AN ACT TO ADD NEW CHAPTERS 10 AND 11 TO **DIVISION 1 OF TITLE 11, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED;** AND *ADD* A NEW CHAPTER 98 TO DIVISION 4 OF TITLE 10, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO **ELECTRONIC ESTABLISHING** AN **NICOTINE** DELIVERY SYSTEMS (ENDS) PRODUCT TAX AND LICENSING, WHICH SHALL BE CITED AS THE "ENDS EXCISE ACT OF 2024"; AND ESTABLISHING A DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE **AND TAXATION** REVOLVING FUND AND A GUAM **MEMORIAL** HOSPITAL AUTHORITY REVOLVING FUND.

#### 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- 2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds
- 3 that in 2018, the price of cigarettes was Fifteen Dollars (\$15.00) per one hundred
- 4 (100) cigarettes, and was increased to Four Dollars (\$4.00) per twenty (20)
- 5 cigarettes. In the course of six (6) years, the tax on cigarettes alone has increased
- 6 approximately thirty-three percent (33%). I Liheslaturan Guåhan notes that

#### 1 § 10102. **Definitions.** Unless the context otherwise requires, the definitions set forth herein 2 3 shall govern the construction and interpretation of this Chapter. 4 Bona fide importer/exporter shall mean one having no (a) predisposition otherwise in having possession of such imported or 5 exported ENDS product. 6 7 (b) *Class* shall mean either a retail or wholesale license. 8 *Director* shall mean the Director of Revenue and Taxation. (c) 9 *Distribute/distribution* shall mean: (d) 10 **(1)** to give, deliver, sample, or sell; 11 (2) to offer to give, deliver, sample, or sell; or 12 (3) to cause or hire another person to give, deliver, 13 sample, or sell or offer to give, deliver, sample, or sell. 14 Electronic Nicotine Delivery System (ENDS) shall mean a 15 non-combustible product that may contain nicotine and that uses a 16 heating element, power source, electronic circuit, or other electronic, chemical, or mechanical means, regardless of shape or size, to produce 17 vapor from a solution or other substance. The term includes an 18 19 electronic cigarette, electronic cigar, electronic cigarillo, electronic 20 pipe, or similar product or device and a vapor cartridge or other 21 container that may contain nicotine in a solution or other form that is intended to be used with, or in an electronic cigarette, electronic cigar, 22 electronic cigarillo, electronic pipe, or similar product or device. 23 ENDS includes synthetic nicotine and synthetic 24 **(1)** 25 nicotine products. 26 (2) The term does not include a product regulated as a

drug or device by the United States Food and Drug

1	Administration under Chapter V of the Federal Food, Drug, and
2	Cosmetic Act.
3	(3) The term does not include cannabis products
4	regulated by the Guam Cannabis Industry Act of 2019.
5	(f) E-liquid shall mean the solution, substance, or other
6	material used in or with a tobacco substitute that is heated or otherwise
7	acted upon to produce an aerosol, vapor, or other emission to be inhaled
8	or otherwise absorbed by the user, regardless of whether the solution,
9	substance, or other material contains nicotine. The term does not
10	include cannabis and cannabis products that are regulated pursuant to
11	the Guam Cannabis Industry Act of 2019.
12	(g) Give shall mean to transfer the possession and ownership
13	of property to another, especially by an act of the owner rather than by
14	inheritance.
15	(h) License shall mean a retail license or wholesale license for
16	sales of ENDS products, as defined under this Section.
17	(i) Minor, for the purposes of this Chapter, shall mean any
18	person under twenty-one (21) years of age.
19	(j) Person shall mean any individual, company, corporation,
20	firm, partnership, organization, estate, trust, limited liability company,
21	limited liability partnership, or other legal entity.
22	(k) Retail shall mean the sale of tangible personal property for
23	consumption or use by the purchaser and not for resale.
24	(l) Retail license shall mean a license issued by the Director
25	of Revenue and Taxation for the retail sale of ENDS products.
26	(m) Wholesale shall mean the importation into or purchase in
27	Guam from a manufacturer or other wholesale license of tangible

