Relative to expressing the support of the people of Guam for the Republic of the Philippines' legitimate and historical claim to the West Philippine Sea, reaffirming the crucial role of International Law, and acknowledging the invaluable ties and common history between Guam and the Philippines.

1 BE IT RESOLVED BY I MINA'TRENTAL SIETTE NA LIHESLATURAN

- 3 WHEREAS, the West Philippine Sea, a semi-enclosed sea located in the
- 4 southwestern part of the South China Sea, holds tremendous strategic, economic, and
- 5 environmental significance, not just for its surrounding nations, but for the international
- 6 community; and

WHEREAS, the Republic of the Philippines, based on its historical records, archaeological evidence, and legal instruments, possesses enduring claims over territories and maritime zones within the West Philippine Sea, notably the Spratly Islands, Scarborough Shoal, and their adjacent waters; and

WHEREAS, the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea (UNCLOS), to which both the Republic of the Philippines and the United States of America are signatories, establishes the legal framework that delineates the rights and responsibilities of nations in their use of the world's oceans, emphasizing the principle of freedom of navigation, overflight, and the peaceful use of the seas; and

WHEREAS, in 2016, the Permanent Court of Arbitration in The Hague, acknowledging the principles set by UNCLOS, ruled overwhelmingly in favor of the Philippines, declaring that China's expansive "nine-dash line" claim over the South China Sea has no legal basis and confirmed the Philippines' sovereign rights over its exclusive economic zone and continental shelf in the West Philippine Sea; and

WHEREAS, regional stability in the Pacific and the broader international community is contingent upon the respect for, and adherence to, international law, including the resolution of territorial and maritime disputes through peaceful means, without resorting to threat or use of force whereby the attempt to seize the West Philippine Sea from the Philippines is an act of maritime colonialism; and

WHEREAS, Guam is deeply concerned by the increasing environmental degradation in one of the world's most biodiverse marine ecosystems, where dredging and construction activities have led to the direct loss of over three thousand (3,000) acres of coral reefs, endangering species dependent on these habitats and affecting fishery resources. Dredging has increased water turbidity, threatening marine life by

1 blocking sunlight, affecting photosynthesis in marine plants, and potentially harming

2 fish larvae and other marine organisms; and

WHEREAS, the unique geographical position of Guam underscores the importance of cultivating and nurturing harmonious relations with its neighboring nations and territories in the Pacific, advocating for peaceful resolutions and mutual understanding; and

WHEREAS, a multitude of shared experiences, from trade, education, healthcare, cultural exchanges, and familial ties, have fostered an environment of mutual respect, trust, and camaraderie between Guam and the Philippines; and

WHEREAS, I Liheslaturan Guåhan (the Guam Legislature) stands firmly in support of the Republic of the Philippines in its rightful and historic claim to the West Philippine Sea as affirmed by the Permanent Court of Arbitration in The Hague, and emphasizes the paramount importance of upholding international law; now therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that *I Mina'trentai Siette Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of the people of Guam, express the support of the people of Guam for the Republic of the Philippines' legitimate and historical claim to the West Philippine Sea, reaffirm the crucial role of International Law, and acknowledge the invaluable ties and common history between Guam and the Philippines; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Speaker certify, and the Legislative Secretary attest to, the adoption hereof, and that copies of the same be thereafter transmitted to His Excellency Ferdinand "Bongbong" Romualdez Marcos Jr., President of the Republic of the Philippines; His Excellency Jose Manuel "Babe" del Gallego Romualdez, Philippine Ambassador to the United States; the Honorable Enrique A. Manalo, Secretary of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of the Philippines; the Honorable Patrick John U.
