WHEREAS, John F. Kennedy High School (JFKHS), originally founded as Tumon Junior-Senior High School, first opened its doors to the public in 1959 as a small school located in the heart of the village of Tamuning and

WHEREAS, the campus originally served students from seventh (7th) grade through twelfth (12th) grade, initially serving an average of two thousand eight hundred (2,800) students; and their first (1th) Senior Class graduated in 1960; and

WHEREAS, in 1964, the Seventh (7th) Guam Legislature passed Bill No. 202, which became Public Law 7-113, that was introduced by Senator J.U. Torres and signed into law by Governor Manuel F.L. Guerrero to formally change the school's name to John F. Kennedy High School as a way to honor President John F. Kennedy for his actions in World War II; and for removing the United States Naval Security Clearance requirement that prevented people from freely traveling to and from Guam, and restrict the development of Guam's tourism inclustry; and

WHEREAS, later that year, Senator George M. Bamba introduced a bill to appropriate Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000) to design and build a statue that would resemble President John F. Kennedy; and it was passed and enacted into law as Public Law 8-74; and

WHEREAS, John F. Kennedy High School has a rich history of academic achievements, such as the notable charter of the National Honor Society in 1962 and the establishment of the Air Force Junior Reserve Officers Training Corps (AFJROTC), which is now one of the longest-running programs since 1970, and has since produced many commendable multipro officers and

WHEREAS, Guam recognizes the importance of tradition and preservation of cultural heritage as it allows our people to connect with their ancestors and history while deepening our sense of unity, belonging, and local pride; and

WHEREAS, John F. Kennedy High School commemorates its proud history by hosting mega reunion events, where generations of John F. Kennedy High School alumni, and their families and friends, gather to reminisce over memories and rekindle friendships while reinvigorating their spirits in appreciation of life; and

WHEREAS, in early 2014, alumni Wesley Sison and Arlene Bretoi had an ambitious idea to organize a reunion that included a diversity of classmates from the Class of 1979; and as their idea further expanded, eventually the classes grew to include the Class of 1975 and the Class of 1978; and

WHEREAS, enlisting help from other JFKHS graduates such as Eddie Cruz, this alumni group committed to hosting a one hundred fifty (150) person reunion event in San Francisco, California, and six (6) weeks before the event, less than fifty (50) tickets were sold; however, within the month, an additional one hundred (100) attendees tickets were reserved, making the event reach a maximum capacity of two hundred (200) attendees; and

WHEREAS, in 2020, the JFKHS Sixtieth (60th) Anniversary celebration to honor their legacy was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic; and

WHEREAS, in 2023, Typhoon Mawar devastated the island of Guam, compelling the Core Committee of the Mega Reunion to reschedule its events to a later date; and

WHEREAS, due to their perseverance, the 2023 Mega Reunion will be celebrated with numerous events, beginning with a Friday Night Mixer at Dusit on July 28, 2023; a Saturday Night Gala at Dusit on July 29, 2023; and lastly, ending the festivities with a Sunday Picnic in Inaliban on July 30, 2023; and

WHEREAS, aside from organizing the reunion, these John F. Kennedy High School alumni also honored their alma mater by commissioning another John F. Kennedy statue to replace the previous statue installed by Public Law 8-74; and

WHEREAS, the new bronze statue proudly stands as a symbol of resiliency and dedication of the previous and future students of John F. Kennedy High School; and

WHEREAS, all funding for the festivities and accomplishments of the JFKI1S Mega Reunion Committee comes from the generosity of friends and alumni of John F.