- (c) It shall be a violation of this Chapter for any person to sell ENDS products through a vending machine.
- (d) It shall be a violation of this Chapter for any person who is directly or indirectly engaged in the business of manufacturing ENDS products to retail ENDS products, directly or indirectly, or hold a retail or wholesale license. It shall not be a violation of this Chapter for any such person engaged in the business of manufacturing ENDS products to sell to a duly licensed ENDS wholesaler.

#### § 10202. Classes and Fees.

The Director is authorized to issue the following classes of licenses at the following fees, which shall be paid by the applicant at the time of application:

- (a) Annual Retail ENDS License: \$500.00
- (b) Annual Wholesale ENDS License: \$2,000.00

#### § 10203. Authorization for Establishment of License Fees.

The Department of Revenue and Taxation is authorized to create a new fee schedule for the purposes of this Chapter every three (3) years, not to exceed a five percent (5%) increase.

## § 10204. Term.

Licenses shall be valid for one (1) year following the date of issuance.

# § 10205. Renewal.

(a) A licensee may renew his or her license at the expiration thereof by the payment of the annual license fee set forth in this Chapter and by filing a renewal application. A licensee who fails to renew his or her license within ninety (90) days following the expiration of the license shall be assessed a late fee of One Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$150.00) and a penalty of Five Dollars (\$5.00) per each calendar day he or she is delinquent, which penalty shall

become part of the renewal fee, and his or her license shall be automatically suspended, until all payments for annual fee, late fee, and the daily penalties are paid in full, in which case the license may be reinstated by the Director immediately. Unless the license is reinstated, it is automatically revoked, and the Director shall not issue a license except upon a new application. Any licensee who fails to renew his or her license shall be required to discontinue sales of ENDS products.

(b) Additionally, any licensee who fails to renew his or her license within ninety (90) days and continues operation of business shall constitute a refusal and failure to obtain a license under the provisions of Division 3. The licensee shall be subject to an injunction issued by the Superior Court of Guam and to prosecution pursuant to § 70119 of Chapter 70, Title 11, Guam Code Annotated.

## § 10206. Multiple.

A person applying for a retail license to operate more than one (1) premise shall obtain a separate retail license for each premise and shall pay the fee for each premise.

## § 10207. License: Privilege: Limitation.

A licensee is limited to the privileges conferred by the license and is not authorized to exercise any other privileges.

## § 10208. Limitation.

A licensee is limited to the premises for which the license is issued and is not authorized to exercise the privileges conferred by the license at other premises.

## § 10209. Display of License.

(a) A licensee for sales of ENDS products shall prominently display

## § 10304. Prior Revocation.

Except in the case of a license revoked for non-payment of a renewal fee, the Director shall not issue a license of any class to any person who has held a license of any class which was revoked within a five (5)-year period prior to the date of the application.

#### § 10305. Unfit Person.

A license shall not be issued or renewed of any class within this Chapter should the Director deem the applicant to be ineligible or the premise does not comply, based on the provisions of this Chapter.

## § 10306. Application.

- (a) An applicant for a license shall submit a written application, which shall specify types of ENDS products to be sold or distributed, to the Director, verified under oath and accompanied by the license fee.
- (b) Upon receipt of an application for a license and the license fee, the Director shall determine whether the applicant is eligible, and the premises comply based on the provisions of this Chapter.

