WHEREAS, on August 28, 1972, a small group of hoteliers filed Articles of Incorporation with the Department of Revenue & Taxation to establish a new corporation to be known as the Guam Hotel & Restaurant Association (GHRA); and

WHEREAS, in 1974, the six (6) member board representing the Guam Hilton Hotel, the Cliff Hotel, the Guam Dai-Ichi Hotel, The Okura Hotel, the Fujita Guam Tumon Beach Hotel, and the Reef Hotel, amended its by-laws to include restaurants and renamed said corporation the Guam Hotel & Restaurant Association; and

WHEREAS, in 1986, GHRA established the U.S. Department of Labor Apprenticeship Program in Corporation with the Guam Community College; and

WHEREAS, in 1990, the Pacific Hotel & Restaurant Exposition (PHARE) event was created, showcasing products and services that cater to the Hotels & Restaurant Industry; and

WHEREAS, in 1992, GHRA began to host the New Year's Fireworks show for the entertainment of visitors and the local community; and

WHEREAS, in 1995, GHRA began to observe "International Housekeeper's Week" and "International Housekeeper's Day" in the month of September, to celebrate the mission of the GHRA's Executive Housekeeping Committee and its housekeeping employees; and

WHEREAS, in 1996, GHRA began to host the annual GALA, and in 1998, the Association began to host annual events, including the Progressive Dinner, Pastries in Paradise event, Jingle Bell 5k Run and Walk, and Yoka Yoka Scholarship Program whereby hospitality employees from Guam visit Fukuoka, Japan; and

WHEREAS, in 2000, GHRA Safety & Security Committee inaugurated its Crime Against Tumon Tourists Channel Program and the Citizens Watch Bike; and

WHEREAS, in 2003, GHRA began to host the Tourism Cup Championship (formerly known as the Tournament of Champions and Governor's Cup) with proceeds to benefit safety and security programs; and

WHEREAS, in 2007, GHRA led the private sector working group for the Guam Homeland Security/Office of Civil Defense in the Executive Operating Committee (EOC), Response Activity Coordinator (RAC), and Joint Information Center (JIC) during emergencies and the Top Officials Exercise aka TOPOFF 4; and

WHEREAS, in 2007, GHRA became a member of the Guam USO Advisory Council, Anderson Civilian Advisory Council and the Civilian Military Task Force to participate in the military buildup efforts and develop relationships with U.S. armed forces; and

WHEREAS, in 2007, GHRA became a member of the Workforce Investment Agency Board on Guam with the Guam Department of Labor; and

WHEREAS, in 2007, GHRA developed a public service announcement campaign to publicize the value and benefits of the industry to the island as part of its 35th Anniversary; and

WHEREAS, in 2007, GHRA in partnership with the Japan Guam Travel Association (JGTA) by organizing a biannual beautification effort along the beach and roadsides of Tumon Bay; and

WHEREAS, in 2008, GHRA began to host "Taste Guam," an ultimate food and beverage festival, and began a partnership with the International School of Culinary Arts and Hospitality Management in Manila, Philippines; and

WHEREAS, in 2008, GHRA established a memorandum of understanding with the Guam Farmers Co-Op, the Guam Department of Agriculture, and the University of Guam Cooperative Extension Service to work with local farmers to grow products in sufficient numbers that can be used in the industry and promote local produce at the restaurants; and

WHEREAS, in 2008, GHRA began a mentorship program to assist small businesses with the Small Business Development Center and partnered with the Tourism Education Council on developing Tourism Leadership Day providing opportunities for high school students to intern with private sector companies within the tourism industry; and

WHEREAS, in 2009, GHRA became a member of the Department of Public Health and Social Service committee on reviewing the Guam Food Code as well as the Integrated Resource Planning committee for the Guam Power Authority; and

WHEREAS, in 2012, GHRA partnered with the Guam Visitor's Bureau in organizing the "Golden Latte Awards Recognizing Excellence in Tourism," honoring outstanding hospitality employees and companies; and




