AN ACT TO ADD A NEW §5425.2 TO PART A OF ARTICLE 9, CHAPTER 5 OF TITLE 5, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO PROVIDING TEMPORARY EXPEDITED PROCUREMENT PROTEST PROCEDURES FOR ACQUISITIONS FUNDED WITH AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT, EDUCATION STABILIZATION FUND, OR HEAD START GRANT MONEYS ALLOTTED TO THE GUAM DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that the Guam Department of Education (GDOE) School Facilities Master Plan, published in May 2022, is a ten-year master plan that highlights and prioritizes the work that is needed to ensure safe and healthy educational environments for all public-school students. The GDOE Facilities Master Plan (FMP), which guides investments in our schools, identified needed construction and modernization work and estimated the deferred maintenance throughout our public school system. Furthermore, decades-long deferred maintenance has resulted in deterioration of aging facilities and an urgent need to repair existing or construct new facilities to ensure safe and healthy learning environments.

*I Liheslatura* further finds that GDOE has been provided a once in a lifetime opportunity to utilize a portion of the federal funds through the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) for capital improvement projects. Additionally, provided that there are no extensions, the timelines to obligate ARPA funds ends December 2024, along with the opportunity to accomplish deferred but urgent capital improvement projects. In addition to ARPA funds, other federal funds will expire within 2023 with little to no prospect of carryover, which include GDOE Education Stabilization Fund and the Head Start Grant.

I Liheslatura finds that although protests are an essential part of the procurement process, Guam's current protest process can often lead to lengthy delays in procurement and can potentially lead to the inability of GDOE to expend funds within required deadlines or can lead to their inability to secure the best possible procurement costs to the people of Guam to undergo urgently needed facilities improvements.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan intends to provide a temporary expedited procurement protest procedure for capital improvement projects funded with American Rescue Plan Act, Education Stabilization Fund, or Head Start Grant allotted to the Guam Department of Education and enable GDOE to complete much needed improvement projects for the well-being of our school children and faculty.

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**Section 2.** A new §5425.2 is *added* to Part A, Article 9, Chapter 5, Title 5, Guam Code Annotated to hereby read as follows:

"§5425.2. Protest Procedure for Procurement Funded with American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, Education Stabilization Fund, or Head Start Grant Allotted to the Guam Department of Education.

Notwithstanding any other provision of law, if a selected or non-(a) selected vendor, contractor, or service provider is aggrieved by an award or a contract for capital improvement projects funded, in whole or in part, by the funds allotted to the Guam Department of Education from the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) of 2021, Education Stabilization Fund, or Head Start Grant, the procedure for initiating a protest outlined in this Section shall apply, and shall be the exclusive means available to resolve the concerns of persons aggrieved in connection with awards or solicitations funded in whole or in part with moneys allotted to GDOE from ARPA, the Education Stabilization Fund, or the Head Start Grant. The protest shall be submitted to the Public Auditor who shall expedite the administrative review process of the appeal in accordance with rules and regulations to be adopted and promulgated by the Public Auditor within sixty (60) calendar days of the effective date of this Act and approved by I Liheslaturan Guahan. The expedited procedures shall be prominently designated as such in the notice and the solicitation. All prospective bidders, offerors, and contractors shall acknowledge and sign an affidavit stating they are aware of the expedited process and agree to abide by the rules and deadlines outlined in the expedited process.

- (b) If the protest is not resolved by mutual agreement within twenty (20) days of the filing of the protest with the Public Auditor, the Public Auditor shall issue a decision, in writing, no later than twenty (20) days, Saturdays, Sundays and Government of Guam holidays excepted, of receipt of the protest. The decision shall state the Public Auditor's reasons for its decision. A copy of the written decision shall be served by certified mail, or otherwise personally served to the parties named in the protest, including but not limited to: the vendor, contractor, or service provider who initiated the protest, the person awarded the contract, and to all other non-selected bidders or offerors.
- (c) For purposes of this Section, the Public Auditor's decision and determination of facts resolving protests of procurement contracts funded in whole or in part by ARPA, Education Stabilization Fund, or Head Start Grants *shall* be final and conclusive with no right of appeal or judicial review. The fact that a protest has been filed pursuant to this Section shall not stay the procurement process or award of any contract funded in whole or in part by ARPA, Education Stabilization Fund, or Head Start Grants unless so ordered by the Public Auditor. In addition, a request for reconsideration shall not stay the award of any contract funded in whole or in part by ARPA, Education Stabilization Fund, or Head Start Grants, *unless* so ordered by the Public Auditor.

This Section is repealed effective December 31, 2024, unless the federal grantor agency authorizes an extension of time for the expenditure of ARPA funds, in which case this Section shall be repealed at the end of the extension period."

**Section 3. Effective Date.** This act shall be effective upon enactment.

**Section 4. Severability.** If any provision of this Act or its application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or inorganic, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Act that can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are severable.