## § 10307. Penalties for Selling ENDS Products Without a License.

In addition to any other penalties and fines that may be levied, including those under § 10403 and § 10404 of this Chapter and § 70120 of this Title, any person who violates § 10201 of this Chapter shall be guilty of a misdemeanor as set forth in § 70119 of this Title, and punished, notwithstanding § 80.50(c) of Article 3, Chapter 80, Title 9, Guam Code Annotated, as follows:

- (a) in the case of a first violation, by a fine of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00);
- (b) in the case of a second violation, by a fine of Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00);

14	(2) The sale of ENDS products to any person under twenty
15	one (21) years of age, or its possession by such person, is prohibited
16	and shall be regulated and enforced pursuant to this Chapter.
17	(b) A licensee or an employer may distribute ENDS products to an
18	employee who handles ENDS products in the course of the commercia
19	distribution or sale of said products.
20	(c) In any proceeding for the suspension or revocation of an
21	license, and based upon a violation of this Section, proof that the defendar
22	licensee or his or her agent or employee demanded and was shown a
23	identification card before furnishing any ENDS product to any person under

25	§ 10403. Penalties for Selling ENDS Products to Persons Unde

1 In addition to any other penalties and fines that may be levied, (a) any person who violates § 10402 of this Chapter shall be penalized as follows: 2 3 in the case of a first violation, the person shall be fined (1) Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00) and the license shall be suspended 4 5 for ninety (90) days; 6 in the case of a second violation, the person shall be fined (2) 7 Four Thousand Dollars (\$4,000.00) and the license shall be suspended 8 for one hundred eighty (180) days; in the case of three (3) or more violations, the person shall 9 (3) 10 be fined not less than Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) and not more than Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00), the license shall be 11 12 revoked, and the licensee shall be ineligible to apply for a new license 13 for ten (10) years after the effective date of revocation. 14 Failure to pay a fine levied under this Section within thirty (30) 15 days of the date the fine becomes effective shall result in continued suspension of the license until such fines are paid. 16 During any suspension or revocation of a license under this 17 (c) 18 Section, the licensee shall not sell ENDS products and shall remove all ENDS products from all areas covered by the suspended or revoked license. In 19 20 addition, any new application for a license to sell ENDS products while a 21 licensee is suspended under this Section shall be denied. 22 All ENDS products sold over the counter shall be displayed and (d) located where they shall be inaccessible to persons under twenty-one (21) 23 years of age. Any vendor who violates this provision shall pay a penalty of 24 One Thousand Dollars (\$1000.00). 25 **Prohibition of the Distribution of ENDS Products to Persons**

**§ 10404.** 

**Under Twenty-one (21) Years of Age and Penalties.** 

(a) No person twenty-one (21) years of age or older shall distribute, nor knowingly give or otherwise make available any ENDS product to a minor. A person violates this Section who gives or otherwise makes available an ENDS product to a person under the age of twenty-one (21) with the knowledge that the person to whom the ENDS product is made available.

- (b) A person violates this Section who owns, occupies, or controls premises on which ENDS products are consumed by any person under twenty-one (21) years of age, and who knows of ENDS products by persons under twenty-one (21) years of age on such premises, and who reasonably could have prohibited or prevented such ENDS usage and consumption.
- (c) Any person who violates this Section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor as set forth in § 70119, Chapter 70 of this Title, and punished, notwithstanding § 80.50(c) of Article 3, Chapter 80, Title 9, Guam Code Annotated, as follows:
  - (1) the first violation shall be punishable by a fine of not more than Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00) or by imprisonment for not more than one (1) year; and
  - (2) subsequent violations shall be punishable by a fine of Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00) or by imprisonment for not more than one (1) year, or both.
- (d) GBHWC, in partnership with the Department of Revenue and Taxation, shall promulgate administrative rules and regulations to comply with the mandates of this Section, within ninety (90) days of enactment. Said rules and regulations shall be implemented twelve (12) months after *I Liheslaturan Guåhan's* approval.
- § 10405. Display of Prohibition on Sales of ENDS Products to Persons Under Twenty-one (21) Years of Age:

