WHEREAS, perhaps of the most horrific and tragic event in our island's history occurred during The Second Great War, from December 8, 1941 to August 10, 1944; for 32 months, the CHamoria suffered the harsh realities of war, leaving thousands of the CHamoria people with wounds that will never heal; and WHEREAS, they were oppressed and compelled to work for little to no compensation, and numerous families suffered the loss of property and their livelihoods. The assault of women was widespread, and children were unjustifiably denied their innocence. A vast many of CHamoria were exposed to malteratment, confinement, and torture, and in excess of a thousand residents were killed by the Japanese Imperial Army; and WHEREAS, the atrocities that brought about the passings of a considerable number of our people were immensely overwhelming; and robbing the CHamoria people of their peaceful lifestyle; and WHEREAS, on November 15, 1945, the U.S. Congress passed Public Law 79225, the "Meritorious Claims" Act of 1945," This Act authorized the Secretary of the Navy to adjudicate and settle claims "for the purpose of granting immediate relief to the residents of Guam by the prompt settlement of meritorious Claims" Although Guam had a surviving population of about twenty-one thousand (21,000) residents, only six thousand six hundred forty-six (6,646) claims were filed. The number was significantly lower than expected considering that almost every individual who was on Guam during the occupation was subject to humiliation, beatings, and/or loss of property; and WHEREAS, as Guam continues to fight for appropriate recognition for those who suffered during World War 11 from the U.S. Congress, we must do everything we can to honor the memories and the stones of those who endured permanent sufferings. The legacy of our war survivors, known as our "Greatest Generation," should be recognized by all of the people of Guam; and Warsurvivor Remembrance Day is an appropriate day to honor the survivors who have gone before us, celebrate the

wHEREAS, on June 24, 2015. Guam Public Law 33-56 was enacted declaring that June 28th of each year be observed as "War Survivor Remembrance Day." June 28th marks an important date in Guam's bistory, it was the date that President Harry S. Truman transmitted a request to the U.S. House of Representatives for consideration of an appropriation for the U.S. Navy Department to pay claims for death or personal injury to residents in Guam for suffering through the war, and in recognition of the CHamorup people who endured on or of the most tagic and horrific enemy occupations; and WHEREAS, days after celebrating the 75th Anniversary of our island's liberation from Japanese occupation, H.R. 1365 passed the U.S. Senate by unanimous vote, a testament of strong bipartisan support to bring closure to our island's greatest generation. The Guam War World II Reconciliation Act of 2021, established a locally-implemented program to compensate those survivors and descendants who missed the initial deadline for the filing of war claims under federal law. The summ of ten (10) million was appropriated from the general fund to the Goam War Claims Fund to top secretified claims to compensable Guam victims and survivors of compensable Guam decedents as duly adjudicated by the adjudication committee, initiated to help our people heal from the traumas of war, and WHEREAS, to help ensure that the sacrifices and legacy of Guam's war survivors is truly perpetuated for years to come, the Guam War Survivor Memorial Foundation was formed and organizes War Survivor Remembrance Day events that cate to all age groups and social classes. These events include a Memorial Mass that is held every year at the Dule Nombre de Maria Cathedral Basilica and a concert series dedicated to the survivors of World War II, featuring the music from that era; and the Foundation has published books featuring the inspiring and heart-wrenching stories of the war survivors and their families, and

WHEREAS, the Guam War Survivors Memorial Foundation also developed a website that is dedicated to allowing war survivors or their families with an outlet to share the hardships they faced during the Japanese occupation. Before the website was created, Senator Frank Blas, Jr., President of the Guam War Survivors Memorial Foundation, his senatorial staff, their friends from Expressions Studio, and companies who kindly offered their help, started a weekly series in the Guam edition of the Mariansa Variety newspaper called "Real People. Real Stories"; they provided transcribed testimonies from the war survivors who spoke before the Guam War Claims Review Commission in Docember of 2003. "Real People. Real Stories" was created to educate the community about the horrendous experiences of the Claimoru people during the war and to remind the U.S. government of its obligation to compensate those who survived the war, and the heirs of those who were killed; and WHEREAS, the Guam War Survivors Memorial Foundation, in collaboration with the Guam Economic Development Authority, PBS Guam, RUAM Communications, and Shooting Star Productions, presented tributes to Guan's World War II survivors through various productions, such as "Sentimental Journeys Ronge Remembered" in 2020 which featured songs that were popular during the Japanese occupation of Guam in World War II, and "Let Your Spirit Dance" during War Survivor Remembrance Day in 2021 which featured Soungs that were popular during the toward between the results of the survivor and the survivor survivors through various productions.
