Relative to recognizing the Lions Clubs International District 204 on the Thirty-first (31st) Year Anniversary of its Charter; and commending its members for their many years of community and humanitarian services to the people of Guam.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES I MINA'TRENTAI SIETTE NA LIHESLATURAN GUAHAN:

WHEREAS, the Lions Clubs International is the world's largest service club organization with forty-six thousand (46,000) clubs and over one million four hundred thousand (1,400,000) members in over two hundred (200) countries geographically; and

WHEREAS, the Mission Statement of the Lions Clubs International is "to empower volunteers to serve their communities, meet humanitarian needs, encourage peace, and promote international understanding through Lions Clubs"; and its Vision Statement is "to be the global leader in community and humanitarian service"; and

WHEREAS, Francis Lester "Scotty" Moylan introduced the mission, vision, and purpose of Lions organizations to several other businessmen with the intention of forming a Lions Club and the District's charter was approved by the International Associations of Lions Club on July 1, 1949; and

WHEREAS, Lions Clubs International District 204 currently comprises thirty-two (32) clubs in Guam, the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, and the Republic of the Marshall Islands; and

WHEREAS, each of the different clubs has its own signature service programs spread out throughout the communities to serve the needy, such as eye conservation, diabetes awareness, hunger and medical assistance, environmental services, childhood cancer awareness, assistance to the sick and elderly, reading action programs, wheelchair donations, youth projects, and other services;

WHEREAS, on June 29, 2022, the Incoming District Governor, Luisa M. Cabuhat, was installed by Lions Clubs International President Brian Sheehan at the International Convention in Montreal, Canada; and

WHEREAS, during the thirtieth (30th) year anniversary, the district governor inauguration and the cabinet officers and committee chairpersons installation was held on September 24, 2022, at the Grand Ballroom of Dusit Thani Guam Resort with four hundred forty (440) members and guests in attendance, and with the theme of "Parade of Nations"; and

WHEREAS, the District has conducted several leadership trainings, to include: the Club Officers Training and Resources on September 3 and November 11, 2022 to empower new Club Officers to succeed; the Region and Zone Chairpersons Workshop on September 11, 2022; the Region 2 Training for Leo Officers and Club Advisors on October 22, 2022 to drive success in Leo Club operations; the Guiding Lion Certification Training on November 19, 2022 with thirty-one (31) participants to support New Clubs for Global Membership Approach; the Global Membership Approach Training and Roll Out on February 6-20, 2023 on Club L.I.C. Challenge through the Online Learning Center - on February 21, 2023 for District 204 Strategic GMA Workshop and on February 24 for GMA Training and District Roll Out; the District Advisory Q3 Leadership Training on March 9, 2023 focusing on Succession Planning and Club Leadership Development through GMA; the Membership Recruitment and Growth Event Training on March 24, 2023 with goals set in Club GMA, and the recruitment events that will drive success for member growth; the Advance Lions Leadership Institute (ALLI) on March 24-26, 2023 in Bangkok, Thailand with three (3) District 204 graduates, namely FVDG Blanca Imbro, SVDG Roy Adonay, and GLT Vice Chair Lion Annamara Adaza; the Faculty Development Institute (FDI) with two (2) District 204 graduates - PDG Romy Angel and PDG Fely Angel; the Regional Lions Leadership Institute on May 20-21, 2023 with twenty-nine (29) successful participants, conducted by Institute Coordinator PDG Monto Co and Assistant Coordinator and Faculty GLT Romy Villaluna, and following Faculties PDG Romy Angel, Fely Angel, PDG Alfa Alcazaren, and SVDG Roy Adonay; and

WHEREAS, the District, through its Chairperson of Reading Action Program, Lion Dr. Matilda Rivera, with Co-Chair Lion Mae Mendiola, conducted the monthly "Saturday Story Hour" virtually to encourage reading habits among the youth on Guam and throughout the world; and the program is in partnership with the Guam Public Library System and the Guam Council of the International Literacy Association, and it has expanded to include the Department of Education and the *ChLomny* Studies and Special Project Division, as well as the U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary Guam flotilla; and

WHEREAS, the District participated in the GAT New Year Get Together 3.0 for Lion Year 2022-2023, which was presented by ONEAL (Orient Southeast Asian Lions) English Speaking Areas - GAT Team; and it was attended virtually by Lions and Leo Club members from Constitutional Area 5 ONEAL, to Share, Learn, Celebrate, and Enjoy on July 20, 2022; and

WHEREAS, several clubs in the District participated in the 'Kindness Matters Service Award' project initiated by Lions Clubs International, and the winner from the District was the Guam Diamond Lions Club for their environmental projects; and

