AN ACT TO ADD A NEW § 34.91 TO CHAPTER 34, TITLE 9, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO MAKING DESTRUCTION OF PUBLIC PROPERTY DURING PUBLIC EMERGENCIES A FELONY.

## 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- Section 1. A new § 34.91 is hereby added to Chapter 34, Title 9, Guam
- 3 Code Annotated, to read as follows:
- 4 "§ 34.91. Destruction of Public Property During Public Emergencies:
- 5 Penalty.

- 6 (a) A person commits a third degree felony if, he, without the written
  7 permission of the owner or of the owner's agent or of the person in lawful
  8 possession, intentionally tears down, damages, mutilates or destroys any
  9 property or equipment owned by the government of Guam during times of
  10 public emergencies and up to ninety (90) days after a public emergency."
  - **Section 2. Severability.** If any provision of this Act or its application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or inorganic, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Act that can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are severable.
