- WHEREAS, Julian J. Aguon is a native son of *Guåhan*, the youngest of four (4)
- 4 children of the late Peter Perez Aguon and social worker, Annabelle Lee Hemsing Cruz,
- 5 a past NASW Lifetime Achievement award recipient.
- WHEREAS, Julian is a talented environmental and social justice defender, one
- 7 who has a gift for advocating for complex and painful issues in the most creative ways
- 8 possible; and
- 9 **WHEREAS**, Julian J. Aguon is an indigenous human rights lawyer who, at age
- twenty-eight (28), founded the law firm, Blue Ocean Law (BOL) an international law
- 11 firm based here on the island of *Guåhan* and specializes in human an indigenous rights,
- self-determination, and environmental justice in the Pacific; and
- 13 **WHEREAS,** Julian also served in the 34th Guam Legislature's legal counsel and
- was the lead litigator and special assistant to the attorney general of Guam in the notable

1 Davis v. Guam case. In October 2018, Julian went before a panel of judges in the Ninth

2 Circuit Court in Honolulu, Hawai'i. In this landmark case, he argued on behalf of the

3 Government of Guam which addressed the question of Chamorro self-determination,

and has been recognized regionally, nationally, and internationally for his tireless work

to liberate indigenous people from colonial rule, defend their sacred sites, and obtain

justice for a range of harms inflicted upon them by outside forces; and

WHEREAS, in 2019, Julian was selected by former President Barack Obama as one of twenty-one (21) emerging leaders to join the Obama Foundation for leadership workshop. Through the workshops, Julian was able to participate in critical discussions with other leaders from sixteen (16) countries and territories from across the Asia Pacific region where he shared about the importance of safeguarding the environment and the rights of vulnerable communities; and

WHEREAS, outside the role as a human rights lawyer, Julian received overwhelming praise from award winning authors such as Alice Walker, who stated, "A powerful, beautiful book. Its fierce love – of the land, ocean, the elders, and the ancestors – warms the heart and moves the spirit," and Naomi Klein, who stated, "The Properties of Perpetual Light is philosophy, poetry, memoir, history, and self-help for humanity. With bottomless love for his people and place. Aguon guides us through a portal to the Pacific, sharing deep insights earned from life on the existential knife's edge" and other notable writers for his books, "The Properties of Perpetual Light," published in 2021, and "No Country for Eight-Spot Butterflies: A Lyric Essay," published in 2022, which featured an introduction by renowned Indian author, Arundhati Roy. In Arundhati Roy's introduction, she notes, "With the annihilation of everything coded into it, Julian Aguon offers the kind of intelligence that has been eroded almost to extinction by another far baser form of intelligence, narrowed, blunted, weaponized, and harnessed wholly in the service of modern capitalism, and its ideas of progress and happiness. There are songs of love here, deeply personal as well as epic and political. They are songs of rage and resistance. Songs of death and redemption."; and

WHEREAS, as a Chamorro author and lawyer, Julian has been able to make known, the complex and rich history of the indigenous people of the Pacific in ways that are accessible and incredibly compelling. Young Chamorros, both here and in the diaspora, have been inspired by Julian's courage. His brilliance has touched the lives of his elders as they watch him continue the fight for land rights and self-determination that began decades ago; and

WHEREAS, Social Workers are always navigating the systems to find ways to bring the people and communities they serve, a sense of hope and justice. In his own way, Julian has gracefully voyaged the islands, the continent, and international spaces to teach others that the people of this island - geographically small, yet abundant in beauty and culture, deserve to live with a sense of hope and strength. Julian, by exposing his own experiences and vulnerabilities, allows others to know that healing from immense and intergenerational grief from unspeakable losses is not only possible, but an inherent right of a people; and

WHEREAS, it is the sense of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* that when individuals of such noble aims and accomplishments that are to the benefit of the people of Guam are brought to its attention, they should be celebrated and recognized throughout the island; now therefore, be it
