RELATIVE TO URGENTLY AND STEADFASTLY REQUESTING THE GOVERNOR TO OF GUAM ACKNOWLEDGE THE DIRE AND DECREPIT CONDITIONS AT THAT EXIST THE **GUAM** MEMORIAL HOSPITAL AND TO DECLARE A STATE OF EXTREME EMERGENCY TO ADDRESS THE UNSAFE, UNHEALTHY. UNSANITARY. AND FINANCIALLY CHALLENGING CONDITIONS THAT EXIST THERE.

BE IT RESOLVED BY I MINA'TRENTAL SIETTE NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, the Guam Memorial Hospital (GMH) is a critical and vital public resource which must be a priority and receive ongoing adequate funding and attention. At no point should GMH lack critical medication and supplies because funding or support is not provided by the Administration. GMH is the last line of life-saving defense for tens of thousands of Guamanians; and

8 WHEREAS, GMH has been operating unaccredited since 2018, 9 compromising the delivery of quality, compassionate life-saving medical care for the island's sick and dying, and threatening the hospital's ability to meet the
minimum health and safety standards by the Social Security Act that is required of
providers and suppliers participating in the Medicare and Medicaid programs; and

WHEREAS, meeting the basic standards set by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services required for certification should be the utmost priority for Guam's leaders as more than One Billion Dollars (\$1,000,000,000) have been received through CARES Act, American Rescue Plan, and other federal financial resources that should have used for GMH facility rehabilitation and operations since 2020; and

WHEREAS, through testimony into the public record provided in person and in writing to *I Liheslatura*, it has been revealed that GMH lacks the leadership and resources to procure and provide a steady supply of basic sanitation supplies for medical personnel to deliver dignified care for their patients; and

14 WHEREAS, on September 28, 2023, and in testimony provided by a 15 certified critical care nurse working at GMH at an oversight hearing on the hospital, the nurse stated, "We regularly lack essential materials like linens and pillows, 16 diabetic tube feeding formula, underpads for patients to poo and pee on, inner 17 tracheostomy cannulas, wipes to clean patients, pre-filled epinephrine syringes for 18 medical emergencies, and so many other things to add to this list." The nurse went 19 on to state, "We didn't have wipes for months. As an alternative, we were told to use 20 paper towels to clean and bathe our patients. To our embarrassment, patients' 21 families witnessed this and have donated wipes because of the pitiful situation the 22 hospital is in. It is sad and embarrassing and it is disgraceful that you have allowed 23 this to be the standard of care for our people"; and 24

WHEREAS, in further testimony provided by GMH's Acting Chief Clinical Informatics Officer in the oversight hearing, it was stated, "one of the most alarming consequences of the hospital's financial struggles is the growing number of unpaid

vendors. As the hospital fails to meet its financial obligations, vendors supplying 1 vital medical equipment, pharmaceuticals, and other essential supplies are left 2 unpaid. This not only jeopardizes the hospital's ability to operate efficiently but also 3 puts patient care at risk. Urgent action is needed to address this issue and ensure the 4 hospital can continue to procure necessary supplies."; and 5

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WHEREAS, the deplorable conditions of GMH have deteriorated below acceptable local, national, and international safety standards for both the patients 7 8 seeking medical attention and the employees who provide life-saving treatment as attested to by practicing health care professionals; and 9

10 WHEREAS, during the September 28, 2023 oversight hearing, GMH's Chief 11 Financial Officer Yukari Hechanova and Acting Associate Administrator of Medical Services, Dr. Dustin Prins, stated for the record that GMH is currently under credit 12 13 watch and credit hold with at least Sixty (60) vendors and is still not receiving critical 14 medication needed for patients; and

WHEREAS, the 36th Guam Legislature passed, and Governor Lou Leon 15 16 Guerrero signed into law, legislation to fund and build a brand new hospital that was deemed urgent for Guam. However, the Governor believes that a greater priority 17 should be placed in the construction of a medical complex that would include spaces 18 for public and behavioral health services. While it is clearly understood that a multi-19 functioning facility is years away from becoming a reality, the need for a proper and 20 adequately functioning hospital is now. So, for the immediate and medium term, the 21 current GMH facility must be sufficiently funded and made an extreme priority by 22 the elected leaders of our island. The people of Guam cannot wait for a medical 23 complex. Addressing the issues and concerns of GMH needs to take precedence and 24 action must be taken now; and 25

WHEREAS, I Liheslatura finds that through numerous testimonies, official 26 27 reports, photographs, and constituent complaints, it is clear that the compromised

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operations, dilapidated facilities, and substandard level of care of the Guam Memorial Hospital necessitates the need for immediate and decisive action to prevent the further deterioration and decomposition of our island's only public hospital; and

5 WHEREAS, *1 Liheslatura* further finds that without a declaration of a state 6 of emergency with immediate action and diligence from the GMH leadership and 7 the Governor of Guam to correct the dysfunctional state of the Guam Memorial 8 Hospital, it will necessitate the call for federal receivership to ensure that proper 9 management, guidance, and support for GMH to begin the process needed to restore 10 the hospital's ability to provide a deserving and acceptable level of health care for 11 the people of Guam.

12 NOW THEREFORE BE IT:

13 **RESOLVED**, that *I Mina'trentai Siette Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* urgently 14 and steadfastly requests *I Maga'Hågan Guåhan* to declare an immediate state of 15 emergency to address the rapidly deteriorating conditions at the Guam Memorial 16 Hospital and to direct funding and resources to assist our hospital with its financial 17 challenges, supply deficiencies, and structural rehabilitation and repairs; and be it 18 further

RESOLVED, that the Speaker certify, and the Legislative Secretary attest
to, the adoption hereof, and that copies of the same be transmitted to the Honorable
Lourdes A. Leon Guerrero, *I Maga 'Hågan Guåhan*, to the Honorable Joshua F.
Tenorio, *I Segundo Na Maga 'Lahen Guåhan*, and to the board members of the Guam
Memorial Hospital Authority.

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