1	All licensees shall post notice that this Chapter prohibits the sale of
2	ENDS products to persons under twenty-one (21) years of age.
3	(a) In the case of a retail operation, notices shall be publicly
4	and conspicuously displayed in the licensee's place of business in
5	letters at least two inches (2") in height.
6	(b) Any licensee who violates this Section shall be fined Five
7	Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) per violation.
8	§ 10406. Licensee Responsible for Employee Actions.
9	Acts or omissions of an agent or employee of a licensee that violate any
10	provisions of this Chapter shall be deemed to be acts or omissions of the
11	licensee.
12	§ 10407. Persons Under Twenty-one (21) Years of Age Prohibited
13	from Possession, Use and Purchase of ENDS Products.
14	It shall be a violation of this Chapter for any person under twenty-one
15	(21) years of age to use or be in possession of ENDS products or to attempt
16	to purchase ENDS products using false identification.

Report. 7 § 10501. **Enforcement.** 8 The Director shall enforce this Chapter in cooperation with the Guam 9 Behavioral Health and Wellness Center. Any person may register a complaint 10 pursuant to this Chapter with the Director. The Director shall notify any establishment or individual of a complaint made pursuant to this Chapter and 11 12 shall keep a record of that notification. 13 The Director shall conduct random, unannounced 14 inspections at retail sites and may enlist the assistance of persons who 15 are between twelve (12) and seventeen (17) years of age, upon written consent of their parents or legal guardians. Participation in these 16 enforcement activities by a minor shall not constitute a violation of § 17 10405 of this Chapter, and the minor is immune from prosecution and 18 19 penalties, or under any other provision of law prohibiting the purchase 20 of ENDS and its products by minors. 21 The Director shall enact and publish guidelines for the use (b) 22 of minors in inspections conducted pursuant to this Section, which shall 23 include, but not be limited to, all of the following: 24 (1) the Director may, upon written consent of their 25 parents or legal guardians, enlist the services of minors who are

inspections to determine if sales of ENDS and its products are

#### 1 being made to minors; a photograph or video recording of the minor shall 2 (2) 3 be taken prior to each inspection or shift of inspections and 4 retained by the Director for the purpose of verifying appearances; 5 the Director may use video recording equipment (3) 6 when conducting the inspections to record and document illegal sales or attempted sales; 7 8 **(4)** the minor, if questioned by the licensee or his agents 9 about his or her age, shall state his actual age and shall present a 10 true and correct identification if verbally asked to present it. The 11 minor's failure to provide true and correct identification, if 12 requested, shall be a defense to any action pursuant to this 13 Chapter; the minor shall be supervised by a regularly 14 (5) 15 employed peace officer or an adult duly authorized by the 16 Director during the inspection; following the sale or attempted sale, the peace 17 (6) officer or adult supervising the minor shall reenter the retail 18 19 establishment and inform the seller of the random inspection and 20 identify the minor to the seller; and 21 failure to comply with the procedures set forth in this Section shall be a defense to any action brought pursuant to 22 23 this Chapter. § 10502. 24 Notice. 25 Prior to the revocation or suspension of a license issued under this Chapter, the Director shall provide a notice to the defendant, via certified mail, 26

return receipt requested. The notice shall contain the following information:

1 the name and title of the person issuing the notice; (a) (b) the date on which the fine, suspension or revocation will 2 3 become effective: 4 (c) the reason for the fine, revocation or suspension; 5 (d) that the licensee may request a hearing regarding the fine, revocation or suspension; 6 7 that the person must request a hearing in person or in 8 writing via certified mail, return receipt requested, and received by the 9 Director within ten (10) days after receipt of the notice; and that failure to appear in person or through mail received 10 (f) by the Director within ten (10) days after receipt of the notice, or by the 11 12 notice's return by the U.S. Postal Service, shall be a waiver of the right 13 to a hearing and the fine, revocation or suspension will become 14 effective on the date specified in the notice. 15 § 10503. Hearing. Except as otherwise specifically provided for herein, the Director shall 16 conduct any proceedings required by this Chapter in accordance with the 17 Administrative Adjudication Law, and shall have all of the powers granted in 18 19 said law. 20 Upon receipt of the request for a hearing as provided in § (a) 21 10501, supra, a hearing shall be held before a Hearing Officer appointed by the Director in accordance with the Administrative Adjudication 22 23 Law. The hearing shall be conducted within forty-eight (48) hours of receipt of the request, not including holidays, Saturdays, and Sundays. 24 25 The hearing may be set for a later date if the applicant or licensee so 26 requests.

