**AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE REVENUES IN EXCESS OF THE ADOPTED REVENUES IN PUBLIC LAW 37-42, AS AMENDED (THE “GENERAL APPROPRIATIONS ACT OF 2024”), AS ENUMERATED IN THE CONSOLIDATED REVENUE EXPENDITURE REPORT OF AUGUST 2024; AND TO APPROPRIATE FIFTEEN MILLION EIGHT HUNDRED TWENTY-EIGHT THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$15,828,000) TO THE GPA *PRUGRÅMAN AYUDA PARA I TAOTAO-TA* ENERGY CREDIT PROGRAM FROM THE FUNDS COLLECTED IN EXCESS OF THE ADOPTED REVENUE LEVELS ENUMERATED IN PUBLIC LAW 37-125.**

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

1           **Section 1. Appropriation of Fiscal Year 2024 Excess Revenues.**

2 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the sum of Fifty Million Eight Hundred  
3 Thirty-four Thousand Four Hundred Seventy-four Dollars (**\$50,834,474**) from the  
4 revenues collected in excess of the adopted revenues in Public Law 37-42, as  
5 amended (the “General Appropriations Act of 2024”) is hereby appropriated as  
6 follows:

7           (a) The sum of One Million Five Hundred Fourteen Thousand Six  
8 Hundred Dollars (**\$1,514,600**) to the Department of Administration to pay an  
9 additional Two Hundred Dollars (\$200) per retiree who qualifies for the Cost  
10 of Living Allowance (COLA) payment.

11           (b) The sum of Ten Million Dollars (**\$10,000,000**) to the Guam  
12 Department of Education (GDOE) for the operations, maintenance, and repair  
13 of GDOE schools.

14           (c) The sum of Three Hundred Sixty-one Thousand Seven Hundred  
15 Seventy Dollars (**\$361,770**) to the Guam Police Department to add additional  
16 support for their Fiscal Year 2025 cycle of twenty (20) police officer trainees.

17           (d) The sum of Seven Hundred Ninety-four Thousand Sixty-one  
18 Dollars (**\$794,061**) to the Guam Fire Department for additional support for  
19 their Fiscal Year 2025 cycle of twenty (20) firefighter recruits.

20           (e) The sum of Two Hundred Seventy Thousand Six Hundred  
21 Dollars (**\$270,600**) to the Department of Corrections to add additional support  
22 for their Fiscal Year 2025 cycle of twenty (20) corrections officer recruits.

23           (f) The sum of Two Million Eight Hundred Eight Thousand Dollars  
24 (**\$2,808,000**) to the Guam Academy Charter Schools Council to fund the per  
25 pupil cost of Seven Thousand Eight Hundred Dollars (\$7,800) for the student  
26 cap increase of an additional fifteen (15) students to Guåhan Academy Charter  
27 School, an additional one hundred thirty-five (135) students to Science Is Fun

1 and Awesome (SIFA) Academy Charter School, an additional sixty (60)  
2 students to Career Tech High Academy Charter School, and an additional one  
3 hundred fifty (150) students to Mount Carmel Academy Charter School.

4 (g) The sum of Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (**\$500,000**) to the  
5 Guam Fisherman's Co-op for the support of their temporary facility and  
6 operations.

7 (h) The sum of Two Hundred Five Thousand Dollars (**\$205,000**) to  
8 the Guam Department of Education (GDOE) for the Parent Teacher  
9 Organization (PTO) of each school. The amount of Five Thousand Dollars  
10 (\$5,000) is allocated from said appropriation, *supra*, to each school and shall  
11 be used in a manner determined by the PTO for support of the school and  
12 school programs.

13 (i) The sum of One Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars  
14 (**\$1,500,000**) to the Guam Police Department (GPD) for School Resource  
15 Officers pursuant to their authority under § 77119(b) of Chapter 77, 10 GCA.

16 (j) The sum of Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (**\$25,000**) to the  
17 Guam Department of Education (GDOE) for the purchase of Opioid  
18 Antagonists.

19 (k) The sum of One Hundred Thousand Dollars (**\$100,000**) to the  
20 Guam Customs and Quarantine Agency for the May 2025 Annual Oceania  
21 Customs Organization Conference.

22 (l) The sum of Two Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars  
23 (**\$2,500,000**) to the Guam Cancer Trust Fund.

24 (m) The sum of One Million Dollars (**\$1,000,000**) to the Guam  
25 Housing Corporation Housing Trust Fund for the Program authorized under §  
26 41003 of the Housing Trust Fund Act, which may include rental and utility  
27 assistance.

1 (n) The sum of Forty-five Thousand Dollars (**\$45,000**) to the Guam  
2 Community College to fund scholarships for the Western Interstate  
3 Commission for Higher Education (WICHE) Professional Student Exchange  
4 Program (PSEP) for qualified residents for Fiscal Year 2024 and Fiscal Year  
5 2025.

6 (o) The sum of Four Million Seven Hundred Ten Thousand Four  
7 Hundred Forty-three Dollars (**\$4,710,443**) to the Department of  
8 Administration for the sole purpose of paying credit card fees for individual  
9 payors in Fiscal Year 2025.

10 (p) The sum of Twenty Million Dollars (**\$20,000,000**) to the Guam  
11 Memorial Hospital for their operations for Fiscal Year 2025.

12 (q) The sum of Four Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars  
13 (**\$4,500,000**) to the Mayors Council of Guam for their operations for Fiscal  
14 Year 2025.

15 **Section 2. GPA *Prugrâman Ayuda Para I Taotao-ta Energy Credit***  
16 **Program.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, Fifteen Million Eight  
17 Hundred Twenty-eight Thousand Dollars (**\$15,828,000**) collected in excess of the  
18 adopted revenue levels enumerated in Public Law 37-125, as reported in the  
19 Consolidated Revenue Expenditure Report (CRER), is hereby appropriated to the  
20 Guam Power Authority for a three (3) month extension to the *Prugrâman Ayuda*  
21 *Para I Taotao-ta Energy Credit Program*.

22 **Section 3. Restrictions.** The appropriations contained in this Act shall not  
23 lapse and shall continue to be available until fully expended; and are not subject to *I*  
24 *Maga'hågan Guåhan's* transfer authority.

25 **Section 4. Effective Date.** This Act shall be effective upon enactment.

26 **Section 5. Severability.** If any provision of this Act or its application to any  
27 person or circumstance is found to be invalid or inorganic, such invalidity shall not

1 affect other provisions or applications of this Act that can be given effect without  
2 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are  
3 severable.
