Relative to recognizing Major Dayne Foote for his exceptional service as the Commander of the 36th Security Forces Squadron at Andersen Air Force Base, Guam; and commending him for his support and contributions to the island of Guam.

BE IT RESOLVED THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I MINA'TRENTAI SIETTE NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, Major Dayne Foote served as the Commander of the 36th Security Forces Squadron (SFS) at Andersen Air Force Base (AAFB) Guam from June 2021 through May 2023. He is married to Major Kathryn (Katie) Foote, who is also a member of the United States Air Force; and they have two (2) pets, Olaf and Arrow, that make up their loving family; and

WHEREAS, Major Foote has built a successful career by achieving many milestones. In 2011 he obtained a Bachelor of Science degree in Behavioral Sciences from the United States Air Force Academy; and in 2015, he earned a Master of Arts degree in International Relations from the American Military University. Also in 2015, he was recognized as a Distinguished Graduate at the Squadron Officer School; and in 2020, he completed additional schooling for Air Command and Staff College (Correspondence) at Maxwell Air Force Base in Alabama; and

WHEREAS, Major Foote led four hundred five (405) Security Forces members and the Department of Air Force Police as the Commander of the 36th Security Forces Squadron (SFS), known as the "Arc Light Defenders." The 36th SFS provides world class security for more than seven thousand nine hundred (7,900) military members and their families while upholding impermeable security for multi-national and joint aircraft and executing National and Combatant Command objectives across the Pacific theater; and

WHEREAS, Major Foote's exceptional service and leadership includes many years of experience and dedication to service for all; and he has been stationed in six (6) Major Commands with numerous tours supporting United States Central Command operations. Major Foote began his career as a Security Forces Operations Support Flight Commander with the Air Commandos at Cannon Air Force Base in New Mexico, and he then moved to Inzirlik Air Base in Turkey, where he served as a Flight Commander and OIC of Intelligence and Investigations; and while serving there, he integrated four (4) allied nations and three (3) United States Services Force Protection efforts during an extremely tumultuous timeframe. He then deployed as the Lead Security Forces Advisor and Chief of Security Forces to train, advise, and assist the Command-Air headquartered at Forward Operations Base Oqab, Afghanistan; and

WHEREAS, Major Foote then returned to the United States as the Operations Officer of the 66th Security Forces at Hanscom Air Force Base in Massachusetts, where he provided vital law enforcement and security for more than one hundred (100) General Officer, Senior Executive Service, and Congressional Distinguished Visitors, three (3) Program Executive Officers, and one hundred thousand (100,000) military retirees across the New England area; and

WHEREAS, prior to Major Foote assuming his leadership position at Andersen Air Force Base Guam, his renowned achievements garnered a hard selection to serve as the Chief Security Forces Inspector for the Air Force Global Strike Command where he ensured the maximum level of protection and compliance with the U.S. Department of Defense regulations for two (2) legs of the United States' nuclear triad; and

WHEREAS, Major Foote was not only committed to serving our great nation, but he also led with distinction and went above and beyond to fulfill the mission. He formalized the Jungle Enforcement Team, a unique team in the U.S. Air Force specializing in Air Base Defense in the Jungle/Tropical Environment, which is the only known tactical team in the Air Force. Major Foote worked with local law enforcement agencies such as the Guam Police Department and the Guam Conservation Office to consolidate efforts, and together this collaboration resulted in capturing twelve (12) intruders; and since the inception of the team there has been an estimate of a forty percent (40%) decrease of base incursions; and

WHEREAS, Major Foote has led the deployment of more than three hundred (300) personnel across the Pacific theater to include Singapore, Australia, the Republic of Korea, the Philippines, the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands (CNMI), and Palau - enabling joint and multi-national operations. To ensure longevity of these operations, he worked to establish coordination with the CNMI islands to send qualified personnel from the Command to further collaborate with expertise in advanced investigative techniques, combative skills, and training; and

WHEREAS, Major Foote has been an advocate of Guam's law enforcement agencies and their mission to uphold security and safety. He worked with local law enforcement and authorized teams from the 36th SFS to undergo training called the "Special Enforcement Tactics." This joint training included all of the government of Guam's law enforcement agencies and was led by the Guam Airport Police. He also coordinated training with the Guam Police Department (GPD) SWAT called the "Tactical Tracker Training." In turn, GPD SWAT also trained with SFS personnel which was used in conjunction with the Jungle Enforcement Team; and

WHEREAS, Major Foote's milestones have surpassed beyond the U.S. Air Force's mission and goals. Under Major Foote's leadership he grew the Squadron by one hundred sixty (160) active-duty members whilst also expanding the civilian force as well. As a true leader of the "total force" concept, he is a supporter of civilian employees by recognizing their importance to the unit, and, to ultimately the mission. He approved multiple advance trainings for key civilian positions and made many opportunities accessible for growth and the overall force protection to include: Investigator School, Inspector General Training, Weapons Training Instructor, and Combat Arms School. He has also approved for civilians to attend leadership training for those getting ready to fill the supervisory roles; and his dedication to developing good people, Americans, Airmen, and warriors was specifically recognized by the CSAF, and has made the 36th SFS the ultimate standard; and

WHEREAS, for the U.S. Pacific Air Forces, Major Foote has achieved numerous efforts to provide a strong position for force and security that has resulted in successful deployments, movements of equipment and munitions, as well as establishing joint combat sister operations; and

WHEREAS, being a community partner, Major Foote collaborated with Mayor Rudy Paco from *Mongmong Tota Mate* to help facilitate a flyover for the 2022 Liberation Day Parade. His collaboration garnered the most involved sister squadron/sister village program on the island with more than twenty (20) events integrating more than three hundred fifty (350) Active-Duty Airmen with the local community. A notable event included transporting teens from the village of *Iadibhou* to Andersen Air Force Base to view the flight line for static display of a few planes, a K9 demonstration, and a weapons demonstration; and

WHEREAS, Major Foote also achieved participation in the 2022 "National Police Week"; and this was the first time that the AAFB 36th SFS worked in unison with GPD during the 2022 "National Police Week." In 2022, Major Foote pursued the collaboration of all efforts with local law enforcement agencies to better support the people of Guam; and

WHEREAS, as an avid hunter in his personal life, Major Foote joined Guam's annual event to combat the feral pig population. His expertise with a bow and arrow resulted in close to six thousand three hundred eighty-five (6,385) pounds of meat being donated to local families in need. Not limiting himself to this event he, like several Guam residents, networked with village mayors as to where to hunt and even directly coordinated with landowners to help with their feral pig problems. He not only hunted, but he also cooked what he hunted and shared with the unit. He built many friendships and learned about Guam's hunting grounds throughout the villages of *Mongmong Tota Mate, Iadibhou, Yona, Dededo, Yago, Mangilao, Malabji, Hagat, Santa Rita-Sumai, Chalan Pago-Orsted, and Barrigada*; and

WHEREAS, Major Foote's invaluable service to the Guam community and the rest of the nation makes for a bright future for all of its people. His dedication to helping the guardians of security and safety reflects his love for humankind; and as he makes his way from the island of Guam, its people wish him good luck and Godspeed, now therefore, be it





