WHEREAS, with its commitment to improve and meet the needs of their guests, the Guam Reef & Olive Spa Resort saw many renovations and updates throughout the years. In the 1980s, La Sirena becomes Century XXI Disco, Sango moves to the Lobby, and the Top of the Reef becomes a fine dining Sky Restaurant.