WHEREAS, the District received a Ten Thousand Dollar (\$10,000) grant from Lions Clubs International Foundation and more than Nineteen Thousand Three Hundred ninety-two Dollars (\$19,392) to assist the victims of Typhoon Mawar that devastated Guam on May 24, 2023; and the funds were used for the drive-thru relief distribution at the *Yigo* Gym, the house-to-house relief distribution in *Yigo, Mataguao*, Never Mind Road in *DeDebo*, and the temporary shelter at Maria Ulloa Elementary School; the donations of water at Saint Dominic's Senior Care Home and the distribution of over two hundred (200) hot meals to the men and women of the Guam Police Department and the Guam National Guard who were maintaining order on the road as power outages persisted in the days after Typhoon Mawar devastated the island leaving traffic signals inoperable island-wide; and

WHEREAS, the District Twinning event between District 204 and District 330C, Japan was held on May 28, 2023, and it was coordinated by Twinning Coordinator PDG Monto Co of D204 and PCC Neijiro Morikawa of D330C, Japan, with the mutual agreement signed by District Governor Luisa M. Cabuhat of District 204 and District Governor Hironuma Numata of D330C, Japan. Several members of the District participated in the Mobile Health Clinic launching and Health Fair at the *Malaboc* Crab Festival in conjunction with the *Malaboc* Mayor's Office, the Department of Public Health and Social Services, the Guam Behavioral Health and Wellness Center and the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority on April 30, 2023; and

WHEREAS, District 204 supported the Guam Special Olympics which was held on April 1, 2023, at *Okeada* High School by serving water and one thousand (1000) hot dog sandwiches; and donating twenty (20) cases of water during their bowling tournament held on June 24, 2023; and

WHEREAS, the District successfully conducted its Annual Health Fair through its Chairperson SVDG Lion Roy Adonay at the Micronesia Mall Center Court on March 4, 2023, for Region 1 Guam to raise the level of consciousness regarding health matters, the importance of engaging in preventive health, following good diets and exercising regularly. Healthcare volunteers administered flu shots, measles, mumps, and COVID vaccinations; and they assisted in the health screening for diabetes tests, glucose/sugar, blood pressure, cholesterol, body mass index, and body weight tests; and Region 2 Saipan conducted its health fair on April 23, 2023, which was held at the Saipan Marianas High School; and

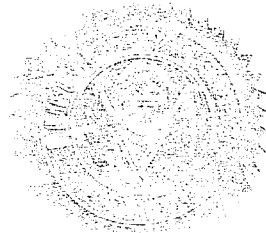

7 Mass (Simbang Gabi); they donated school supplies to different elementary and middle
8 schools; they assisted cancer patients with medical expenses; they conducted coin
9 drives to help those affected by Typhoon Mawar in Guam and Rota; they renovated and
10 beautified the Lion Monument at the Kagman Intersection; and they built new concrete
11 bus shelters for the public school system students; and

12 **WHEREAS**, the District, through its Chairperson of the Hunger Committee,
13 Lion Maritess Sotto, and with the participation of the following Clubs, the Guam
14 Diamond Lions Club, the Guahan Ayudante Lions Club, the Guam Harmony Lions
15 Club, the Guahan Isan Famaguon Lions Club, the Guam Platinum Lions Club, the
16 Dededo La Familia Lions Club, and the Guam Tiffany Lions Club, volunteered for the
17 Red Kettle Bell Ringing from December 10-16, 2023 at the Micronesia Mall, and the
18 Ross Store Entrance to help the homeless and the needy in our community; and Lions
19 Clubs International District 204 helped to raise a total of One Thousand Four Hundred
20 Seventy-eight Dollars (\$1,478); and

21 **WHEREAS**, the District 204, through its Chairperson of Legacy Project 2nd
22 Vice District Governor Lion Roy Adonay and Co-Chairpersons PDG Monito Co and
23 PDG Herbie Perez remarkably and successfully launched and completed the District
24 Governor Loisa Cabuhat Legacy Project for Lion Year 2022-2023, the Rehabilitation
25 of the Sampaguita Pavilion, which was worth Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$70,000) and
26 is located at the Governor Joseph Flores Park at Ypao Beach in Tumon that has served

7 contributed Fifty-eight Thousand Dollars (\$58,000) to Lions Clubs International

9 with total service reporting of eighty-seven percent (87%) to be eligible for the service
10 award and inspire others to join the Lions Club; and finally, the District 204 tax exempt
11 status was re-instated after it was canceled for Failure to File Annual Return and Form
12 990 for Fiscal Year ending 2016-2022; and
