorable 25 Alejandro Mayorkas, the Secretary of the United States Department of Homeland 26
