AN ACT TO REPEAL ARTICLE 14 AND ADD A NEW SUBARTICLE G TO ARTICLE 2 OF CHAPTER 5, TITLE 5, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, **RELATIVE** TO REVITALIZING THE **GUAM** PROCUREMENT ADVISORY **COUNCIL** TO **MODERNIZE** PROCUREMENT IN ORDER TO PROMOTE PUBLIC **CONFIDENCE AND ACHIEVE** BEST VALUE IN SERVICE TO OUR COMMUNITY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

1 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds 2 that procurement is an essential function of government operations in order to 3 provide needed services to the community on a timely manner, to facilitate the 4 implementation of federal programs and maximize the use of federal funds, to 5 provide opportunities to the private sector in a fair manner, and to promote public 6 confidence in proper and transparent use of public funds.

I Liheslatura further finds that the Guam Procurement Advisory Council, which serves an essential role to evaluate and to make recommendations for improvement of procurement on a continuous basis, is in need of focusing its membership and updating initiatives to encourage and support the development and implementation of or to institutionalize best practices, including supporting ecological procurement choices, throughout our government.

I Liheslatura finds that it is recommended, for purposes of maintaining the structure of the Procurement Act consistent with the structure of the Model Procurement Code, that Article 14 of Chapter 5, 5 GCA be repealed and included as a new Subarticle G of Article 2, Chapter 5, 5 GCA, rather than an additional Article in the Chapter.

18 Therefore, *Liheslaturan Guåhan* intends to revitalize the Guam Procurement 19 Advisory Council to modernize and institutionalize best practices in procurement 20 throughout the government of Guam in order to promote public confidence and 21 achieve best value in service to our community.

Section 2. Article 14 of Chapter 5, Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, is hereby *repealed*.

Section 3. Article 2 of Chapter 5, Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, is hereby *amended* to read:

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1 (d) to propose recommendations for the improvement, 2 streamlining, and modernization and the use of "best value" and 3 "performance based" methods as the basis for evaluation of 4 government procurement activities;

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(e) to make recommendations and identify methods to address new industries and technologies and financial systems, while maintaining the general principles of procurement law;

(f) to review and provide advice on any aspect of law, regulation or policy that affect procurement, including laws and processes not directly found in the Guam Procurement Act;

11 (g) to review the statutes and process for procurement appeals
12 and recommend improvements;

(h) to make recommendations for best practices and standard
operating procedures for planned procurement, writing specifications,
market research, solicitation, drafting and managing contracts,
maintenance of procurement records, and other aspects of the
procurement process;

(i) to make recommendations for training and/or certification
of procurement professionals, including, but not limited to, developing
and updating curriculum, developing online training of the trainer
programs, and establishing a Guam Procurement Institute for the
training and education of public and private sector participants in
government contracting;

(j) to make recommendations for implementing green
procurement within the government of Guam under the advisement of
the Guam Energy Office, the Guam Power Authority, the Guam

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- 1 Environmental Protection Agency, the University of Guam Center for Island Sustainability, and/or other government of Guam entities; and 2 3 to make recommendations for policies and procedures (k) 4 pertaining to procurement that utilize federal funds. 5 § 5903. Limitations. 6 The Council shall not have any executive participation in the day-to-7 day implementation of the Guam Procurement Act. It shall not have any executive, legislative, or adjudicative review authority over procurement 8 9 matters. 10 **§ 5904. Reports.** 11 The Council shall provide annual reports to the Speaker of I12 Liheslaturan Guåhan and I Maga'hågan/Maga'låhen Guåhan. 13 § 5905. Administration. 14 The Council shall have the authority to retain professional and (a) 15 support staff to assist it with its duties, and shall designate an Administrative Director. However, the Director of Administration shall provide and 16 coordinate administrative support services to the Council from the 17 18 Department of Administration. 19 The Office of I Maga'hågan/Maga'låhen Guåhan (the Governor (b)20 of Guam), the Office of the Attorney General of Guam, the Office of Public 21 Accountability, and other executive branch agencies may provide, loan or 22 transfer resources to the Council to support its operations. 23 Guam Procurement Advisory Council Support Fund. **§ 5906.** 24 There is hereby established a Guam Procurement Advisory Council 25 Support Fund (Fund) to be maintained by the Director of Administration. I
- 26 *Maga'hågan/Maga'låhen Guåhan* and the Director of Administration are 27 authorized to transfer amounts into the Fund to support the operations of the

Council. Any legislative appropriations to support the operations of the
 Council shall be deposited into the Guam Procurement Advisory Council
 Support Fund. The Chief Procurement Officer is authorized to transfer funds
 from the Special Surplus Property Fund to support the operations of the Guam
 Procurement Advisory Council."

6 Section 4. Severability. If any provision of this Act or its application to any 7 person or circumstance is found to be invalid or inorganic, such invalidity shall not 8 affect other provisions or applications of this Act that can be given effect without 9 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are 10 severable.
