RELATIVE TO SUPPORTING THE REPUBLIC OF CHINA (TAIWAN)'S PARTICIPATION AS OBSERVER AT THE WORLD HEALTH ORGANIZATION'S 76TH WORLD HEALTH ASSEMBLY AND TO REAFFIRM SUPPORT FOR THE REPUBLIC OF CHINA (TAIWAN)'S PARTICIPATION AS OBSERVER IN INTERNATIONAL ORGANIZATIONS.

BE IT RESOLVED BY I MINA'TRENTAL SIETTE NA LIHESLATURAN

2 GUÅHAN:

- WHEREAS, One Hundred and Eleven years ago on October 10, 1911, the
- 4 Republic of China (Taiwan) was founded. The United States of America and the
- 5 Republic of China (Taiwan) have been friends and allies for many years. Throughout
- 6 this time the ties of friendship and the commercial interests of the United States of
- 7 America and the Republic of China (Taiwan) have developed into a strong partnership;
- 8 and

WHEREAS, the freedom and democracy enjoyed by the people of the Republic of China (Taiwan) are clearly demonstrated in the progress and growth of the economy of this great country. In furthering its commitment to freedom and democracy, Taiwan continues to seek representation and meaningful participation in international organizations; and

WHEREAS, in line with the Taiwan Relations Act of 1979, Asia Reassurance Initiative Act of 2018, Taiwan Travel Act of 2018, and the Taiwan Allies International Protection and Enhancement Initiative (TAIPEI) Act of 2019 Guam intends to continue to maintain relationships with one of our closest democratic countries in the Pacific; and

WHEREAS, since April 2008, *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* adopted Legislative Resolutions commending the efforts of the Republic of China (Taiwan) to promote World Health and had endorsed Taiwan's observer status in the World Health Assembly. The people of Guam maintained a special Sister-City relationship with the people of Taipei City since 1973, and believe that good health is important to every citizen of the world and believe that access to the highest standard of health information and services is necessary to improve the public health; and

WHEREAS, the preamble of the World Health Organization (WHO) Constitution states that "the enjoyment of the highest attainable standard of health is one of the fundamental rights of every human being without distinction of race, religion, political belief, economic or social condition." Taiwan's twenty-three million five hundred thousand (23,500,000) people wish to attend the WHA as an observer; and have a population that is greater than three-fourths of member states already admitted into the WHO. Because health and disease have no borders, it is in the best interest of the human condition that Taiwan be afforded observership in the WHO in order to benefit from information regarding the prevention, monitoring and cure of epidemic

diseases, prevention of terrorist bio-chemical attacks, and discussions of global health

2 policies; and

WHEREAS, Taiwan's achievement in the field of health is substantial, including one of the highest life expectancy levels in Asia; maternal and infant mortality rates comparable to those of western countries; the eradication of such infectious diseases as cholera, smallpox, and the plague; and being the first nation to eradicate polio and provide children with Hepatitis B vaccinations; and

WHEREAS, Direct and unobstructed participation in international health cooperation forums and programs is beneficial for all parts of the world, especially with today's greater potential for cross-border spread of various infectious diseases such as human immunodeficiency virus (HIV), tuberculosis, malaria, and COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, the World Health Assembly has allowed observers to participate in activities of the organization, including the Palestine Liberation Organization in 1974, the Order of Malta, and the Holy See in the early 1950s. The United States, in the 1994 Taiwan Policy Review, declared its intention to support Taiwan's participation in appropriate international organizations. U.S. Public Law 106-137 required the Secretary of State to submit a report to the congress on efforts by the executive branch to support Taiwan's participation in international organizations, in particular the WHO; and

WHEREAS, During the G7 Foreign and Development Minister's Meeting in May 2021, the G7 countries comprising of Canada, France, Germany, Italy, Japan, the United Kingdom, and the United States, supported the inclusion of Taiwan at the World Health Assembly through a joint communique; and

WHEREAS, the Republic of China (Taiwan) continues to demonstrate incredible assistance to Guam's health system. On March 30, 2022, the JAG TeleCare remote health monitoring platform was donated to the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority to strengthen Guam's telehealth services and expand our network of healthcare coverage for the people of Guam; and

WHEREAS, additionally, knowing that the stray animal population in Guam continues to be a serious situation to our community, a team from the Department of Veterinary Medicine of Taiwan's National Chung Hsing University volunteered their time in August 2022 to a spay and neuter program. The program committed to spay or neuter four hundred (400) animals. The team also lent their expertise, giving lectures at the University of Guam pertaining to responsible pet care and ownership; and

WHEREAS, during the pandemic, 200,000 masks, 900 Pandemic Readiness Kits, and four full-body temperature scanners were secured with the assistance of the Taipei Economic and Cultural Office in Guam (TECO). Furthermore, in January of 2021, with the help of TECO in Guam and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, flights were chartered with China Airlines as a joint humanitarian and medical mission for about 50 passengers each flight. This endeavor was especially beneficial to Guam residents seeking medical treatment off island but have been unable to do so because of the COVID-19 health crisis and canceled direct flights; and

WHEREAS, prior to the pandemic, patients in Guam received life-changing specialized care from hospitals in Taiwan. The China Medical University Hospital in Taichung and Yuan's General Hospital in Kaohsiung are just a few of several hospitals that care for Guam patients. Additionally, the Guam Memorial Hospital maintains a referral hospital relationship with Taiwan Adventist Hospital in Taipei with a memorandum of understanding signed in January 2020. Taiwan Adventist Hospital continues to be supportive of the Guam Memorial Hospital donating personal protective equipment, including face masks and face shields to the GMH in April 2021. Moreover, Taiwan sends physicians to teach the physicians in Guam and to offer support to our medical community; and

WHEREAS, During the House Foreign Affairs Committee Hearing on the Biden Administration Foreign Policy Priorities in March 2021, Secretary of State Antony Blinken testified his commitment to work on including Taiwan at international

1 conferences due to their immense contributions and invaluable technical expertise

during the COVID-19 pandemic. Moreover, President Biden restated the United States

support of Taiwan in the interim National Security Strategic Guidance issued by the

White House on March 2021; and

WHEREAS, Guam further intends to reaffirm and deepen our Sister City relationship with Taipei, Taoyuan, and Taichung by supporting efforts to grant Taiwan participation at international organizations including the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO), United Nation Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC), and International Criminal Police Organization (INTERPOL). Taiwan's participation will promote; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that *I Mina'trentai Siette Na Liheslaturan Guåhan*, on behalf of the people of Guam, does hereby express its full support for the government and the people of Taiwan, that they deserve the same level of public health as citizens of every nation on earth, and that we support them in their efforts to achieve its objective to become an observer of the World Health Assembly to be held WHO; and be it further

RESOLVED, that *I Mina'trentai Siette Na Liheslaturan Guåhan*, on behalf of the people of Guam, does hereby support granting Taiwan observer status at intergovernmental organizations including the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO), United Nation Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC), and International Criminal Police Organization (INTERPOL), which will facilitate greater collaboration and foster peace and security of our global community; and

RESOLVED, that the Speaker certify, and the Legislative Secretary attest to, the adoption hereof, and that copies of the same be thereafter transmitted to the Honorable Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus, Director General, World Health Organization; to the Honorable Joseph R. Biden President of the United States of America; to the Honorable Anthony Blinken, Secretary of State, United States of America; to the Honorable Xavier

- 2 Excellency Tsai Ing-wen, President, Republic of China (Taiwan); to His Excellency