(b)

At the hearing the applicant, defendant or licensee may

contest the denial, fine, revocation or suspension.

- (c) If the Hearing Officer finds that the applicant is not eligible for a license, the Hearing Officer shall declare the license application denied. If the Hearing Officer finds that the fine, suspension or revocation is in accordance with this Chapter, the fine, suspension or revocation shall take effect immediately. The action of the Hearing Officer is final.
- (d) If the applicant or licensee does not appear at the scheduled hearing in person, or through a representative as allowed by the Hearing Officer, the Hearing Officer shall affirm the denial, fine, revocation or suspension of the licensee or applicant.

## § 10504. Publication and Distribution of Laws and Rules.

The Director shall compile and provide a copy of the laws and rules concerning retail ENDS product sales to every new licensee at no charge.

# § 10505. Use of Collected Fees and Penalties.

All fines and fees assessed and collected under this Chapter shall be distributed and deposited within fifteen (15) days of the following month in which the fines and fees were collected, in the following manner by the Director of the Department of Revenue and Taxation:

- (a) twenty percent (20%) to the Better Public Service Fund for the Department of Revenue and Taxation to assist with compliance and enforcement of tobacco and ENDS laws, rules, and regulations pursuant to this Chapter;
- (b) thirty percent (30%) to the Health and Human Services Fund for the Department of Public Health and Social Services, Division of Public Health, Bureau of Non-Communicable Diseases for the purpose of providing tobacco and ENDS prevention and education

  - (c) An excise tax is imposed on the purchase of ENDS products and must be visible as a line item at the point of sale on the receipt.
  - (d) Taxes levied shall be paid by the twentieth (20<sup>th</sup>) day of the following month.

#### § 10602. Tax Proceeds.

All monies collected from the taxes levied in this Chapter are hereby appropriated and shall be disbursed to the following:

All monies in the Fund shall be deemed appropriated, shall not lapse, and shall not be subject to appropriation constraints in order to be expended.

## § 11104. Allocations and Use of Funds; Authorized.

All monies deposited in the Fund shall be available to be expended and shall be used solely in support of the functions of and to pay the expenses of the Department of Revenue and Taxation. The Fund may also be used for, but is not limited to, the following expenses which shall be directly and solely applicable to the functions and operations of the Department of Revenue and Taxation:

## § 98102. Guam Memorial Hospital Authority Revolving Fund.

- (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, there is hereby created, separate and apart from other funds and accounts of the government of Guam, a fund known as the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority (GMHA) Revolving Fund (Fund). The Fund shall not be commingled with the General Fund or any other fund or account of the government of Guam, and shall be kept in a separate bank account, as provided pursuant to this Chapter, to be used by the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority for the purposes authorized. The Fund, to include any monies in the Fund dedicated and dispersed for purposes specified in this Act, shall be deemed appropriated and shall not be subject to the transfer authority of *I Maga'hågan Guåhan*.
- (b) The Fund shall be financed by sixty percent (60%) of the excise tax collected from the Electronic Nicotine Delivery Systems (ENDS) Excise Tax Act of 2024 in Chapter 10, Title 11 GCA.

## § 98103. Deposits / Continuing Appropriation.

All monies collected for products and services rendered by the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority shall be accounted for and deposited into the Fund and shall be available to pay for the expenses of the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority. All monies in the Fund shall be deemed appropriated, shall not lapse, and shall not be subject to appropriation constraints in order to be expended.
