1 BE IT RESOLVED BY I MINA 'TRENTAL SIETTE NA LIHESLATURAN

2 GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, the nation that is built on the spirit of patriotism and unity sadly
denies equal political rights to the residents of Washington, D.C. and Guam in the U.S.
Congress. Both of our congressional delegates do not have a vote on the final passage
of legislation, and unlike Washington, D.C., Guam has no votes in the Electoral
College; and the residents of both Washington, D.C. and Guam lack many fundamental

rights afforded to citizens of the fifty (50) states, including full Congressional
 representation; and

WHEREAS, the residents of Guam and Washington, D.C. have served in past wars and have contributed dearly with their lives in making this nation strong, but are still unrepresented and denied citizenship equality; and are deprived of their own star in that sacred flag we hold so dearly; and

7 WHEREAS, no other nation in the world denies the right to self-governance, 8 including the lack of participation and access in the practice of our political rights in the 9 United States Congress by the Framers of the Constitution of the United States, and this represents serious breaches of universal and human rights, violating Article 2 of the 10 United Nations Universal Declaration of Human Rights that "no distinction shall be 11 12 made on the basis of the political, jurisdictional or international status of the country or territory to which a person belongs, whether it be independent, trust, non-self-13 14 governing or under any other limitation of sovereignty;" and

WHEREAS, unlike Guam, the residents of Washington, D.C. pay more in total federal income tax than residents of twenty-two (22) other states but have no say over how those tax dollars are spent; and

WHEREAS, although the people of Guam have yet to decide on a political
status, Washington, D.C. residents affirmed their desire to become a state, and eightysix percent (86%) of its voters supported Statehood in a publicly-sponsored plebiscite
in 2016; and

WHEREAS, Washington, D.C. residents continue to express their support for
 Statehood by voting to elect non-voting shadow Congressional U.S. Senators and
 Representatives in publicly-sponsored elections; and

WHEREAS, Guam and Washington D.C. both function and perform all of the
 duties that are assigned to states, such as administration, health and public services; and

also has active duty service members in the region, as we exist in a so-called democracy
 where our voices are oppressed; however, Guam is not alone in the fight to be heard;
 now therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that in recognizing the history of our nation's foundation on the principle of the rights of all people to self-government, *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* (the Guam Legislature), on behalf of the people of Guam, does hereby support admitting Washington, D.C. into the Union as a state of the United States of America to govern themselves without congressional interference; and call upon the United States Congress and the American people to make Washington, D.C. the fifty-first (51st) state of the United States of America; and be it further

11 **RESOLVED**, that the Speaker certify, and the Legislative Secretary attest to, the 12 adoption hereof, and that copies of the same be thereafter transmitted to the Honorable 13 James C.
