Relative to supporting the passage of H.R. 522, the "Deliver for Veterans Act," introduced in the United States House of Representatives, which aims to cover the shipping and delivery expenses of adaptive vehicles provided for veterans with disabilities.

1 BE IT RESOLVED BY I MINA'TRENTAI SIETTE NA LIHESLATURAN

2 **GUÅHAN**:

- WHEREAS, in response to the need of some disabled veterans for a vehicle
- 4 specifically designed for their operation, the federal government has enacted into law
- 5 legislation for adaptive automobiles to be provided to eligible disabled veterans to allow
- 6 them to maintain their independence; and

WHEREAS, as it currently stands, 38 U.S. Code § 3902, the statute that provides adaptive automobiles and equipment to eligible disabled veterans, only provides for the price of the vehicle and equipment itself, not the other encumbrances associated with the items; and WHEREAS, if a veteran with disabilities living on Guam qualifies for an adaptive vehicle or equipment, the individual would be required to pay for the shipping and delivery costs because these costs are not included in the statute; and WHEREAS, the expenses to deliver adaptive vehicles currently amounts to several thousands of dollars, money that can severely impact the financial abilities of eligible veterans and prevent them from receiving their adaptive automobile; and WHEREAS, seeing the overlooked shortcoming of this statute in the U.S. Code, the Honorable James Moylan, Guam Delegate to the U.S. Congress, introduced H.R. 522, the "Deliver for Veterans Act," in the United States House of Representatives on January 25, 2023; and WHEREAS, the continued efforts of Guam Delegate James Moylan are necessary and vital in order to achieve this needed amendment to the statute in the U.S. Code, and help the disabled veterans of Guam to receive adapted vehicles without risking financial ruin from the exorbitant shipping and delivery costs of these vehicles; now therefore, be it **RESOLVED**, that *I Mina'trentai Siette Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* (the 37th Guam Legislature) does hereby, on behalf of the people of Guam, express its support for the passage of H.R. 522, introduced in the United States House of Representatives, which seeks to authorize the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs to cover the shipping and delivery expenses of adapted vehicles for eligible disabled veterans; and be it further **RESOLVED**, that the Speaker certify, and the Legislative Secretary attest to, the

adoption hereof, and that copies of the same be thereafter transmitted to the Honorable
