Relative to honoring the life and legacy of †Toni "Malia" Ramirez for her lifelong dedication and extraordinary contributions to preserving *CHamoru* heritage, her profound impact as a cultural advocate, and her dedicated service to the people of Guam as a historian, genealogist, and cultural practitioner.

## BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I MINA'TRENTAI SIETTE NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, I Liheslaturan Guåhan seeks to honor and respect those distinguished individuals who have selflessly devoted their lives to serving and uplifting our island community, faithfully preserving our shared heritage, and fostering the well-being of our people; and

WHEREAS, among such devoted citizens was †Toni "Malia" Ramirez, born into a family with a deep commitment to Guam's community and cultural heritage. As one of ten (10) children of the late former Speaker †Florencio Torres "Larry" Ramirez Jr. and †Josephine Sablan Leon Guerrero Ramirez, familian "*Te*" and "*Binu*," *Saina* Malia grew up with siblings Virginia Teresita (1939), Juan Pablo (1940), Florencio (1942), Jose Antonio (1943), Naomi Maria (1945), Jesus (1948), Josephine Barbara (1948), Elizabeth Ann (1949), and Jessica Linda (1958). This upbringing within such an esteemed family instilled in her a profound sense of duty to cultural preservation and

public service, leading her to a life dedicated to honoring the traditions, values, and resilience of the *CHamoru* people; and

**WHEREAS,** *Saina* Malia's family has long contributed to Guam's public life, with her father's legacy in the Guam Legislature and her extended family's ownership of historic land known as *Håtdin* ~ Garden, located near the Guam Museum and the Guam Congress Building in *Hagåtña*. The land was inherited by her grandmother †Joaquina de Torres Sablan after World War II, following the acquisition of ownership from the Naval Government and subsequently the Government of Guam, symbolizing a vital connection to Guam's heritage and resilience in the face of historical challenges; and

WHEREAS, Saina Malia has made significant contributions to preserving and sharing CHamoru heritage through her work in genealogy, oral history, and cultural preservation. She began her research in the 1960s, conducting interviews with Manåmko' (CHamoru elders) to collect oral histories and genealogical data. Her work has been instrumental in documenting and sharing the history of the CHamoru people, particularly through publications and her involvement in initiatives like the "My History is Guam's History" program, which helped focus attention on family history within the community; and

WHEREAS, Saina Malia has also contributed to Guampedia, where her research has helped enrich the island's understanding of its cultural and familial roots. Her work is especially valued in the context of genealogical studies in Guam, where historical records were lost or destroyed during significant events like World War II. As part of her dedication to preserving CHamoru culture, her efforts in genealogy have been key in advancing local knowledge of ancestral connections; and

WHEREAS, Saina Malia dedicated over three decades to the Government of Guam, including twenty-three (23) years with the Department of Parks and Recreation, where she used her expertise in history and genealogy to preserve and document

significant aspects of *CHamoru* cultural heritage, often working to identify and protect

2 Guam's historical sites and to share the rich narratives of *CHamoru* ancestry; and

WHEREAS, Saina Malia actively participated in numerous cultural and educational organizations bringing her extensive expertise as a recognized historian of CHamoru culture, her specialization in CHamoru genealogy, and her fluency in the CHamoru language to this important role. Through her service, Saina Malia contributed invaluable cultural insights, helped preserve CHamoru heritage, and promoted initiatives that fostered greater understanding and appreciation of CHamoru traditions within the organization and the broader community; and

**WHEREAS,** *Saina* Malia authored significant works that captured the wisdom, values, and cultural depth of her people, including a collection of *CHamoru* proverbs that preserved traditional insights and a personal exploration of her genealogical journey; and

WHEREAS, as a respected and published historian of Guam's past, *Saina* Malia was frequently sought after for her unparalleled knowledge and expertise in validating cultural truths, historical interpretations, and linguistic practices connected to *CHamoru* culture, locations, and customs, making invaluable contributions to the preservation and authenticity of Guam's historical record; and

**WHEREAS,** *Saina* Malia served as a cultural advisor and *CHamoru* language expert on "*Maisa* ~ The Chamorro Girl who Saves *Guåhan*," a widely celebrated animated film. She shared a special chant she recorded at *Pago* Bay, Guam, which opened the film and evoked the power of Guam's natural landscapes and the resilience of the *CHamoru* spirit; and

WHEREAS, Saina Malia's latest cultural work included her participation in the 30-minute film *Promesa*, which depicted the cultural significance of the *CHamoru novena* or devotional praying, portraying how these practices foster deep-rooted spiritual and community connections; and

WHEREAS, Saina Malia has played an instrumental role in representing Guam at multiple Festivals of the Pacific Arts (FestPac), where her expertise in CHamoru

1 heritage and history was highly valued. Notably, she contributed to the 2016 FestPac,

2 where she helped host a workshop titled "Memorializing Our Family Roots"~

3 "Manmemorialisa i Hinenggen i Familian-ta." This event focused on genealogical

4 preservation and cultural heritage, emphasizing the importance of *CHamoru* family

5 history and lineage. In addition to her workshop, *Saina* Malia's broader participation at

FestPac events has consistently enriched Guam's representation by providing an

authentic voice on Guam's cultural and historical narratives; and

WHEREAS, her role in performing traditional *CHamoru* dedications and rituals at sites of ancestral significance, including her dedication at the *Sabånan Fadang* burial site, emphasized the sacred connection between the *CHamoru* people and their lands, and her efforts helped to protect and honor these cultural sites for future generations; and

WHEREAS, Saina Malia was a valued mentor and cultural leader who guided the younger generation in understanding and appreciating their heritage, serving as a cornerstone in the community's efforts to preserve and celebrate CHamoru identity in the face of modern challenges, while her work has profoundly enriched the island's collective understanding of its history and people; and

WHEREAS, Saina Malia's work included the creation of educational programs, preservation initiatives, and countless public presentations, through which she disseminated vital knowledge of CHamoru culture, history, and language to the broader community. Her commitment ensured that traditional practices and ancestral stories were passed on, enriching the lives of future generations she will be remembered and embedded in Guam's history as a guardian of CHamoru heritage; now therefore, be it

**RESOLVED,** that the Committee on Rules of *I Mina'trentai Siette Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of the people of Guam honor the life and legacy of †Toni "Malia" Ramirez for her lifelong dedication and extraordinary contributions to preserving *CHamoru* heritage, her profound impact as a cultural
